One of the books I read this summer was written by Matthew Kelly entitled, *The Biggest Lie In The History Of Christianity*. Don't let the title fool you. It's a wonderful book about the power of God working in our lives and how He wishes to transform us into the person He's created us to be.

In one of the chapters, Matthew Kelly states that we have become comfortable with our mediocrity. Our lives have become mediocre. I as well as many of my brother priests often hear the same phrase over and over again - "Father, it's always been done this way. We can't change it." This is a great definition of mediocrity. Change is healthy, change is exciting. Every minute of every day we are in a constant state of flux. Things change and God wishes to change us because He has a plan for each one of us.

For example, have you ever taken an old favorite recipe and added a new ingredient to it? The added ingredient changes the overall taste of the recipe. Anyone who cooks has done this from time to time. And the outcome is the same the new ingredient transforms the old recipe into something new and exciting.

The challenge that Matthew Kelly raises in his book is that in order for God to transform us we have to be open to God working in our life. Or to put it another way, we have to be open and realize that God has a plan for us.

Once we open ourselves up to God, we need to focus our attention on being transformed. Matthew Kelly suggests the following prayer.

Lord, Here I am. I trust that you have an incredible plan for me. Transform me. Transform my life. Everything is on the table. Take what you want to take and give what you want to give. I make myself 100 percent available to you today. Transform me into the person you created me to be, so I can live the life you envisioned for me at the beginning of time.

I hold nothing back. I am 100% available. Lead me, challenge me, encourage me, and open my eyes to all your possibilities. Show me what it is you want me to do and I will do it. Amen.


This year, Pope Francis addresses his World Mission Sunday message to us as we live out the adventure of being children of God.

I didn't think of myself that way and would never have predicted their accuracy, but 46 years later, I guess they were right!

I remember the moment quite well, when my music 'career' began at age 16, during my senior year. As you read in my Bio, I had been playing music and singing since age 7, in school and community plays. I couldn't name the dozens of churches I've played at or hundreds of priests, bishops and Cardinals I've worked with, but it has been many. And here I am, 46 years later. The cute guy? Well, we did date for awhile and even got engaged, but he joined the U.S. Air Force and that was that. Looking back, it probably wouldn't have worked out anyway.

If you have ever wondered about joining a choir or music program, DO think about it. You never know where it may lead and we would be glad to have you! Choir rehearsals will be on Wednesdays at 7:00pm in the church. 
I see God's presence in everyday moments - the birth of my new grandson, his first smile, the phone call that comes unexpectedly from an old friend, a reconnection...

- Wear clothing with sleeves that can be raised above the elbow
- Show the staff any "good veins" that have been used successfully in the past to draw blood
- Relax
- Take the time to enjoy a snack and a drink in the refreshments area immediately after donating.

AFTER DONATION:

- Re-hydrate by drinking plenty of fluids over the next 24-48 hours
- Avoid strenuous physical activity or heavy lifting for about 5 hours after donation

tells him he must give up all he owns, he feels sad. It is hard to give up the things we have. Jesus doesn't want us to hold too tightly to things of the world, but rather to desire Heaven.

Bring some of your allowance, or some of your Birthday money to share with the church and it's mission.

QUESTIONS FOR THE WEEK:

- What did the rich man want to learn from Jesus? How did Jesus answer him?
- What things do you hold onto that might keep you from following Jesus?
- What do you do with the money that you earn, do you keep it for yourself or do you help others with it?
- What are some ways that you can serve others in your neighborhood? Rake their leaves, help them with groceries?

FAMILY PRAYER:

Help us, Jesus, to follow you no matter what we must leave behind.

<u>QUESTIONS TO ASK YOURSELF NEXT</u> <u>WEEK, IN PREPARATION FOR MASS</u>:

- When were some times you were a good helper this past week?
- What does Jesus tell us about helping others?



I had to read the readings from this weekend, a couple of times before seeing a link between them, and a message that made sense in my mind. The first reading, from the Book of Wisdom, speaks of wisdom in terms of prudence—

the ability to govern and discipline oneself by the use of reason

The second reading gives us the image of the Word of God being sharper than a twoedged sword, being able to not just hack and slash, but act with surgical precision, and even reaching places like our soul and spirit. Finally in the Gospel message, Jesus challenges us to more than what the previous Judaic Law had supposed... that God rewards us, in this Earthly life, with Earthly treasures if we "behave" ourselves and follow the letter of the law.

The challenge that Jesus lays before us, is one of a bit of challenge for many of us. Give up, or share, what we deem as wealth in our lives with those around us that need what we have, and follow Him, THE Word of God (as the Gospel of John so eloquently lays out in it's first chapter). Listen to Him (Jesus), follow Him (**THE** Word), trust in Him (**THE** Son of God), and take on the challenge that He lays before us, not *just* in what the law says in word but look at the word of the law a little more closely and begin to live according to the SPIRIT of the Law, in a more full, thought provoking way.

Too often, people feel that, "ooh, I come to Mass, therefore, I am Okie Dokie. I've checked that box, and I'm that much closer to Heaven." Jesus challenges us to more. He challenges us to take up our Cross and follow Him, leave our "riches and wealth" where it is and strive to walk in the footsteps of our one perfect example that walked as we walk.

One of my biggest struggles is driving (in traffic—alone). I shout in my car and tend to get a little too worked up when others do not drive the way that I think they should drive. I make sure that my windows are up, and that my radio is on to muffle the sound. I am much better when there are others in the car with me (especially younger people for whom I am trying to set an example), but I still work myself up, until I remember that not everyone had the opportunity to drive "professionally" and gain road time experience in the same way that I did. I still have to find my WWJD bracelet that hung from my two previous rear-view mirrors and put it in a place of prominence in my current vehicle as a reminder.

This is but one of my crosses that I must bear and learn to govern through reason. I am working on my prayer life, and I am working at sharing God's Word (Jesus—and His message of saving grace) with our community. I am a work in progress, far from perfect, far from having all of the answers, but willing to walk along with others that are willing to discuss (not preach) their (as well as my) opinions and how these fit or do not fit into the message that Jesus gave (and gives) to us. Please continue to prayer for all of our young disciples in Faith Formation, and pray for all of our fellow disciples that have confirmed their faith, but haven't made it to "practice" in a while. Pray that they will be able to hear the Holy Spirit's coaching when they get put into the game, and that they will be able to act with prudence with so much noise around them! - I'll see you out there!
