Our focus in week three of Advent is JOY. Here is a quote from Pope Francis that sums up the theme of this week:

"The joy of the Gospel fills the hearts and lives of all who encounter Jesus. Those who accept His offer of salvation are set free from sin, sorrow, inner emptiness and loneliness. With Christ, joy is constantly born anew."

It can be challenging to keep the joy of the Gospel when challenges surround us. Knowing that Jesus is with us always, let us strive to overcome challenges with joy, looking always for the good.

One great source of joy during this season at St. Jane Frances has been the renewal of the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) and the three seekers who have joined us through the Rite of Welcoming and Acceptance on December 2<sup>nd</sup>. You will see us each week at the 9:00am Mass. As they were preparing for

the Rite of Welcoming, I asked them, "what do you ask of God and his Church?" Their answers were powerful and very easily could have been given by any of us.

"I want to know God better, getting stronger in my walk with Him. And I want to surround myself with a community that supports my growth with Him."

"Asking God to provide guidance in life, strength through difficult times and a purpose. Asking from our church to be a supportive community and to pray for me to have a deeper connection with God."

"I would like God to help me endure the challenges that life has brought upon me. I believe that the Catholic faith will aid me in my quest to get to heaven."

In a recent homily by Archbishop Allen H. Vigneron, he stated "serving the Gospel is sharing the Gospel" ...he used the analogy of a Hershey bar...With the Hershey bar, the more you give away, the less you have; but with the Gospel, the more you share the more you give witness.

In this spirit of Advent, are you sharing the Gospel? Are you being a witness? Where are you willing to share the Gospel? With your family, friends, the person in the line at the store? How do you share the Gospel? It can be as simple as a "God Bless You," or "Have a Blessed Day" or so much more...

Each year I write my Christmas letter (yeah I'm one of 'those")...it started off as a way to update friends and family that I didn't see often, and now has become an expectation! I actually get Christmas cards, that say "looking forward to your letter!"...it's an expectation, it's a sharing of my life. Is it easy? Not always, and often I think why did I ever start doing this and I procrastinate and struggle with writing the letter, but when I get started, it tends to flow easily. This year, the letter will be themed "God's Blessings"....a simple way to share God's Gospel, how God has been present in my life; how he has shown his love to me and my family. How is God present in your life? How will you share his love with others?

Another way of sharing the gospel is the "Kerygma". According to Archbishop Allen H. Vigneron in Unleash the Gospel, "The 'Kerygma' is the New Testament word for the simple, radical, countercultural and joyful message of the Gospel—that initial ardent proclamation by which a person is one day overwhelmed and brought to the decision to entrust himself to Jesus Christ by faith."

### THE KERYGMA EXPLAINED:

God loves you personally and has a plan for your life.

• God created us out of love—we are a free creation of his goodness. The original plan was perfect happiness with Him.

### Sin separates you from God.

Man said no to this plan. He rebelled against God by being deceived by the Evil One. When sin entered the world, it separated humanity from God. Redemption was necessary in order to make eternal life with God possible.

Jesus died on the cross to atone for your sins. This makes heaven possible for you.

However, God did not leave us in sin, and He responded to our infidelity with His fidelity. Christmas is God sending His Son to offer His life for our sins and to rob sin and death of its power. Jesus is the answer to sin and all of its effects.

### Jesus is inviting you to accept His gift of salvation.

♦ Through Baptism, we share in His victory over sin. We share in His identity (because He took on our flesh and was not ashamed to be called our brother). He gives us the power to live as His disciples; to be free!

### Do you want to accept that gift and follow Him as a disciple?

♦ Being Jesus' disciple changes our identity. We are claimed by God and are then co-heirs with Christ of eternal, perfect, almost-incomprehensible joy in heaven.

In reflecting on the Kerygma, we need to remind ourselves and share with others of the life-changing call of Jesus. How have you encountered Christ and how has it changed you? Why do you follow Christ? Have you accepted His gift of salvation? Do you follow Him as a disciple? What does this mean in your life? Can you share with others? As we approach Christmas, Advent gives us the time to reflect on the true meaning of Christmas and the greatest gift of all. Take the time to reflect and open yourself to His love...



## <u>QUESTIONS TO ASK YOURSELF NEXT WEEK,</u> IN PREPARATION FOR MASS:

- What is it like when your favorite relative or friend visits you?
- ♦ Have you helped prepare for visitors? What visitor are we getting ready for at Christmastime?

Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel Shall come to thee, O Israel.

The chorus to the Christmas Carol, *O Come, O Come Emmanuel*, really embodies what this week in the Liturgical year could/should be. We know that historically, the man Jesus was born on Earth around 2,000 years or so ago. He told and taught many things, performed healings, converted non-believers to the ways of God, and kept the focus on God. Each act, each miracle, leading not to Himself but to God the Father.

In the time before widespread electricity, once the sun went down, humanity relied on firelight, candlelight and oil lamps burning to be able to see. Even when I am camping (heaven forbid if I forget my lantern or flashlight) I am so accustomed to having a quick, portable source of light, that these really long nights really affect me (and all of us) quite differently. We have a knowledge of science, and "how things work", so we know what happens during this time of year and how nature reacts by shedding leaves and sending plants into dormancy. Now imagine that you lived without this scientific knowledge, you lived without electricity. As the year became colder and the nights got longer, we can just begin to imagine a sense of helplessness (if not hopelessness) as the world appeared to die away.

What does this have to do with rejoicing? In our current understanding of science, we know that during this week, we will experience the Winter Solstice, the longest night of the year, and slowly the length of daylight will increase, as we make the annual journey around the sun and make it to the point where the Earth is being contacted by sunlight equally (once again) in the northern and southern hemispheres. The people of old, would rejoice because the Earth was coming alive once again. The Hebrews of old were told to rejoice because the Lord had promised them a way out of slavery, and God keeps His promises.

We rejoice, because even though each of us separate ourselves from the perfection that is God, He promised to send His only Son. Jesus came to save us all once (and for ALL) from sin. Taking all of our misdeeds and washing them from us. Jesus promised to send an Advocate to us to help us, and He sent the Holy Spirit, the third part of the Trinity to continually assist and guide us. The Spirit, the Breath of God, to give us gifts that we receive first in Baptism, and sealed again with them in the Sacrament of Confirmation. God keeps His promises.

We Rejoice in the fact that God loves us, God is with us, and God has shown us mercy, and will gather the many together once again. All we have to do is believe, ask forgiveness, and live for Him. Show **Joy** this season, show the world the **Joy** that you have within you, because you know God and His Promises. Be **Joy** to those in the world who have yet to meet Jesus; be Jesus to them, for them. Show them how to tell the story of Jesus, of God. Help them, to be able to show and be the **Joy** of Jesus, this season. It is not on the Archbishop alone, nor Fr. Tony, or his staff, but upon each and every one of us to shine our strengths, to fill in (not complain about) the areas that others are weaker in, and to be community to, with and for one another. When "I" rejoice, it is small, but when we all rejoice, the **Joy** of God goes everywhere! Happy Rejoicing!






### **EUCHRE NIGHT: SUPER BOWL PARTY!**
