Here at St. Jane Frances we have a wonderful ministry of Hospitality – our Ushers group. Everyone who enters the Worship Space at weekend Mass encounters an Usher – each person is greeted as they enter into the Worship Space with a smile and a hymnal. Ushers are also available to help if you need assistance in any way.

Maybe you are being dropped off and need assistance in getting to a seat? Let us know when you walk in and an Usher will assist you.

Need help with a hearing device? Let an Usher know when you enter the Worship Space and they will get one for you.

Want to take up the Offertory gifts? Ask an Usher!

Arrived late and want assistance finding an available seat? Ushers are particularly good at this.

Not feeling well during Mass? Ushers can assist with a wheelchair to help exit the Worship Space or bring water or juice if your blood sugar is low. They can also contact 911 in the case of an emergency.

Unable to join the line for reception of Communion? Let an Usher know when you arrive and they will direct a Eucharistic Minister to come to you at the appropriate time.

Our Ushers serve for the express purpose of assisting all in participating in the Mass. They are the embodiment of Jesus' words, "I was a stranger and you welcomed me." Please don't hesitate to ask for help. They are happy to be of assistance! And if you don't need help yourself, but would love to help others, consider becoming a Minister of Hospitality/Usher. ***This ministry is open to all – women AND men.***

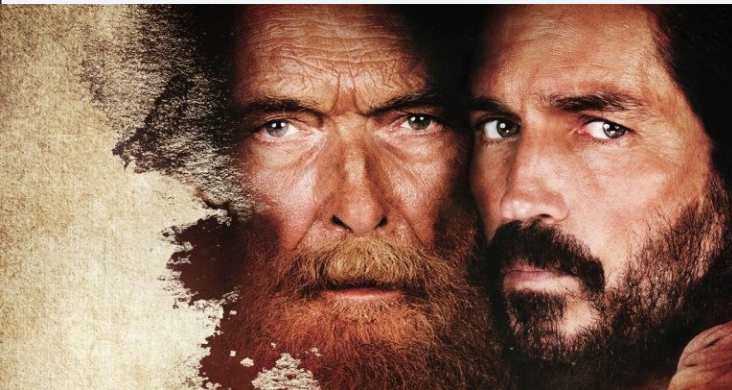

 but overcome evil with good” (Romans 12:21)**

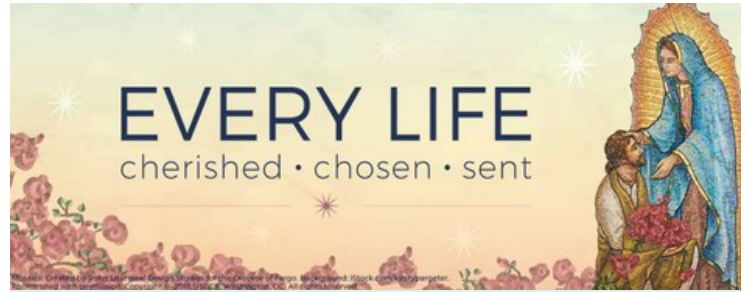
How often do we want to get angry or retaliate against another? Was there a time when you chose to extend grace instead? How did it change the situation?

Catholics are invited to observe Vatican-backed worldwide events, namely, [World Day of Prayer for Vocations](#) and [World Day for Consecrated Life](#). In the United States, we also have [National Vocation Awareness Week](#) and [National Catholic Sisters Week](#). **Priesthood Sunday, however, specifically honors priests, without whom the Holy Sacraments could not be conferred, for a single day out of the 365 days of the year during which they tirelessly serve their parishes.**

It is essential to note that **the number of priests and ordinations in the United States has steadily declined in the past 50 years.** Meanwhile, the number of parishes without a resident priest pastor has sharply increased in the same period of time. **The men who answer the call to priesthood are special indeed, and they are working harder than ever before.**

Next weekend is a time to say a special prayer and thank you to all the priests who have touched our lives here at St. Jane Frances as well as through your life.

Gracious and loving God, we thank you for the gift of our priests. Through them, we experience your presence in the sacraments.

Help Fr. Tony, and all priests to be strong in their vocation. Set their souls on fire with love for your people. ABOUT THE GOSPEL:

It's easy to think of Jesus as a king. He is above all, but, in today's Gospel, He reminds us that He came to serve, not to be served. He gave His life as a sacrifice to save us. We should also serve if we intend to imitate Jesus.

IN CHURCH:

We get used to sitting in the same pew every week. Next week, try sitting somewhere else to see things a little differently.

QUESTIONS FOR THE WEEK:

- ◆ How does Jesus want His followers to become great?
- ◆ In what ways do you serve others? Do you have to think about it, or does service in these ways come naturally?
- ◆ What do you need to be a better servant? How can your Church help you with this?

FAMILY PRAYER:

Open our eyes, Lord, to see the needs of others and grow in our desire to serve them.

QUESTIONS TO ASK YOURSELF NEXT WEEK, IN PREPARATION FOR MASS:

- ◆ When you take a walk around outside, what are some of the things that you see?
- ◆ Take 5 extra minutes each day this week and look around you. Did you see anything new or different?

So, I constantly wonder, who am I to work for the church? Who am I to write in a bulletin for a parish in the Archdiocese of Detroit? What gives me any authority at all? In truth, nothing that I have done, or will do, for that matter, will "give me" any authority whatsoever. Only the Spirit that God has given to each of us, allows us the opportunity to speak.

As I sit to write and ponder what I shall write for the week, I read the readings for the weekend, I remember the homily that I heard last Sunday, and I reflect over my past week. Faith Formation sessions with many young disciples of Jesus looking at their Catechists and myself, some yawning and tired from their day's activities, but many ready to go and listen to what lay ahead for them, ready to absorb stories and lessons with the zeal of youthfulness. What happened to me? Have I turned into a crotchety old man? Where is my zeal?

It's not gone, it's just buried underneath a few too many layers of things that have found their way into my life. The challenge is, to dig down and rediscover that zeal. Re-find the things that help lift and energize me. Paul wrote:

For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who has similarly been tested in every way, yet without sin. So let us confidently approach the throne of grace to receive mercy and to find grace for timely help.

Hebrews 4:15-16

The knowledge that Jesus lived a life just like me, and still chose the will of His Father, the "All Good", despite the things thrown at Him, gives hope. As I come to understand the life of *the* Christ a little better, a strength is given to me to overcome obstacles that I perceive as standing in my way. When I take that knowledge and understanding and learn how to apply them to my life I no longer see obstacles, but challenges that are surmountable, often with the help of others but not impossible.

So, once again, who am I to work for the Church that Jesus began and instituted at His death? No one special! Just someone who has finally opened his ears (and heart) a bit to listen to what was being asked. Serve your community, not in perfection or with all of the answers, just serve. Be there. If I will be *allowed* to join the perfection of God again in eternity, through His Grace and the sacrifice of *the* Son, the least I can do is use what I do have in body and mind during this short time on Earth in Thanksgiving for the gift of forgiveness and mercy that He has shown me.

To those that read my blatherings—thank you! I pray that whatever the Holy Spirit does in that connection between my head, fingers and the keyboard offers something for you. May God bless you in this Respect Life Month. Jesus ransomed His Life for each of us, let's join together in our journey back towards Him.
