

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

By now you will have learned that our State Attorney General has launched an investigation into the Catholic Church in Michigan in regard to acts of sexual abuse of minors by clergy, and the ways these cases were handled by bishops and others in authority. Once again, I affirm:

The Archdiocese of Detroit welcomes the Attorney General's investigation and is prepared to fully cooperate. We have worked closely with authorities from all six counties within our archdiocese since 2002, when we shared past case files involving clergy misconduct and committed to turning over all new allegations regardless of when the alleged abuse occurred. The Attorney General investigation is the next phase of our commitment to transparency and healing.

We have full confidence in our safe environment policies put in place and carefully followed for more than 15 years. We remain committed to protecting everyone – especially children and vulnerable adults – and therefore look forward to working closely with officials to determine if there is more we can do to accomplish this goal.

As shepherd of our local church in Detroit, I want to offer my most heartfelt apology for the shame I know you must feel that, because of failures in the Church's leadership, we have come to this point. While shame and embarrassment might be an initial reaction, they are not the most important. First and foremost, in the beginning and throughout, we must keep our focus on the healing of the victim - survivors and on our efforts to keep everyone safe in our parishes, schools and all other dimensions of the Church's life. I renew to you my pledge to lead all of us in striving ever more vigorously to achieve these goals.

Most recently, our response to the sexual abuse crisis has led to establishing new action steps to hold bishops accountable for our own personal behavior and for how we have dealt with cases of abuse. The U.S. Bishops' Conference has already shared some important decisions about this, and I fully endorse them. Further, I will meet soon with all the priests in the archdiocese to discuss further actions we can take to ensure that my pastoral ministry is characterized by integrity, transparency and accountability.

What I have mentioned so far concerns the actions that need to be taken to strengthen the organizational side of our faith-community. While not seeking to skirt the issue of the need for action, as your pastor, I need also to speak to you about the personal, spiritual response to which God the Father calls us in our current situation. I hear him inviting us to renew our faith in him: that he has raised Jesus from the dead and made him Lord of history, not least the history of our time and place; that in the death and resurrection of Jesus is the power to conquer evil, even sins as heinous as those being uncovered because of this crisis; and that in the outpouring of his precious blood he gives us the singular grace to atone for these sins and heal the wounds that have been inflicted on Christ's Mystical Body, the Church.

In that light, I ask that you enter a moment of prayer – kneel if you wish – and in spirit join with the priest in this prayer from the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, which I've edited to focus on our community's need for mercy:

Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your Dearly Beloved Son, Our Lord, Jesus Christ, in atonement for the sins of clergy sexual abuse and the failure of those who should have prevented it. For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and give healing to all victims-survivors, their families, and to the whole world.

As I close, I offer again my apology, first to victim-survivors and all others so grievously wounded by the sexual abuse of minors by clergy, and for these crimes and failure of leaders to prevent them. Also, I apologize to all of you, members of the Catholic community, for the hurt these sins have caused you. With the help of God, I will continue to lead us on the path toward being the family of faith God calls us to be.

Saint Anne, pray for your Church in Detroit. Blessed Solanus, pray for us.

Two weekends ago, on September 23rd, the Gospel reading from Mark included this lesson Jesus taught—God calls us to serve one another, not ourselves. "If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all." Mark 9: 35.

Mark continues that theme in today's reading. "Let the children come to me; do not prevent them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. Amen, I say to you, whoever does not accept the kingdom of God like a child will not enter it." Mark 10:14-15

There is a strong connection between these two verses. At the time the Gospel was written, children were not the great and awesome wonder that many of us think of our children as now. Children were of low status. They would have been among "the last of all." The disciples didn't want children bothering

Jesus, the Master. They may also have been concerned about their own reputations, hanging out with those who were beneath them.


Jesus reproached them for demeaning the children and for missing, once again, the entire teaching about the kingdom of God. They still weren't understanding the dignity of all people and the meaning of service. We are made in the image of God, therefore, demeaning one we consider "less than" is the same as demeaning God. To be made in the image of God is to be made to love. Jesus also taught us about the unconditional love of the Father, unearned by us but given freely anyway. Children are sponges when it comes to receiving freely given love. To enter the kingdom of God, we are called to love everyone, treat everyone with respect, and abandon our need to be "the best" at anything or everything. We too must receive and give love freely to enter the kingdom of God.

The low status of children at the time of Jesus was shared then, and is shared now, by those whose dignity is compromised – the poor, the refugee, the mentally ill, the homeless - all those who are marginalized in our society. During this Respect Life month, we must remember that we respect the dignity of ALL life – from conception to death, regardless of station. There is no time during our lives or the lives of others that our inherent dignity as children of God should be ignored.

The kingdom of God belongs to us only when we live in the sure knowledge that we are dependent on God for all we have and all we are. We cannot take personal credit for our status in this world. This might be a good topic for prayer, reflecting on our treatment of ourselves and others. Talk to God about your struggles to treat all people with respect. Listen for the response. And listen also to those around you who are crying out for dignity – do you hear the voice of God in their pleas?



Reflection: Every Life - Cherished, Chosen, Sent"

In 1531, when the indigenous peoples of Mexico were subjugated and the practice of human sacrifice was still a recent memory, the Mother of God appeared to St. Juan Diego as a pregnant native woman, now known as Our Lady of Guadalupe.

She sent him with miraculous flowers in his cloak to tell the bishop to build a church where people could receive her Son and her loving, tender care. When St. Juan Diego opened the cloak before the bishop, an image of Our Lady was revealed that remains to this day. The chapel was quickly built, millions embraced Christianity, and the Church increased its protection of the indigenous peoples.

