


RCIA UPDATE

HEALTH MINISTRY: WEST NILE VIRUS INFECTION

According to the Michigan Disease Surveillance System, there have been four reported cases of West Nile virus so far this year and a mosquito pool has tested positive for West Nile Virus in Oakland County. As you know, West Nile virus is an infection transmitted by mosquitoes. If you become infected you may not experience any signs or symptoms, or you may experience only minor ones, or you may develop a life threatening illness that includes inflammation of the brain. Mild signs and symptoms of a West Nile virus infection generally go away on their own, but severe signs and symptoms — such as a severe headache, disorientation or sudden weakness — require immediate attention. Exposure to mosquitoes where West Nile virus exists increases your risk of getting the virus. Protect yourself from mosquitoes by using mosquito repellent and wearing clothing that covers your skin to reduce your risk.

MILD INFECTION SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS

According to the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, 80 percent of people who contract the disease won't experience symptoms. Mild symptoms usually resolve on their own. For 1 in 5 people infected, symptoms will include:

- Fever
- Headache
- Body aches
- Fatigue
- Skin rash (occasionally)
- Swollen lymph glands (occasionally)
- Eye pain (occasionally)

SERIOUS INFECTION SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS

About 1 percent of those infected, may develop more serious symptoms. Seek medical attention right away with:

- High fever
- Severe headache
- Stiff neck
- Disorientation or confusion
- Stupor or coma
- Tremors or muscle jerking
- Lack of coordination
- Convulsions
- Pain
- Partial paralysis or sudden weakness

INFECTION TRANSMITTED BY MOSQUITOES

Typically, West Nile virus spreads to humans and animals via infected mosquitoes. The incubation period ranges from three to 14 days.

PREVENTION

- Eliminate standing water in your yard. Mosquitoes breed in pools of standing water
- Unclog roof gutters
- Empty unused swimming pools
- Change water in birdbaths at least weekly.
- Remove old tires or any unsued containers that might hold water and serve as a breeding place.
- Avoid unnecessary outdoor activity when mosquitoes are most prevalent dawn, dusk, and early evening.
- Wear long-sleeved shirts and long pants when you go into mosquito-infected areas.
- Apply mosquito repellent with DEET to your skin and clothing. The higher the percentage (concentration) of the active ingredient, the longer the repellent will work. Avoid using DEET on the hands of young children or on infants under 2 months of age. When outside cover your infant's stroller or playpen with mosquito netting.

This weekend, we heard once again the story of Jesus feeding of the 5,000 with five loaves and two fishes; this was after the first reading (from 2 Kings) where Elisha served 100 men with 20 loaves. What can we make of this today?

Traditional Catholic thought has us understand the story as the true, actual miracle of Jesus, literally multiplying the 7 items into thousands of items, with 12 baskets of leftovers being collected afterwards.

I can understand the story in that way, as a miracle of Jesus; however, I have heard some people "explain" the story a little differently. The sacrificial act of the one young boy, changing the hearts of the crowd, so that they offered up their own food, that they brought for themselves, for the collective good of the group. In my mind, however, this understanding takes the miracle out of the story and leaves it in the hands of mankind, simply being nice to one another. Now this can be seen as a miracle (I suppose) if the community were extremely hard hearted, and completely self absorbed, but then would 5000 people (obviously from multiple surrounding communities) be following Jesus through the desert? Just a pondering in my mind...

In any case, Jesus was able to feed 5,000 men at this gathering with what appears to be very little. How does this speak to us about our current practice of Eucharist? Physiologically, I do not believe that I could get "full" from the simple wafer and sip of wine. Spiritually, we understand believe in the complete presence of Jesus in this bread and wine. The "fancy" word being transubstantiation—the changing of one substance into another. Substance is defined as "essential nature", or "(the) ultimate reality that underlies all outward manifestations and change." (www.Merriam-Webster.com) You see in the text above, that I had to "strikeout" the word understand. I often think that I understand something but inevitably, something happens that causes me to question my "understanding." A question can cause us to rethink our "understanding," without changing our belief in something.

Through the enormous (and eternal) sacrifice of Jesus for us on the Cross, we have been, and will be, granted a passage to be with God for eternity. When we realize our errors, ask for forgiveness, and learn to rest in the mercy that God has promised us through that sacrifice, we are allowed to move beyond what we currently see, feel and understand, into a "new" reality; an underlying reality that moves in, through and beyond the world that we live in now. I love Fr. Tony's explanations in his homilies like last week's "short, pithy statements," and I have come (through a long and winding path in my faith) to be able to appreciate the short, to the point statements about the faith. However, if you are still reading these articles, you can tell that I still struggle with my complete acceptance of short answers.

I am still one that questions, "Why?" The "because I said so" answer is hard for me to accept. I can believe, and live my life to the ideals required in faith, but I also know that I am doomed to question things and seek out the answers to those questions. The answer that keeps coming to me, through everything, is that the truth WILL NOT be disproved. Jesus the Christ, the Eternal Truth always was, is and will be. Science introduces differing, sometimes compelling, theories to much faith has us believe, but very rarely have the theories been proven beyond doubt. Our faith in the Truth of God, helps us understand better (not necessarily "fully") the ways of the world, nature and humankind. Our faith can help us see and understand miracles that happen, from the feeding of the 5,000, to modern day miracles of people being cured through medicine and also bonafide, unexplainable miracles of cures beyond scientific understanding. Faith can help us see the miracle of life in a newborn baby, in nature and even the miracle of life through death. Faith allows us to understand better and have our hunger/thirst subside through the sacrifice that is our Eucharistic meal. We know that through the sacrifice of Jesus, he really enters into our lives in a tangible way through our meal together.

Over the next week, look for miraculous signs in the world around you, say a prayer for someone, shake a strangers hand and be a miracle for someone out in the world. Be <u>Jesus</u> to/for someone who needs Him in their lives.
