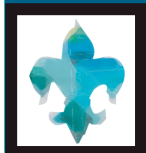

WHEN A STRANGER ASKS FOR MONEY

At St. Jane Frances de Chantal we have a very active St. Vincent de Paul Society that provides food and resources to those in need. Anyone soliciting for money in our parking lot before/after Mass is doing so without permission from the parish. Please DO NOT GIVE CASH to any such individuals.

Instead, politely refer such individuals to speak with the receptionist in the parish office. The receptionist will contact one of the members of our St. Vincent de Paul society who will do an intake in order to determine if the request has validity. If the person refuses to do so they, in all likelihood, are not in need of legitimate assistance.

When you give money to a person who does not have permission to solicit people going into or out of church there is no way to guarantee the money is going towards the purpose they claim. The St. Vincent de Paul never gives cash to a person. A person in need, if it is determined that there is a legitimate request, can be helped by being given food, a voucher, or a check made payable to a utility company or landlord, if they are truly in need.

JUST A NOTE



Our entrance hymn today is one of my absolute favorites - "All Creatures of Our God and King." The text of this beloved hymn of praise is a translation and paraphrase of a text written by St. Francis of Assisi in 1225 known as the "Canticle of the Sun" or "Song of All Creatures." This specific translation was done by William H. Draper around 1910 for a children's Pentecost festival.

Differences in text abound between hymnals. Worship and Rejoice contains a verse that is not found in many others, beginning: "All you who are of tender heart...." Another verse found in some hymnals, such as the Psalter Hymnal and Presbyterian Hymnal, begins, "Earth, ever fertile, day by day." Even among similar stanzas, the words differ. For example, in Worship and Rejoice, the third stanza begins, "O flowing water, pure and clear," while in the United Methodist Hymnal, that same verse begins, "O sister water, flowing clear." Subtle differences, but enough to ensure no two hymnals are the same.

Almost every modern hymnal agrees, though, in taking out the original sixth stanza, themed around death. The tune LASST UNS ERFREUEN is believed to be a seventeenth century German folk melody. A common setting of the tune by Ralph Vaughan Williams was published in 1906, and is used in many hymnals today. The "Alleluias" and "O Praise Him" were added to make the text fit this tune, and are a brilliant addition to the existing text, emphasizing the scope of continual praise lifted to God from all creation.

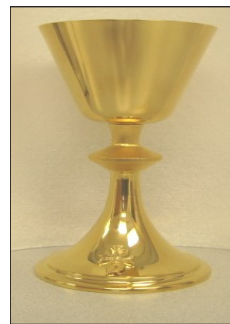

HEALTH MINISTRY

BALANCE

Balance is made up of our equilibrium and our senses. Perhaps you've noticed, if your eyesight is absent your balance may be off. Think for example, when you get up in the night to use the bathroom and the lights are off. As we age, our sense of hearing, sight, and touch often decrease. This can then result in a loss of balance also. When working on fitness even at a younger age, we should include some challenges for our balance for this reason.

In my last article, I spoke about falls. Very often having better balance can assist us in self recovery from a fall. Challenging ourselves with balance in our workout regimes can in the end allow us to avoid a fall to the floor and perhaps the misfortunes that go with it.

When teaching balance skills to my patients I often recommend the following simple exercises and ways to advance them:

Stand with both feet about shoulder width apart; (hold on to countertop or back of chair)

1. Slowly lift a foot so you are standing on one foot; see how long you can maintain hold. Now try the other foot and see how long you can maintain.
2. Both feet on the ground push up so your heels come off the floor.
3. Stand with one foot in front of the other like you are on a tight rope. You may have to turn and use one hand on counter and other on the back of a chair

You can advance each of these simple exercises in the following ways:

- Try to maintain each longer (up to a minute).
- Try holding on with one hand, advance to finger tips, or no hands (hover hands just in case).
- Try closing your eyes in that position.

As with any exercise, if you are having problems discontinue and mention it to your doctor.

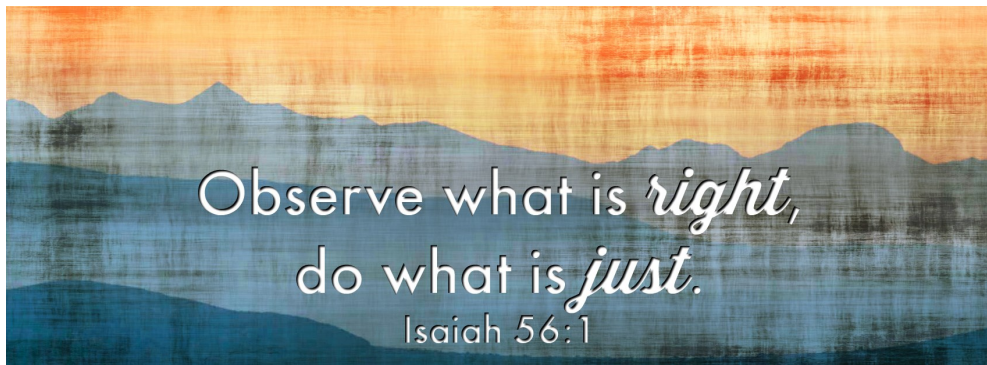

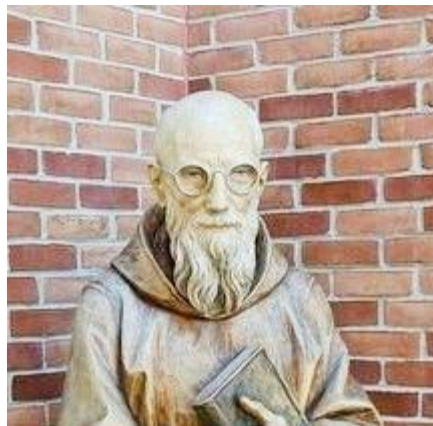