You who are my messenger, in you I place my absolute trust.

By embracing the mission entrusted to him, St. Juan Diego helped bring Christ's transforming love to cultures gripped by oppression and death.

Today, we again see the dignity of human life disregarded. Unborn children are destroyed through abortion, and ill people are encouraged and assisted to take their own life. How do we respond?

The essence of our identity is that we are created in God's image and likeness and loved by Him. Nothing can diminish the priceless worth of any human life. Every person is *cherished*.

God creates every person for eternal union with Himself and continually invites us to embrace a loving relationship with Him. Every person is *chosen*.

We are called to be messengers of God's love, treating one another as cherished and chosen by Him. In doing so, we help build a culture that respects all human life. Every person is **sent.**

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS <u>ULTRASOUND MACHINE PROGRAM</u>—October 13th & 14th

In July 2008, the Knights of Columbus Supreme Council instituted the Ultrasound Machine Program. The purpose of the program is to purchase a brand new ultrasound machine for a Pro-Life Women's Clinic. For each new machine purchased by a Knights of Columbus Council, District, or State Council, the Supreme Council will pay half of the cost of the machine.

The ultrasound machine is used to show the image of a child to the mother. If a woman is shown the image of her unborn child, there is an 80% plus chance that she will decide to keep the baby rather than terminate if she is considered 'abortion minded'.

This is why the St. Jane Frances de Chantal Knights of Columbus council 133450 is having a drive to raise money to purchase an ultrasound machine. The weekend of **October 13th & 14th** we will be giving out "Baby Bottles" to our parish brothers and sisters to fill with their offering and return them within a three week period. Please help us to make this program a success. This is a program we will be repeating each year in October, the Respect Life Month, in our efforts to promote life.

covers two very important

topics-marriage and the pure hearts of children. The Apostles thought that the children might have been bothering Jesus, but our Lord wants all of us to come to him with hearts like children.

IN CHURCH:

Look around the church and notice all the different families. Spend a minute praying for anyone who might be struggling with a family problem.

QUESTIONS FOR THE WEEK:

- ♦ How does Jesus show that children are important?
- ♦ How do you show that you are a part of your family?
- ♦ How do you show that you are a part of Jesus' family?
- ♦ How can you accept the Kingdom of God like a child?
- ♦ How can you show others that they are a part of Jesus' (and our Church's) family?

FAMILY PRAYER:

Lord, show us how to love and bring joy to others.

QUESTIONS TO ASK YOURSELF NEXT WEEK. IN PREPARATION FOR MASS:

- ♦ What is respect? How do you show it to others?
- ♦ Does Jesus want you to be happy or sad? Why?
- ♦ What treasures do you share with others?

While learning more about my faith, I once heard something to the effect of "when someone has an honest and strong belief in something, and they speak that truth, it can often sound like arrogance to someone listening."

In forming our faith, and in helping the younger disciples of our community form their understanding of the faith that we share, I tell them over and over, "Ask questions!" If one person has a question, there is better than a 50% chance that someone else in the room has the same or similar question. I also tell them not to take only one answer completely to heart, but to ask the same question to a few different sources and weigh all of those answers.

The Apostle Paul says in I Corinthians, chapter 13 vs.11: "When I was a child, I used to talk as a child, think as a child, reason as a child; when I became a man, I put aside childish things."

I see the stark reality of this in some regards, too often today. People put aside "childish" curiosity, they do not seek out answers by asking questions. If an adult does not agree with a thought or statement, we too often just tune out that statement, or push the thought aside because "I know better". In the Gospel from Mark this weekend, Chapter 10 vs. 15, Jesus tells us:

"(W)hoever does not accept the kingdom of God like a child will not enter it."

We still need to seek out answers to our questions like children, not dismiss the questions. Ask, listen, weigh out the answer, repeat. Absorb knowledge, fact and opinion, then sort it into truth and ideas that will be better off being left behind.

The readings this weekend can be very hard to swallow and understand because they hit us all on a very personal level, and really challenge the societal "norm" of today. Catholicism and being Catholic is counter-cultural, in that our faith is there to challenge us, to correct us, to set a standard for us to strive for. God only wants the best for His Creation. Because He wants this for us, He gave us the free-will to choose. The rules are set out and we get to say yes or no to the rules, the precepts, the teachings.

When we disobey or fail at following the rules, WE, not God, separate ourselves from Him. God still loves us. He still wants the best for us, but He doesn't just let the bad behavior slide. To come back into His Graces, WE must admit to the wrong doing, acknowledge that it was wrong, seek to make it right, and strive to live our lives better, according to the rules. MY choice. I choose to play the game, or I choose to pick-up my toys and play by MY rules, separating myself from God and the rest of His Creation, on my own.

I was once asked in a parking lot, "Have you been saved, and accepted Jesus into your life?" Of course I answered yes, and when asked when I had been baptized, I replied, "as an infant, but every day I seem to screw up and separate myself from God. Everyday I wake up, beg for forgiveness, ask for strength to overcome my weaknesses and stubbornness. I attend Mass and am Reconciled with God through the Sacraments. It is a constant reliance on His mercy."

Each of us has room to grow. Everyone of us is separated from God, of our own free will. Only God's Love for us, holds us close so that we can receive His merciful forgiveness. Please pray for all of the ministries of OUR parish as we work together on our journey, and we grow, goof up, learn, and do it all over.
