

"I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst."

Have you ever craved a certain food, maybe chocolate, but you try to avoid that food by eating something else? Does it work? Or are you like me, eat the healthier choice and then still go in search of the chocolate? Many of us lead our lives in the pursuit of money, power or honor. When those things elude us, we become unhappy or bitter. When we get them, it's not enough - we keep looking for more money, more power, more honor. We aren't made for that...we are made for God. Our hunger and thirst can only be satisfied by an ordering of our life to God through a relationship with Jesus. St. Augustine said of God, "You have made us for Yourself, and our hearts are restless until they rest in You."

A great way to get closer to God is through the strengthening of your relationship with Jesus. Consider participating in the ChristLife session called Discovering Christ here at St. Jane Frances to do just that!



It's almost time to register! If you haven't heard, ChristLife begins with a seven-week experience called "Discovering Christ." Discovering Christ is a process that creates a welcoming environment where members of a parish can bring their family, friends, or other guests to hear the Good News and personally encounter Jesus Christ. Each session includes a meal, a brief time of worship, a teaching, and small group discussion. The high point of the course is a day retreat where guests have the opportunity to make a personal commitment to Christ and be renewed in the Holy Spirit.

Discovering Christ has two major goals:


- 1. To help participants enter into or renew a personal relationship with Jesus Christ, experience the love of God, and be empowered by the Holy Spirit to live as God's children and serve as His missionary disciples in the Catholic Church.
- 2. To give participants the relational support necessary to begin to live for Christ within the parish.

We are praying and hoping to provide this enriching and enlightening experience for as many people as we can. Have you made plans to attend yet? Decided who to invite to join you? Just two more weeks until registration begins! Here are the details:

- ♦ Monday evenings, September 24<sup>th</sup> through November 5<sup>th</sup>, beginning at 6:15pm.
- ♦ A life-changing retreat on Saturday, October 27<sup>th</sup>, 9:00am 3:00pm
- ♦ At each Monday session we will enjoy a **delicious dinner**, pray together, and listen to a thought-provoking teaching. After, we will join others in exploring the meaning of life and the identity of Jesus Christ.
- Beginning on August 18<sup>th</sup> we will have registration in the parish office or over the phone.

For registration, we simply need to know your name, phone number, email address and age. AGE?!? Why do we need to know that? We want to be sure to group people with a nice array of life experiences, providing for challenging and rewarding dialogue on our relationship with Jesus. No worries—we won't share!

We can't contain our enthusiasm for this program! PLEASE—Mark your calendar for the weekend of August 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> to register and be sure to reserve your spot! We don't want anyone to miss out on this opportunity.

Last month I had shared information about the Spiritual and Corporal Works of Mercy. This week I would like to elaborate on the Corporal Works of Mercy.

Here are some practical suggestions for practicing the Corporal Works of Mercy which are "kind acts by which we help our neighbors with their everyday material and physical needs."

#### FEED THE HUNGRY

- See to the proper nutrition of your loved ones
- Support and volunteer for food pantries, soup kitchens, and agencies that feed the hungry
- ♦ Educate yourself about world hunger
- ♦ Avoid wasting food and share your meals with others

#### SHELTER THE HOMELESS

- ♦ Help neighbors care for their homes and do repairs
- Support and/or volunteer at a homeless shelter, build homes, and provide support in the wake of natural disasters
- Consider being a foster parent

#### **CLOTHE THE NAKED**

- ♦ Support the work of St. Vincent de Paul Society
- ◆ Go through your drawers and closets and find good-condition clothes and shoes to donate
- Volunteer to work at a clothing drive or at a shelter where clothing is distributed to those in need

#### VISIT THE SICK

- Spend quality time with those who are sick or homebound
- ◆ Take the time to call, send a card or an email to someone who is sick
- ♦ Volunteer for the DENIS Connection
- Assist those who are fulltime caregivers for family members

#### VISIT THE IMPRISONED

- Support and/or participate in ministries to those who are incarcerated or agencies that advocate on behalf of those who are unjustly imprisoned
- Support job-training and educational programs designed to rehabilitate prisoners (i.e. On the Rise Bakery)
- Support the abolition of the death penalty

#### **GIVE TO THE POOR**

- ◆ Take some small bills or loose change with you to hand out to people you encounter who are in need
- Throw your coin change into a jar and periodically donate it to a charity
- Make a regular monetary donation to a a charity that tends to help the poor

#### **BURY THE DEAD**

- Be faithful about attending wakes/visitation
- ♦ Support or volunteer at a hospice
- Participate in a bereavement ministry
- Spend time with widows/widowers
- Take friends and relatives to visit the cemetery
- Send Mass cards to families of those who have died
- Offer daily prayers for those with terminal illnesses and for those who have died.

- Canned tomatoes


As of July, we have <u>sufficient</u> canned vegetables, soup, mac & cheese, cereal, tuna, ramen noodles, peanut butter and cake mix.

Per usual, it is Tuesday (almost afternoon) and Rakhi, our resident Communications Wizard is being a wonderfully patient angel, because Ben is struggling with what to write. The readings, and the events of the week, provide so much to write about but, as I stated last week, brevity will not find its way to me.

I read this weekend's readings, again, (on my phone) while sitting at the doctor's office, waiting to be granted admittance to the back, exam area, for the appointment, and I wonder, "why, oh why, did I choose an 11:00am appointment? Get the 1<sup>st</sup> appointment after lunch, this is taking too long!"

A lady in the waiting room, a joyful, jovial, lady is speaking to me, cracks a few jokes and does something (simple) which instigates a full blown asthma attack. She begins puffing, and her deft fingers quickly rummaged through her bags, open countless items, pull out a nebulizer and medicine, set it up and asks me, calmly nonetheless, to ask for the doctor. 911 gets called, the doctor comes out and helps her calm her breathing down a bit; then off she goes to the hospital, worried and apologetic to not just the other lady that she came with, but to all of us in the waiting room, for "causing a scene".

A "calm" comes back over the waiting area, furniture is repositioned, people begin to whisper again amongst one another... Our first reading from Exodus (16:2-4,12-15) springs to the forefront of my mind, about the Israelites grumbling and complaining about being led from slavery.

I enter the exam room, the nurses, aides and the doctor are wonderfully amiable, I chat with a representative of a company about a product that I was using questioning some of the newest updates, and I think of the second reading, how too often I now live, "in the futility of (my) mind" - Eph 4:17. Trying to get fundamentals straight, and figure out the things that are out of place – living in my mind, instead of with the people around me.

I am (relatively) healthy, I can stand to lose a pound (or 40) but I am in good health. I have a wonderful family, amazing supportive friends who still speak with me (why? I do not know). I am able to work, play, recreate, and otherwise get around unimpeded, I need to reset my mind...

"... you should put away the old self of your former way of life, corrupted through deceitful desires, and be renewed in the spirit of your minds, and put on the new self, created in God's way in righteousness and holiness of truth." Ephesians 4:22-24

I take from today's experiences that we can rest in Jesus. **Not** be lazy, but rest, knowing that God is with us always, good times and bad, and He will give us the energy to continue! He will allow *me* to be joyful and jovial even when the chips are down. I have been introduced to Jesus, once again, through the lady in the waiting room, and everyone in the doctor's office. Let each of us be filled with the meal of the Eucharist, and go out into our world to "be Jesus" to someone new and someone familiar this week.
