FR. T'S TIDBITS: 2ND WEEK OF ADVENT

In this second week of Advent, John the Baptist plays a prominent role in the life and ministry of Jesus. John is often referred to as the precursor of Jesus. The definition of precursor is forerunner, forbearer, or trailblazer. In reading the Scriptures that pertain to John the Baptist, any one of those terms would be appropriate for him. John was indeed a trailblazer making people aware that

one more powerful than he (John) was to come.

This Advent season affords us the opportunity to be like John and tell our stories of faith and our spiritual journey. Advent is one of those times the Church encourages us to see how God is present in our daily life but more importantly to share those experiences of God's presence with people who are a part of our life or who enter into our journey for a short time. We all have a story to tell and there are people who want to hear our story.

One of the materials I use every Advent season is what has become known as the "the little blue book." The little blue book contains writings or reflections by Bishop Ken Untener. These little six minute reflections allow us to center our attention on the season of Advent in the midst of our busy life and Christmas preparations. I would encourage you to pick up an Advent book in the gathering space and spend that six minutes a day reflecting upon the scripture verse, the reflection, and the prayer at the bottom of each page.

Many people have asked, "What is the meaning of Carpe Diem?" It is Latin for "seize the day." I began using the term after I saw the movie *Dead Poets Society*. It is a reminder for us to see God's hand in our work, our play, and our interaction with each other. As we journey through this season of Advent, may we seize each day and each moment as a gift from God knowing that He loves us and cares for us.

May we also keep in our prayers the men and women who are serving in the military. May God protect them and their families, especially those women and men who will be away from their families this Christmas season.

Bon Mot: With this hope, therefore, let our souls be bound to him who is faithful to his promises and righteous in his judgments. --- St. Clement I, Letter to the Corinthians, c 95.




Inspiration for Living Your Faith Second Week of Advent: Peace

If we have no peace, it is because we have forgotten that we belong to each other. - St. Teresa of Calcutta -

If we are to believe what we see and hear in the news and on social media, divisions run deep in our nation and world. It is tempting to give in to this notion and begin to think we are too small to have any impact. The truth is quite the opposite. Pope Francis, in *The Joy of the Gospel*, gives us a few pointers on how we can be builders of peace in our communities:

- 1) Remember that time is greater than space. We are called to "to work slowly but surely, without being obsessed with immediate results."
- 2) Work to build "communion amid disagreement." When conflicts arise, do not walk away or become entrenched in them. Rather, work to find the common link that can create unity out of discord.
- 3) Remember that "realities are more important than ideas." Avoid trite rhetoric and slogans. Instead, dig into the reality of people's lives. Help to bridge the truths of the faith with the reality of people's lives. Don't be afraid to get messy.
- 4) Remember that "the whole is greater than the part."
 Work locally, but inform that work with a broader perspective. Our own experiences tell our story, but that is not the whole story. Be open to seeing and working toward the bigger picture.

It's already the second week of Advent...I HOPE you spent some time the first week to reflect on Mary's "yes" and saw the possibilities instead of the challenges in your life. Our focus in week two of Advent is PEACE. Here is a quote from Pope Francis that sums up the theme of this week:

"Peace has a face and a heart: it is the face and the heart of Jesus, the Son of God, Who died on the cross and rose again to bring peace to every man and to all humanity. Jesus is 'our peace', as he tore down the wall of hate that separated men from each other."

When I think of peace, I think of humility. God humbled himself to come to earth as a tiny baby, powerless. We too must see ourselves and others as children of God, each one equal in the Father's eyes. It is in humility that peace finds its beginning. Let us remember this week that God loves each and

every one of us and asks us to love one another, peacefully.

MUSICAL NOTES

You will certainly have noticed that I didn't sing a couple weeks ago at Mass. Mother Nature decided to sock me heartily with a sinus issue causing inflammation and then, laryngitis. It has been a long while since I've so totally lost my voice and I don't like it one bit. Try to communicate with no voice......try to talk on the phone......to sing....to put in your order at the drive-thru. You get "what, pardon me, what did you say....I cannot hear you" which makes it worse because you're ailing and now you have to repeat everything when you shouldn't be talking at all. I especially want to thank my choir members for having my back and for the impromptu cantoring of Bill Burr and Janet Seefried, who stepped up to help, without me even asking. I also want you all to know that the choir has been absolutely delightful to work with and everyone is very eager to give St. Jane Frances parish the best music possible. I don't think a more enthusiastic group exists. I'm also looking forward to creating an Angels and Inspiration Concert with our own musicians in 2019, including

something special for Lent or Good Friday.

