THIS WEEK'S JERRY-ATRICS

Perhaps the hardest reality to accept in life is the unalterable fact that everyone and everything that is precious to us will, in some way, be taken away. Kids grow up and leave home, friends move away, loved ones die, our health deteriorates, and eventually, we die. Moreover, even what is precious to us in terms of faith and values suffers in the same way; things change, thoughts and feelings shift, rock foundations that once anchored us, and so we thought could never corrode, end up crumbling, and we are left wondering what we really can believe in and trust.

Ext. 101 Happily, this is only half of the equation. Everything we lose is eventually given back to us, and in a deeper and fuller way. The kids who moved away become adults and begin parenting a new generation; new bonds of friendship are formed, we reconnect in a deeper and more permanent way to our loved ones who have died, even failing health and death itself opens us up to a place where we land on bedrock, on a foundation so secure that it can never be shaken again.

This pattern is found in scripture for God's chosen people. After arriving in "the Promised Land" it took a number of generations to unite the twelve tribes of Israel and build a temple in Jerusalem as a center for worship. The great kings, David and Solomon, accomplished this, and the people were left with a great sense of security, both politically and religiously. They felt strong, safe, and secure. God had promised them a land, a country, a kingdom of their own, and now they were in possession of what God had promised to them. God's chosen people found self-confidence and assurance in God's providence for them. In other words, God's promise was as good as gold.

Unfortunately what happened was that complacency settled in among God's people. The Assyrians came and conquered Palestine. They deported those of Jewish descent to Babylon, killed the king, and knocked down the temple to its last stone. With the loss of their land, king, and temple, the bottom fell out in every way imaginable. Everything that had once been the anchors of security was taken away from them. The very existence of God came into question. How do you continue to believe, trust, and live in joy when everything of value is taken away from you?

God's answer to this question was this: You will find me again when you search in a deeper way for me, with your whole heart, your whole mind, and your whole soul. God offers to us that same answer today whenever we feel betrayed, orphaned, or disoriented in any way.

This is a very deep and extremely difficult lesson for us to comprehend and accept. Everything that is not God, no matter how precious and wonderful, will be taken away from us in this life. Why? The pure and simple reason is that what we believe gives us self assurance, happiness, and security is not God. All that we cling to, value, and hold on tightly to will, sooner or later, be purged, and we will be left with only one sacred possession - God. In the end it is God, and God alone, that we really need.

The ultrasound machine is used to show the image of a child to the mother. If a woman is shown the image of her unborn child, there is an 80% plus chance that she will decide to keep the baby rather than terminate if she is considered 'abortion minded'.

The weekend of **October 21st & 22nd**, we will be giving out "Baby Bottles" to our parish brothers and sisters to fill with their offering and return them within a three week period.
