FR. T'S TIDBITS: REMEMBERING THOSE WHO HAVE GONE BEFORE US

As we see the close of October we begin the month of November a month in which the Universal Church remembers those who have died. At St. Jane Frances de Chantal as well as in every parish those who were buried from the parish this past year will be remembered. We will recall the many ways in which those who have died have influenced and touched our lives.

It is important to remember and to pray for those who have died. An older priest once told me years ago that it is important to pray for those who have been called home by the Lord because someday others will be praying for you. Death is indeed a part of life and I believe what surprises us about death is that it we don't know when it will come.

As we celebrate the Feast of All Souls let us reflect upon the many people in our lives that have walked this journey with us, those who have left their imprint on our life and on our vocation in life. We are where we are at and are doing what we are doing because of someone's influence on our life. We do not journey through life alone; many people join us in our joys and challenges. Some are with us for a lifetime, others may be with us for a short part of the journey, yet everyone we come in contact with leaves their mark with us.

The Church reminds us of the importance of prayer. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states that we are encouraged to pray, "As in the prayer of petition, every event and need can become an offering of thanksgiving. The letter of St. Paul often begins and ends with thanksgiving, and the Lord Jesus is always present in it: Give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Jesus Christ; Continue steadfastly in prayer, being watchful in it with thanksgiving."

The community is grateful to all those who serve to comfort the grieving. If you feel called to join this team, please contact me for more information. We are always happy to welcome and train new ministers.

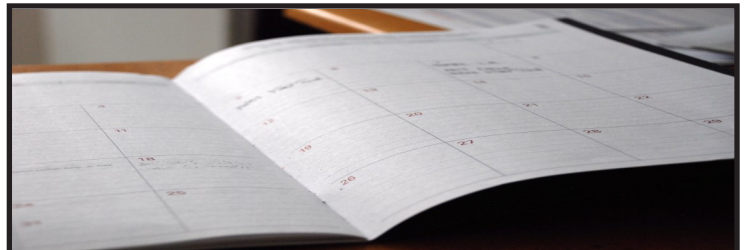


A TRIBUTE TO VETERANS:

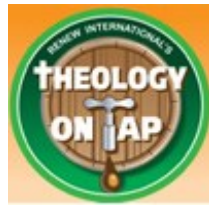

ABOUT THE GOSPEL:

Jesus is moved by the needs of a blind man who calls out to him. We too need to be healed in some way. Perhaps we are hurting or feeling alone or sad. Jesus wants us to believe that he can heal us if we too have faith.

IN CHURCH:

Listen during Mass and try to notice how many times we ask God to forgive or heal us.

QUESTIONS FOR THE WEEK:

- ◆ What do you want Jesus to heal for you? Do you believe that he can heal you?
- ◆ Have you ever closed your eyes and tried to walk around in the dark? Was it uncomfortable or did you feel nervous?
- ◆ Have you ever been “blind” to the world around you? What can you do to see more of that world everyday?

FAMILY PRAYER:

Lord, sometimes we don’t even recognize that we need healing. Help us to see where we might be broken and humbly ask you to heal us.

QUESTIONS TO ASK YOURSELF NEXT WEEK

IN PREPARATION FOR MASS:

- ◆ What are some rules that you have at home? Do you know of any rules that God or Jesus ask us to follow?

FAITH FORMATION REMINDER

There are no sessions for either Confirmation Preparation or Kindergarten—6th Grades this week. Have a safe, enjoyable Halloween, and we’ll see you at Mass on Thursday morning at 8:00am or Thursday evening at 6:00pm as we celebrate with the Saints.

Without my glasses, I am essentially blind. I see fuzzy shapes, but colors and outlines blend together into an indecipherable mess at about 3 feet away. I do not recognize people or things except through reason. For instance, based on a relative height differential, the way the shape moves, and a voice, I can “generally” tell who might be coming towards me, but if that individual stayed silent and purposefully changed how they walked or approached me, there would be no way that I could tell who they were.

If I am speaking with someone, I try to do my best to relate what they are saying to a time in my life where I may have gone through a similar situation, or I remember a time when close friends went through a similar event, in order to try and relate to the situation being spoken about. My problem comes when I start talking about these events instead of listening to the other person who is speaking. In this way, I become blind as well - blind to the other person’s story, to their feelings, to their situation. Has anyone else been there and realized it afterwards? When we become aware of it there is that moment of, “How callous and unfeeling was I just then?”

In the second reading this week, we hear a continuation of Paul’s letter to the Hebrews, which we started at the beginning of October. It has spoken of the Word of God being sharper than a two-edged sword, and it has spoken of Jesus being a living example for us to follow. Not a figurehead that came in, never experiencing what “regular” people feel; rather a person who came, in flesh and blood experiencing the same temptations, pains and feelings that we experience. Accepting false accusations against Him and even suffering torture and death with a singular but unilateral thought—us. Through all of this, through the temptations of evil and the world around Him, He still chose God’s way, for us. He lived a life similar to us saw what we do to each other but still offered Himself for us.

Jesus, the one man who wasn’t blinded by the world around Him, but lived through and among it, came to give the Word of God to us. We have been granted God’s Grace, through Baptism. We are taught the Faith, hopefully through the actions of our parents and grandparents and not simply through words. We are secured in our faith when we witness God through others and how they act. We then witness TO OTHERS when we act upon (but also when we act against) our faith.

God tells us, through Jeremiah in the first reading (Jer 31:7-9), all will be welcomed back - those who have faith, those who trusted in the Word of God, those who witnessed their faith, and they will not stumble.

Now, we must take off OUR blindness. We must open ourselves to the predicaments of others. We must be willing to sacrifice a little more of ourselves, so that others may rise a little bit higher. Maybe if we ALL gave a little, so much more could be accomplished. Take time over the next week or so to actually research both sides of the political issues that are coming to the forefront in the next week or so. Don’t hold these television ads at face value, look for the truth in each of the candidates and proposals ahead of us. Show by both word AND action what it means to be a full, conscious and active participant at Mass, in the voting booth and in what we do to and for one another.

Be safe on Wednesday night! I hope to see everyone at some point on Thursday for our All Saints Day offerings (you know, it is the Holy Day that we are *actually* celebrating on All Hallows Eve) If you haven’t been in a while, join us at 8:00am or 6:00pm. We’re looking forward to seeing you all there!

CHILDREN’S LITURGY OF THE WORD will be back beginning this Advent at the 11:30am Mass! All young disciples from Preschool—2nd grade are invited to join the procession to hear God’s Word in a different way just for you! Father will ask for you to come up to the front of the sanctuary and head out as a group to hear and talk about God’s Word. Bring your food donations for St. Vincent de Paul with you. We’ll see you on December 2nd!

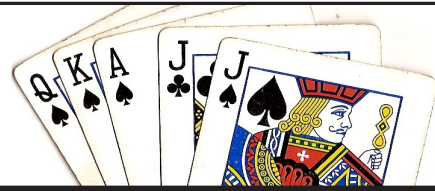
