Rejoice always. Pray without ceasing. In all circumstances give thanks, for this is the will of God for you in Christ Jesus. – 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18

Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to thee, O Israel!

We enter into our third week of Advent. The winter solstice draws nearer, and soon, very soon, our days will begin to lengthen, and our nights will get shorter. This third week of Advent reminds me of that commercial on TV with the camel, wandering through the office saying, "Mike, Mike, Mike. Guess what day it is... HUMP DAY!" Sometimes this week is almost like that "hump day" of our preparation time. We are just about half way to the season of celebrating the birth of Christ, this year a little closer than others. We are called rejoice!

Traditionally known as Gaudete Sunday, this imperative verb essentially means, "Hey, all of you, rejoice!" We've moved our way through a week of Hope, a week of Peace and now enter into this week to Rejoice! Rejoice in the "Good News", evangelion (Grk), the "Gospel"; that soon we celebrate the life of the Anointed One (The Christ) who saves us from the captivity of sin. Gone is the eternal death or separation from God. Through the infant child, we recognize our own new birth into the potential Eternal Life. That birth transforms into the revealed knowledge that we have been blessed through the sacrifice of the man Jesus, the only begotten Son of God. It is God's merciful embrace and envelopment of us, despite our wrongdoings. All we have to do is acknowledge this.

In our acknowledgement, we are called to assent wholly to this belief and act upon it. We are called to repent, seek forgiveness, atone for our wrongdoings and live a life better than we have in the past. We fight the constant struggle against the world that wants us to live for ourselves and do what is best for "me". When we strive for what is best for each other, we love the moments of our neighbors' success. We work together, live for one another, and rejoice in all things.


As we get over this "half-way" point in our preparation, we should begin to think, "Am I where I should be? Am I prepared, or at least where I need to be in my preparations, to welcome Jesus into my life? Where can I make a "straighter" path so that I can help my neighbor without too much difficulty?

Rejoice! The birthday of Jesus is almost here! December 25th marks the beginning of the 12 day celebration of Christmas. Are you ready in your home and your heart? Is there room for Jesus in our celebration, or are we tied too much to the way that the world wants us to act?

Rejoice! "God with us" shall come to us, O "one who wrestles with God".

When we truly look at the words, do those words begin to take on a new meaning? Can we now allow God to take hold in our lives, or will we wrestle with Him, thinking that we know better?

Rejoice! The Christ Child is almost here! Are we prepared? See you on Christmas!


