### FEAST OF ST. JANE FRANCES DE CHANTAL: AUGUST 12

Jane Frances was wife, mother, nun, and founder of a religious community. Her mother died when she was 18 months old, and her father, head of parliament at Dijon, France, became the main influence on her education. Jane developed into a woman of beauty and refinement, lively and cheerful in temperament. At 21, she married Baron de Chantal, by whom she had six children, three of whom died in infancy. At her castle, she restored the custom of daily Mass, and was engaged in various charitable works.

Jane's husband was killed after seven years of marriage, and she sank into deep dejection for four months at her family home. Her father-in-law threatened to disinherit her

children if she did not return to his home. He was then 75, vain, fierce, and extravagant. Jane Frances managed to remain cheerful in spite of him and his insolent housekeeper.

When she was 32, Jane met Saint Francis de Sales who became her spiritual director, softening some of the severities imposed by her former director. She wanted to become a nun but he persuaded her to defer this decision. She took a vow to remain unmarried and to obey her director. After three years, Francis told Jane of his plan to found an institute of women that would be a haven for those whose health, age, or other considerations barred them from entering the already established communities. There would be no cloister, and they would be free to undertake spiritual and corporal works of mercy. They were primarily intended to exemplify the virtues of Mary at the Visitation—hence their name the Visitation nuns—humility and meekness.

We should throw ourselves into God as a little drop of water into the sea, and lose ourselves indeed, in the ocean of the divine goodness.



This Gospel reading really strikes a chord for me. It starts out with the wording, *"The Jews murmured about Jesus..."* and the response from Jesus wasn't, "Hey y'all what's going on?" or even, "what are you all talking about?"

Jesus answered and said to them, "Stop murmuring among yourselves. No one can come to me unless the Father who sent me draws him..."

Quite often, I hear things that are said, from students about school, parents about things going on at their children's school, and even (*gasp*) people talking about things in the church that need not have even been spoken about beyond the meeting in which the items may have been mentioned in, to begin with.

Today's society has us all clamoring for the latest and greatest gossip. The "newspapers" at the check out in the grocery store, the "news" magazine shows on television, even reputable news agencies trying to be "the first exclusive reporting" of what someone may or (more likely) may not have been saying or doing. In the first reading, from 1<sup>st</sup> Kings, Elijah calls out to God,

### "This is enough, O LORD! Take my life, for I am no better than my fathers."

Elijah is speaking to the fact that he had the people of Israel seize 450 prophets of Baal, and he then slaughtered them. (To read what I'm speaking of, read the whole story 1Kings 16:29—19:15 and beyond). Gossip about someone, isn't outright killing them, like murder, but it is a sin, in which the dignity of a person (both parities the gossiper and those gossiped about) is chipped away, reducing an individual to no more than a *thing* to be used to make the gossiper supposedly feel better about themselves, or to elevate themselves in the eyes of others because they have "news" about something before anyone else.

We are ALL guilty of this sin to some degree, so remember pointing a finger at someone else points three fingers back at ourselves. I bring this up because of a lesson that I glean from Paul's letter to the Ephesians (our second reading) where he says,

Brothers and sisters: Do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, with which you were sealed for the day of redemption. All bitterness, fury, anger, shouting, and reviling must be removed from you, along with all malice. And be kind to one another, compassionate, forgiving one another as God has forgiven you in Christ.

So be imitators of God, as beloved children, and live in love, as Christ loved us and handed himself over for us as a sacrificial offering to God for a fragrant aroma. Eph 4:30-5:2

The lesson I took is this: it is pretty easy to follow the Letter of the Law when it comes to the 10 Commandments, but it is also easy to blur those letters when we do not follow the Spirit of the Law as well. The last 5 lines of the reading above help us to follow that Spirit. Is it easy? Nope! But even Jesus himself told us that it would be difficult, and to expect to suffer persecution.

Everyone who listens to my Father and learns from him comes to me. I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever Jn 6:45,51

As we wind down the summer months, let us learn from the Father's teachings. Let us truly Love one another, put aside grudges, let go of things that do not matter and start fresh. Let us show God's mercy through our own actions. Let us seek truth and share truth, not simply hearsay and rumors. And finally, let us teach the next generation to be better, by trying to show them how, not simply telling them what is wrong and right and not following these guidelines ourselves...
