

THIS WEEK'S JERRY-ATRICS

As the past two weeks have involved news regarding staff departures, several parishioners have expressed concern regarding what the future holds for St. Jane France de Chantal Parish. First and foremost rest assured that the prognosis for St. Jane Frances is a good one. In fact, to quote directly from the Gospel of Luke, "Do not be afraid; for behold, I proclaim to you good news of great joy for all the people!" (Luke 2:10) This good news is regarding two new "arrivals" to fill vacancies left by two of the openings on our parish staff.

Good News #1: Earlier this week, I received word that Archbishop Vigneron has appointed a new pastor for St. Jane

Frances de Chantal. Upon my departure, Fr. Anthony Sulkowski will become the fourth pastor of this Catholic faith community. I have known Fr. Tony for well over 30 years. Although he is roughly four years younger than I, he, in terms of seniority, outranks me as he was ordained before me. Presently, Fr. Tony is the pastor of St. Basil Parish in Eastpointe. St. Jane has been blessed to have such an All Star serve as their new shepherd of souls. In addition to possessing a deep spirituality, excellent pastoral skills and a wealth of experience of knowledge from his previous assignments, Fr. Tony has a great sense of humor. I am confident that the transition of pastors will be a smooth one. I will leave it up to

Fr. Tony to update you with additional information regarding his background in future editions of the bulletin.

Good News #2: We also have concluded our search for a new Director of Music. Starting Monday, August 14th, William Harrison will take over all responsibilities for the position which has been vacant for the better part of two months. William has most recently served as Director or Music at St. John the Baptist in Monroe. In the search for a new Director of Music, there were several excellent and well qualified candidates who applied for the job. The consensus of the parish staff, who were all involved in the interview process, was that William was the candidate who could best serve the needs of this faith community.

This now leaves one final opening to address – the position of Worship Coordinator and Pastoral Minister which has resulted from Maureen's stepping down as a result of her entering into a new form of clinical trials related to her cancer. I have spoken to Fr. Tony about the best way to approach this task of finding someone to take on the role left by Maureen's departure. Fr. Tony will be involved and have a say in terms of who will eventually take Maureen's place. The plan is that Fr. Tony would be present, along with the rest of the staff, for the interview process. I may be part of the interview process, but just to ask questions of the candidates. My preference is not to have any say whatsoever when it comes to the final decision regarding who to hire.

Given all that has transpired, it will be September or perhaps October, until a decision is made regarding the new person who will serve in the role of Worship Coordinator and Pastoral Minister. Fr. Tony had previously scheduled some time to be away in August, and he also needs to tend to a few other pending items on his docket. I would anticipate beginning the interview process for Worship Coordinator and Pastoral Minister beginning right after Labor Day. The staff here at St. Jane needs a little time to decompress, reflect and recharge before we do the final work to round out the parish staff. All will be well and things will unfold in a timely and appropriate manner.

Finally, as we move through the transition of pastors over the next three months, I find myself identifying with the final testimony of John the Baptist in the Gospel of John. The Baptist is fully aware that his time is drawing to a close. John tells his disciples "He (Christ) must increase and I must decrease" (John 3:30). In many respects, these final months will have me serving more as an administrator than a pastor. I will continue to do all the sacramental and pastoral work as it relates to Masses, weddings, funerals, anointing etc. but when it comes to decisions of importance which involve the long term future of the parish my preference is to defer to Fr. Tony, or, at the very least, make no decision of major importance without first consulting him. Please keep the staff and parishioners of St. Basil, St. Paul of Tarsus, St. John the Baptist and St. Jane Frances in your prayers as we transition and adjust to new settings and circumstances.

WHEN A STRANGER ASKS FOR MONEY

At St. Jane Frances de Chantal we have a very active St. Vincent de Paul Society that provides food and resources to those in need. Anyone soliciting for money in our parking lot before/after Mass is doing so without permission from the parish. Please DO NOT GIVE CASH to any such individuals.

Instead, politely refer such individuals to speak with the receptionist in the parish office. The receptionist will contact one of the members of our St. Vincent de Paul society who will do an intake in order to determine if the request has validity. If the person refuses to do so they, in all likelihood, are not in need of legitimate assistance.

When you give money to a person who does not have permission to solicit people going into or out of church there is no way to guarantee the money is going towards the purpose they claim. The St. Vincent de Paul never gives cash to a person. A person in need, if it is determined that there is a legitimate request, can be helped by being given food, a voucher, or a check made payable to a utility company or landlord, if they are truly in need.

ST. JANE FRANCES de CHANTAL : FEAST DAY: AUGUST 12TH

We should throw ourselves into God as a little drop of water into the sea, and lose ourselves indeed, in the ocean of the divine goodness.

St. Jane Frances de Chantal

St. Jane Frances was wife, mother, nun, and founder of a religious community.

At 21, she married Baron de Chantal, by whom she had six children, three of whom died in infancy. At her castle, she restored the custom of daily Mass, and was seriously engaged in various charitable works.

Jane's husband was killed after seven years of marriage, and she sank into deep dejection for four months at her family home. Her father-in-law threatened to disinherit her children if she did not return to his home.

When she was 32, Jane met Saint Francis de Sales who became her spiritual director. She wanted to become a nun but he persuaded her to defer this

decision. She took a vow to remain unmarried and to obey her director.

After three years, Francis told Jane of his plan to found an institute of women that would be a haven for those whose health, age, or other considerations barred them from entering the already established communities. There would be no cloister, and they would be free to undertake spiritual and corporal works of mercy. They were primarily intended to exemplify the virtues of Mary at the Visitation (hence their name the Visitation nuns) humility and meekness.

Though, Francis de Sales was obliged to make it a cloistered community following the Rule of Saint Augustine, the congregation consisting of three women began when Jane Frances was 45. She encouraged the local authorities to make great efforts for the victims of the plaque, and she put all her convent's resources at the disposal of the sick.

She is considered the Patron Saint of forgotten people; in-law problems; loss of parents; parents separated from children; and widows.
