Janina Parrott Jacobs, has been a musician within the Archdiocese of Detroit for over 46 years and has served as Director of Music at St. Rita's in Detroit, St. Dennis in Royal Oak, St. Basil the Great in Eastpointe and also currently plays liturgies at San Francesco Italian Church in Clinton Twp. and the National Shrine of the Little Flower Basilica. During her 20 years at St. Basil's, Janina hosted the Angels and Inspiration Music Series which featured local, regional and national musicians performing various styles of music, including Jazz, Swing, Gospel, Country, Blues, and Ethnic, as well as featuring liturgical dance, Irish Stepdancers, and more. She will continue the Angels Series here at St. Jane. Many who sing in the church welcome the chance to perform different music in concert and this is the perfect venue to do so.

Janina started playing piano at age 3, and studied privately from ages 7 to 14. She learned organ fundamentals and liturgy at age 16 when she joined the St. Rita (Detroit) Choir, where Music Minister Richard Vestuto tutored and instructed her. While studying piano, she was also enrolled in the Detroit Civic Center Theater where she played lead and supporting roles in many musicals and plays performed at the old Ford Auditorium, Cobo Hall, the Detroit Institute of Arts theatre and tent shows and parades throughout the city. She even appeared on the Captain Jolly show at age 9 singing a song from Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs! She is called upon to sing the National Anthem, O Canada, and Invocations at various U.S. and Canadian military events, classic car cruises, and sporting events and often invites her choir to join in.

INSTRUMENTS IN PRAISE (IIP) Anyone who plays an instrument is invited to join us in worship. There may be separate rehearsals for musicians, but you can also work independently to learn your music and sometimes will rehearse along with the choir. Currently IIP plays the first and third Saturdays of the month, but there will be availability for musicians at other masses as well.

CHILDREN'S CHOIR: Parents of young parishioners who have completed their first Communion are invited to contact me about the possibility of a Children's Choir, which will be seasonal and will sing at liturgies and services according to availability and needs of the parish.

Today's readings speak of Faith and Works. The readings speak of life lived in glory of the message that God presented (to the writer) and which He still presents to us today, worded a little differently maybe, but still the same message. The readings also speak of temporary turmoil and tests in the writer's life, *because of* <u>living</u> the message of God. What is this message? It's quite simple: 1-Do good. 2-Do NO evil. See, simple, right? Not quite so!

As a matter of fact, humans have butchered this simplicity so bad, that it is a wonder that God allowed us back at all! The Crusades—"become a Christian, or die!" The Inquisition, where church officials tortured and sometimes put people to death. The scandals that have been coming to light (most recently in Pennsylvania) about abuses taken by *some* (definitely not all) church authority figures. Through these few people doing bad things, an entire ideology can be cast into doubt, but we must remember who is doing the wrong. God? NO! Human beings, not the whole church.

Each and every one of us gets tempted, from those who feel they are the "most" pious to those who feel the "least" pious. The non-Christian AND the Christian alike. We are all alike in this this regard. Even Jesus, who left the divine nature and became imperfect man, suffered temptation but He had the fortitude to say simply:

"Get behind me, Satan. You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do."

Mark 8:33(b)

What about that? But it cannot be as simple as that, can it? No, it can't. Jesus lived and practiced His way of life so intently, that He makes that statement "look" simple, but He worked on it every day, in every moment. A lifetime commitment to living the right way. We guess that Jesus was about 33 years old or so when He died. But He LIVED His way of life longer than I, who am about 11 years older than Jesus was. It is hard, and more difficult than I can imagine to live His way, but all I (and each and every one of us can do) is work at it. Develop good habits (virtues), where I no longer have to "work at" say, making time for prayer, it becomes muscle memory to pray before, during and after, EVERY thing that we do.

This brings me back to the beginning (and the second reading) wherein, the Letter to James tells us *essentially* that faith without works, is dead. It is NOT saying don't have faith, as long as you do good, God will accept you. It IS saying that if you say something to the effect of, "Hey, I am Catholic," then our lives NEED to reflect that statement. It is okay to struggle with a precept, or rule of the Church, but it is NOT okay to say, "Eh, I just won't follow *that* rule." We still need to follow the rules and to (honestly and fervently) seek out why we struggle with a rule, and find out why the rule is in place. To be Catholic, means to follow the Catholic teachings.

Finally along with this, we have to understand and have a semblance of tolerance for other people who were raised in a different way, seeing things in a different light, and help them on the path. They have just as much to offer us as we do to them. We may not (and probably should not) ascribe to their belief structure, but if we could walk in their shoes, even for a few steps, we might be able to see more fully struggles that we couldn't ever fully imagine. Genocide, abuse of power, Infanticide, and the list goes on...

We need to practice what we preach, and know that we will goof it up, but not quit. Apologize to those affected by our mistake, do our *mea culpas*, get back up and get back on the correct path. We shouldn't gloss over a mistake, and hope someone doesn't notice. We shouldn't sweep it under the rug, or stuff it into a corner or closet. Admit it, ask forgiveness, take the punishment (if there is some) and move forward. And while we're at it, grab the person (who's in the same boat as you), and help them out, too. Don't commiserate on the mistake, hold each other responsible and turn the situation around. So, thank you, to each and everyone who has helped me along the way! Let's be better together!
