FR. T'S TIDBITS: Tithing

Recently, some people have asked what it means to tithe. Simply put, tithing is giving 10 percent of your income to charitable work and the church. However, tithing is much more than that; it is an attitude about being aware of the blessings God has bestowed upon us and giving back to God what is right and just.

The practice of tithing is rooted in the Old Testament and was reinforced by the teachings

of Jesus and the examples of the early Christians. The biblical norms of tithing are a valid and laudable practice even today. This means that I will give back to God in gratitude ten percent of my income for the many ways that He has blessed my life and ministry.

Tithing, therefore calls for a definite decision regarding stewardship of the gifts and talents that we have and a commitment on our part to be good stewards of the talents which God has blessed us with. I began tithing when I started my first job many years ago and continue to do so today. The practice of tithing made me aware of God's blessing in my life but it also made me aware of how important tithing is to the work and support of the ministries of the Church and the community in which I live.

After I was ordained a priest, the parish I am assigned to is the beneficiary of my tithing. Ten percent of my income is given to St. Jane Frances de Chantal. The needs of the parish are great, One person cannot address every need in the parish but together as a community of faithful people we can put our resources together to do great things within the parish of St. Jane Frances de Chantal.

I hope this information regarding the concept of tithing was helpful to you. I would encourage everyone to pray and reflect upon the practice of tithing. In a special way I would encourage young people who are entering the workplace to consider starting the habit of tithing. It is important that you become supporter of charitable works within the Church and the community in which you live.

Pope St. John Paul II spoke to the topic of tithing when he said: "Nowhere does Jesus condemn the mere possessions of earthly goods as such. Instead, he pronounces very harsh words against those who use their possessions in a selfish way, without paying attention to the needs of others."

Part Two: Unleash the Gospel and Sunday Mass

Last week we discussed responding to God's call and meeting the needs of others in the process! Now we'll learn how God is always present with us and how He works in us to accomplish His will here on earth.

God speaks to us

We are we here because Christ, our lover, is here and he wants to speak to us. Christ promised that he would be with us till the end of time. At the celebration of the Mass, we believe that Christ is really present.

He is present in the person of the minister

He is present in his word since He Himself who speaks when the holy Scriptures are read in church

He is present when the Church prays and sings, for He promised: "Where two or three are gathered together for my sake, there am I in the midst of them" (Mt. 18:20)

He is present especially in the Eucharistic species (the bread and the wine that become his body and blood)

Christ speaks to us when the Scriptures are proclaimed. Many times it is only a word or a phrase that remains with us. ...be my witnesses. It is for us to remember that word, that phrase and reflect on the message in it. The message is meant to create a community of believers.

God transforms us

Two things happen when we come to Sunday Eucharist. We proclaim who we are...the Body of Christ and we become who we are, the Body of Christ.


Pope John Paul II wrote in Dominicae Cenae, "A very close and organic bond exists between the renewal of the liturgy, and the renewal of the whole life of the Church. The Church not only acts but also expresses herself in the liturgy, lives by the liturgy and draws from the liturgy the strength for her life."

Our very gathering for the celebration and full participation in the celebration identifies us as members of this assembly. We are the Body of Christ... his disciples who continuously proclaim his message by our lives. As the gifts are presented we place ourselves...our lives...our hopes...our sorrows... our joys into the gifts. As the bread and wine are placed on the altar we too are placed on the altar.

Together with Christ in the person of his presider, we offer our whole lives to God during the Eucharistic prayer. As the gifts are changed into the sacred species, so too, God transforms us. We receive Christ in the bread and wine. It takes time to notice the transformation that is happening. Think back to when you were 10 or 20 years younger. Are you still the same?

God sends us forth

Transformed and nourished God sends us forth to be his disciples. By our daily life, our words and actions, our attention to the needs of others, and much more, we bring Christ to those in our lives.

Before Donating:


- ♦ Get a good nights sleep
- ♦ Have a good breakfast or lunch
- Drink extra water & fluids to replace the volume you will donate
- ♦ Eat iron rich foods
- ♦ Avoid fatty foods

During Donation:

- Wear clothing with sleeves that can be raised above the elbow
- Show the staff any "good veins" that have been used successfully in the past to draw blood
- ♦ Relax
- ◆ Take the time to enjoy a snack and a drink in the refreshments area immediately after donating.

After Donation:

- Re-hydrate by drinking plenty of fluids over the next 24-48 hours
- Avoid strenuous physical activity or heavy lifting for about 5 hours after donation.

HEALTH MINISTRY

West Nile Virus Infection

According to the Michigan Disease Surveillance System, there have been four reported cases of West Nile virus so far this year and a mosquito pool has tested positive for West Nile Virus in Oakland County. As you know, West Nile virus is an infection transmitted by mosquitoes. If you become infected you may not experience any signs or symptoms, or you may experience only minor ones, or you may develop a life threatening illness that includes inflammation of the brain. Mild signs and symptoms of a West Nile virus infection generally go away on their own. J But severe signs and symptoms — such as a severe headache, disorientation or sudden weakness — require immediate attention. Exposure to mosquitoes where West Nile virus exists increases your risk of getting the virus. Protect yourself from mosquitoes by using mosquito repellent and wearing clothing that covers your skin to reduce your risk.

Mild infection signs and symptoms

According to the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, 80 percent of people who contract the disease won't experience symptoms. Mild symptoms usually resolve on their own. For 1 in 5 people infected, symptoms will include:

- Fever
- Headache
- Body aches
- Fatigue
- Skin rash (occasionally)
- Swollen lymph glands (occasionally)
- Eye pain (occasionally)

Serious infection signs and symptoms

About 1 percent of those infected, may develop more serious symptoms. Seek medical attention right away with:

- High fever
- Severe headache
- Stiff neck
- Disorientation or confusion
- Stupor or coma
- Tremors or muscle jerking
- Lack of coordination
- Convulsions
- Pain
- Partial paralysis or sudden weakness

Infection transmitted by mosquitoes

Typically, West Nile virus spreads to humans and animals via infected mosquitoes. The incubation period ranges from three to 14 days.

Prevention

- Eliminate standing water in your yard. Mosquitoes breed in pools of standing water
- Unclog roof gutters
- Empty unused swimming pools
- Change water in birdbaths at least weekly.
- Remove old tires or any unsued containers that might hold water and serve as a breeding place.
- Avoid unnecessary outdoor activity when mosquitoes are most prevalent dawn, dusk, and early evening.
- Wear long-sleeved shirts and long pants when you go into mosquito-infected areas.
- Apply mosquito repellent with DEET to your skin and clothing. The higher the percentage (concentration_ of the active ingredient, the longer the repellent will work. Avoid using DEET on the hands of young children or on infants under 2 months of age. When outside cover your infant's stroller or playpen with mosquito netting.
