We have a great group of Sacristans at St. Jane Frances, and we would love for you to join them! **We have a particular need for Sacristans at our Weekday Masses, specifically Wednesday and Thursday morning at the 8:00am Mass.** Sacristans perform a very meaningful role at each liturgy. They do a lot of work behind the scenes to make sure that our liturgies go smoothly. What does that entail?

Mass set up and clean up. At every Mass, the sacristan(s) are responsible for setting up for both Liturgy of the Word and Liturgy of the Eucharist which means preparing all the books, vessels, offertory, and incense when appropriate.

A sacristan also assists the presider with whatever details/duties he needs done. The sacristan will check to make sure the altar servers are ready and in place as well as making sure the assigned Lectors and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are present and ready to serve.

Which Mass will I be assigned to?

We have sacristans at all of our weekend Masses and are especially in need of sacristans at our daily Masses. You primarily work at the Mass of your choice, but we ask that all sacristans help cover Masses when there is a need, especially on Feast Days, Holidays, Sacraments, and sometimes when other sacristans can't cover their normal Mass.

How often do I serve?

Depending on the number of sacristans assigned to a particular Mass, you may serve once or twice a month. You can choose to serve only as a substitute or trade off with the other sacristans and serve on a rotating basis.

What's the time commitment?

Generally, the time commitment is a half hour before and a half hour after the Mass you are assigned.

Whom should I contact if I have more questions?

Feel free to speak to any of the sacristans that serve at our Masses and talk with them about their experience as sacristan. We will give you all the training you need, working together until you are comfortable and ready to fly solo! This has been tradition for St. Jane Soup Kitchen Ministry for over 16 years without omission. In order for a successful meal service, we need **20 adult volunteers maximum** to sign up. Similar to last year, volunteers will serve turkey with mushroom gravy, turkey stuffing, mostaccioli, green beans, yams, and cranberry sauce. Additionally, we will be baking corn bread at St. Jane to serve with the meal.

As always, **VOLUNTEERS MUST SIGN-UP** at the parish office. You can do this in person or by calling the office at (586) 977-8080 and asking to be placed on the list. **You must be at least 16 years old** to volunteer for St. Leo's service.

If you sign-up to serve and wish to carpool, we will meet in the South parking lot at **8:15am** and form groups with volunteer drivers to carpool. We leave by **8:30am. DRIVERS ARE NEEDED.** At St. Leo's, meals are served from 11:30am to 12:30pm with clean-up following. We will return to the St. Jane Frances parking lot around 1:30pm.

If you cannot go but wish to contribute, drop off a **Sweet Potato Pie or Apple Pie** to the Parish Office. **NO PUMPKIN PIES, please!**

First off—Happy 243rd Birthday Marines! It's a proud tradition many celebrate to commemorate our own births, and is also celebrated annually by the USMC and it's many members, active duty, reserve, retired and those that chose to enlist for a shorter period of time. Traditions are kind of crazy things sometimes! Good to some people, but useless to many because they do not know the meaning behind them. What in the world does this have to do with anything that we might have heard today at Mass, or even what we are experiencing in the world today?

Almost every little thing that we are in life is because of what we have gone through, what we have learned and what we “experience” in our lives. I say almost, because many Catholics (even many Christians) are simply “cultural Christians”, meaning they do this thing that we call “church” out of a sense of obligation to parents or grandparents; they do it because most of the people they know, do it on Sundays; they do it because... well, they may not have given it much thought. They do it simply out of habit, and for not much more of a reason than that.

We should ask ourselves, what are we passionate about? How much time do you commit to your passion? One hour a week? God wants us to live in and with our passions, so long as they are ordered correctly in our lives. Moms and dads insist that homework is done before TV time. My Junior year in High School, my mom made me face my wrestling coach and tell him that I had to stop wrestling because my grades had slipped into the C-C+ range. I couldn't tell him that “mom” was making me quit, I had made the decision to let my grades slip, so I had made the decision to let down my teammates. He stood behind my moms reasoning and agreed that school needed to come FIRST.

In the background, underlying my entire life, though, was church. We always went. On vacation—Church on Sunday. If there was a family event, we went to church early in the morning, or on Saturday. If we were sick, we watched it on TV, then everyone else went to Mass. God was always a part of my life, though I really only recognized it after years had passed. I look back at boot camp— God was there, every week. Training schools and college—God was there. When I chose not to go to Mass, God was there urging me back and welcoming me when I finally made it.

My passions have changed through the years, but I now know how to order them—with God and Good as the ultimate goal. It takes practice (as does anything worthwhile) to be able to focus on God instead of the flashing lights and temptations in the world. To look at, and look out for, others and their good. We had the ultimate example in Jesus, in how he lived for God, in the world, and how to give more of ourselves for others. It is a challenge, I don't care how ready or “prepared” you *think* you are!

Has church been “cultural” for you up until this point in life? Are you ready to find out some more of the “whys and whats” behind your religious faith? If you are, all it takes is a conversation. Change the “culture” of your life, and the rank that the world tries to place *itself*, in your life. Live for the good and God, who is THE Good. Reshape your cultural understanding of why you do what you do, and share that understanding. Start small, in your family, branch out into our community family, share it with your school or work family.

This Veteran's Day, let us pray for the women and men who gave time from their lives to protect our freedoms. Thank God for giving these men and women, who felt the sense of duty towards others, to us, to protect our freedoms. Especially thank God for those who gave so much that it hurt, and for their families who stick beside them. Make a new tradition in your life, or find out more about an old tradition and revive it with your family.
