We focus this week on the theme of hope. As we light the first purple candle on our Advent wreath, we give thanks for the coming of the Lord. Everything began with Mary's "yes"; let us remember that we, too, are called to give that same response to God by always seeing the possibilities and replacing cynicism with hope.



### **MUSICAL NOTES**

Advent is upon us and you'll note some subtle changes in the music we'll use. It will be quieter, more reflective, to evoke a sense of the mysterious as we await Jesus' birth. Music is supposed to do that anyway, to bring on certain feelings and emotions which touch the heart. You may notice that I don't play in any hard and fixed way....that my music flows and is expressed more by feel than by anything else. jjacobs@sjfparish.org No song is ever played the same way twice. That comes from the gospel music training I had

at the hands of choir friends during my 70's and 80's days at St. Rita's in Detroit. You'll see my gurus Darnell and Matt McQueen and Cheri Wilson on some Saturdays and the music will be more in that Gospel-style. Yes, we've been together THAT long.

To those of you who have questioned the use of the tambourine (and there may be other instruments showing up) or who maybe notice their kids or grandkids moving and swaying to the music...... it's OKAY, so let them (See Psalm 150)! That shows the spirit is indeed moving all throughout the church as it should be.

Recently, at Blessed Sacrament Cathedral, Archbishop Vigneron celebrated a special Gospel mass which filled the church with music some Catholics think isn't 'proper'. Well, please think again, that music is as old as the hills and worships God in ways everyone should experience. Most people love it and surprisingly the bulk of the criticism I get is from colleagues who decide that music must be played in only one way: methodical. The simple answer is this: if you ask composers how they want their music to be played, the majority will answer 'my composition is only a guideline and it is up to the artist or musician to interpret it.' If you walk away from church with no song in your heart, I've failed.

DO come and see our second presentation in the Angels and Inspiration Music Series (AIMS) on Thursday, December 6, 2018 at 7:00pm. The Judelaires will visit and perform 'Holiday Magic', a concert of holiday and Christmas favorites you and your family will certainly enjoy. Judelaires leaders Peter DiSante and Stan Barr were here last week to take a look and said it will be a beautiful concert setting. They were impressed with our PR and promotional efforts and commented that they usually don't get this much assistance, so let's make sure they get a full house this week. In fact, they took a picture by the wonderful poster Rakhi created and will use it in their own PR (thanks Rakhi!). A Free Will offering will be taken and an AfterGlow Reception will follow (and they're not used to that hospitality either!).

FUTURE ANGELS & INSPIRATION MUSIC SERIES (AIMS) NOTES: In 2019, both the Motor City Symphony and the Motor City Chorale will perform an Angels concert February 24 and May 5 respectively. # Health Ministry HEPATITUS A VACCINATION

Hepatitis A (HepA) is a highly contagious liver infection caused by the Hepatitis A virus (HAV). It can range in severity from a mild illness lasting a few weeks to a severe illness lasting several months and can result in liver failure and death. Since August 2016, there has been an increase incidence of Hep A in Michigan, with 905 cases reported. Eighty percent of these people required hospitalization, and 28 have died.

Symptoms of HepA include fever, vomiting, grey-colored stools, fatigue, abdominal pain, joint pain, loss of appetite, nausea, dark urine and jaundice. However, not everyone who has HepA feels or looks sick and can still spread the disease. HepA is spread through contact with the stool of an infected person. This can happen easily if someone does not wash his or her hands properly after using the bathroom, or after changing the diaper of an infected person. Hepatitis A also can be spread through contaminated food or water. Contamination of food can happen at any point: growing, harvesting, processing, handling, and even after cooking.

The best way to prevent HepA is to get vaccinated. HepA vaccination is an inactivated (killed) vaccine. You will need 2 doses, given at least 6 months apart, for long-lasting protection. Children are routinely vaccinated between their first and second birthdays (12 through 23 months of age). But Hepatitis A vaccine was not routinely given before 1996, so many adults are not immunized. It is also recommended to wash your hands well with soap and water after going to the bathroom, and when preparing meals, or eating. Use your own towels, toothbrushes, and eating utensils. Do not have sex with someone who has HAV infection or share food, drinks, or smokes with other people.

Are you celebrating Christmas already? Christmas songs and carols have been on the radio for weeks. Christmas shopping has been in full swing for almost a month (right after All Hallows Eve and All Saints Day) as displays for trees and trimmings went up and began selling. Thanksgiving was a blur for me this year, and it seems that we are all looking directly at Christmas and beyond. When are my parties, when are we celebrating, with which side of the family or which friends, where will these parties be, how will I fit them each in, what do I have to buy for each of them? Whoa... hold up, wait a minute. First things first!

### **HAPPY NEW YEAR!**

No, not a new "calendar year" - that's after Christmas, but...we have just started a new Liturgical year. Funny word-liturgical. It comes from the Greek words for public (leitos-) and working (-ergos) especially when related to worship. Our society has blown apart a Christian identity with misconceived readings and understandings of "separation of church and state," which has lead us into a more secular (not openly religious) viewpoint. Be that what it may, we experience an extreme lack of "religiosity" which in itself IS a religious understanding. It is as if society doesn't trust you and I, to deem for ourselves a correct religious stance, so it imposes "non-religion" as a stance.

But I digress (go figure, huh?)! We, as Christians are called to witness to the adventus, the coming wind of change in the world—"God with us" in the flesh. We remember the Birth of our Savior, Jesus, who was from the little town of Nazareth, into this world. The birth of a child whose very coming had been foretold by multiple sources throughout history, both "secular" AND "religious," at that point in time. We celebrate His birthday at almost the beginning of our church year, about a month in, but we really start in a preparation phase.

An engaged couple prepares for their wedding day, new parents prepare for the coming of their child, an individual prepares for a career in the workforce not by focusing past an event, but by focusing on the "what do I have to do NOW" to be ready for this eventual event. So what do we do NOW for this celebration that is coming? Our first week of Advent can be a little bit of a bummer as the "big event" is quite a way off still. So much prep work to be done, so much to be ready for. This first week of Advent in the Church, we are called to remember with HOPE. Hope of the future, hope that we will be ready, hope that everything will work out, hope that we are not forgotten in the rush of everything, hope that we do not forget something or someone in all of our plans.

Jesus, the Christ (the Anointed one), through His sacrifice for us, gives us Hope that we may one day, join God in "oneness." We may live once again without want, without need, without pain, without distress, without loneliness. Jesus promised to come back and bring us all back to God. Are you ready to accept His sacrifice, His gift to US on His birthday? Let us together take some time to prepare ourselves to be more worthy of His gift of grace to us this season. Do something more by doing less getting ready for the "after," and live in the NOW; prepare ourselves NOW by doing things like prayer in Adoration, or pre-read the scripture before coming to Mass. Most importantly of all, be HOPE for someone else in the world. Show a stranger the Love that Jesus has given to you, and be Jesus to someone who really needs to hear and witness His Message of Hope.
