

ABOUT THE GOSPEL:

This Sunday's Gospel is a reminder we should prepare for Jesus' coming

every day. Jesus tells us that we don't know when He will return, so we must be ready at all times.

IN CHURCH:

Pay attention during Mass to see how the priest prepares the altar—and all of us—for Jesus' coming to us in Holy Communion.

<u>Questions for the week:</u>

- ♦ What can you do, every day this week to show Jesus that He is welcome in your home and heart?
- ♦ How do you show love at home? At school? With your friends? At work?
- ♦ Do you have any fears? Do those fears control you, or do you have control over your fears?
- Why did Jesus send us the Holy Spirit? Is there anything that we need to fear about Jesus' coming to Earth again?

FAMILY PRAYER:

Help us, Lord, to make loving choices every day as we wait for your return.

<u>QUESTIONS TO ASK YOURSELF NEXT WEEK,</u> IN PREPARATION FOR MASS:

- ♦ How do you show your family that you are thankful? How about your friends? Do you remember to thank God, too?
- What ways do you show that you belong to Jesus' Kingdom?

OUR SUNDAY EVENING HIGH SCHOOL GATHERINGS are happening each Sunday evening from 6:00pm-8:30pm.

Everyone in 9th—12th grade is welcome to join us at any time. Play some games, catch up with some friends from the past, meet new friends. No commitments, no charge, no pressure, just come relax and take part in discussions that are geared to you by your peers.

Enter through Door #4 in the Circle Drive—we'll see you there.

If you have been paying attention to the readings over the past couple of weeks, a sort of theme has been developing. The first readings (at least to my untrained ears) lend themselves to God setting out rules for us to follow, with His promise to His followers of His faithfulness, so long as we follow the rules; but they also warn of the consequences to those who choose to follow their own rules and put those of God second.

The second readings have contrasted the priesthood of Jesus and the priesthood of man. They have spoken of sacrifice (in general) and of THE Sacrifice given for each of us, by Jesus, the Son of God. These contrasts tell us of the personal nature of Jesus' sacrifice versus the way the priests of the era offered the sacrifices called for by law, but not too much more when it relates to personal sacrificing. We heard of the perfection of Christ's priesthood and how His was a sacrifice once and for always for us. This sacrifice is remembered each and every time we attend Mass. Our pastors stand in the person of Christ as they offer our Eucharistic Sacrifice, and call the Holy Spirit into our shared meal. This is not a new sacrifice by us, rather an eternally occurring sacrifice that Jesus made for me, for you, for all of us. All we are required to do is accept this gift, and live our lives as if we were worthy to be saved (even though we could never earn this gift).

Finally our Gospel readings have Jesus bringing people to a greater understanding of His mission on Earth, from Bartimaeus (the blind man) and the scribes who tried to trick Jesus with the question about the greatest Commandment, to last week's gift of the widow's gift vs the gifts of the rich and this week's telling of what to look for, when, "they will see 'the Son of Man coming in the clouds' with great power and glory." (Mark 13:26).

For those that watch (and have an understanding of) the Liturgical Calendar, we are approaching the Solemnity of Christ the King of the Universe, the end of our Liturgical year. We began the year with Advent, the "coming wind" of Jesus, the Christ, into the world. The anticipation of God in the flesh (Incarnation), building to the birth of Jesus (Christmas), His naming—Immanuel (God with us), to His ministry on Earth and ultimately His sacrifice for us. At this point we entered a long stretch of "ordinary time" in the Liturgical year, which culminates with next week's solemnity. This is Jesus's promise to us that this Earthly life is not the "be all-end all". There is more to our existence than just our few years on this rock, hurtling through space and our notion of time. He has promised to return, to bring us back to the Father, and to usher us back to God's perfection, outside of time as we know it.

Praise God for His gifts to us this season, and this week at your Thanksgiving meal. Thank God for His mercy and for His "want" to bring us back into the fold of His complete Grace. May God Bless you, your families and friends this Thanksgiving, but let's not forget to thank Him for all of the blessings that He has given to us, and say a special prayer for those who are entering this holiday season for the first time, after losing someone special over the past year!