While I'm at it and discussing that amazing human instrument known as The Voice, please do take a moment and think about what a precious gift it is. You know the old saying 'you don't know what you've got 'til it's gone'? No one realizes it more than me, when I cannot speak nor sing. I frequently get calls to do Masses at many other churches and from people whose weddings or funerals or special Masses I've done throughout the years for their family members. On the rare occasion my voice is on hiatus, it breaks my heart to tell people that I simply cannot sing. The vocal mechanism can be very fragile and singers always have an innate fear of damaging it. That's why I try desperately to take care of my pipes....and you should too. Some tips:

DO: stay hydrated (8-10 glasses of water daily or drink tea), get proper rest, including vocal rest; wash your hands constantly to avoid germs and getting sick; keep your home's humidity balanced; use a microphone when possible if addressing large groups in a big space; speak or sing only in a comfortable range; relax your upper body to reduce physical tension; avoid stress; keep your jaw open and relaxed; watch out for GERD (acid reflux) by avoiding spicy and fatty foods, large meals, or overeating - especially 4 hours before going to bed or lying down.

DO NOT: yell, whisper or strain your voice; constantly clear your throat (sip water instead); talk or shout above high noise levels; smoke anything; expose your voice to dusty, polluted, smoky, or dry environments; have long phone conversations; ignore prolonged hoarseness of over 2 weeks (see an ENT); talk or sing when you have an upper respiratory infection, cold, or flu; consume anything that dries you out such as caffeine, alcohol, medications like antihistamines, decongestants, diuretics, or cold/allergy remedies; avoid menthol cough drops (surprise!!) and instead use lemon drops or other fruit flavored cough lozenges.



Peace be with You! What does this mean to you? Is it just something that is said to sate a desire to fit in at Mass, or do you mean it when you say it? What do you mean when you say it? According to Merriam-Webster.com, "Peace" is defined:

- 1. a state of tranquility or quiet
 - 2. freedom from disquieting or oppressive thoughts or emotions
 - 3. harmony in personal relations

Is this what you are thinking when you wish your neighbor, "Peace be with you."? Are you thinking this when the celebrant says, "Peace be with you!" and we respond, "And with your spirit!" How many people in daily life do we wish peace upon?

The words that we use can (and do) hold weight. When we wish people Peace, we should mean it. When we really think about it, and picture the other individual really being granted Peace, our simple act becomes a prayer in it's own right, and it can really make the difference in someone's life!

In the first reading from this week, we heard the prophet Baruch tell us to:

"take off your robe of mourning and misery; put on the splendor of glory from God forever "

This means all of those things that we say and do, that keep us separated from the perfection of God's Love. We can mourn, get angry, feel jealous, envy, etc. These are all natural feelings because of our human nature. However if we tend to "suffer" with these or allow these feelings to rule our lives and become "gods" of our lives in themselves, that is when these feelings become sinful. It is at this time that we are called to "take off those robes" and to "put on the splendor of glory from God". We can work at re-focusing ourselves towards God, when we understand that to truly accept Jesus (God) into our lives means that we will encounter everyone that accepts Him in that perfection of Heavenly existence.

When we see each other (everyone around us, whether they are Christian, Muslim, Buddhist, Atheist, etc.) as true Children of God, it becomes a whole different ballgame, and we will begin to behave like Jesus. We will respect others, not "just because" we want to be respected, but because it is the right thing to do. When we really put on the splendor of glory from God, people will want to know what it is that we see, and what it is that makes us the way that we are. When we can truthfully say, that it is not "us" but God in each of us, we will begin to live our lives more fully.

When John the Baptist had the attention of the whole of Judea, and he had his own disciples (students) who were following and learning from him, the people were thinking of him as possibly being the Messiah. John will set them straight and present to them the Truth, Jesus the real Messiah. Have you heard the voice in the desert? Have you been down and heard God speaking to you? Have you listened for the whisper in the middle of the storm?

As I finish rambling this week, I pray that each and every one of us experience a chance to listen for and accept the Peace that only God can give us this Advent. May each of us hear that quiet whisper, meant just for us, and act upon it, so that we may pass some Peace of God onto our neighbors. Peace be with you!
