

"...for nothing will be impossible for God." Luke 1:37

As we celebrate the last day of Advent today, our preparations for the coming of Jesus must be completed quickly. Many of us will celebrate Christmas in the next 24 hours. Although the last week of Advent is brief, the message is profound.

We hear today of Mary's great "Yes" to God. We often talk of Mary's incredible courage and obedience when we hear today's Gospel. Mary was, indeed, courageous and obedient. I think of Mary also as a very trusting and patient woman. As a mother myself, I remember the time spent waiting for the arrival of my children. I was impatient near the end of the pregnancies. I couldn't wait to see my child, to see what he or she looked like, to see what God had accomplished. I couldn't wait to begin the actual parenting.

I imagine Mary felt many of these same things, yet far more was at stake. How must Mary have felt knowing she was carrying not an ordinary child, but a child, "to be called holy, the Son of God" She had no idea what to expect, no books, no doctors, no internet, and no one to give her the gift of their wisdom and experience on how to raise the Son of God. But Mary had her steadfast love and trust of God. She listened to the angel. She opened herself up to God's plan from the beginning. Patience likely came of that listening and opening. On top of all that, she had the power of the Holy Spirit!

When the Holy Spirit is allowed to enter into our hearts, nothing is impossible. Mary knew that. Her relationship with God made it possible for her to say yes to an unimaginable future, to trust that God would guide her as she waited for Jesus to be born and to show her the way as she and Joseph did the work of raising him.

In this year of the shortest Advent season possible, perhaps we can be reminded that God's time is different from our time. Can we echo Mary's "yes" by being patient, obedient and trusting as God works in our lives? Can we take on the challenges and blessings of this life knowing that we are not on our own and that nothing is impossible for God?



Advent comes to a close this afternoon with the shortest fourth week of Advent that is possible...an approximately 16 hour (though technically sundown to sundown so 24 hour) compression of a week.

The "Coming Wind" is upon us. Are you ready? The Light is not yet here, but very soon will be. The Little Lamb, the Prince of Peace - all things we look forward to! Since we need to live in the present reality, I realize that "if" people read this, it will most likely be later, after their celebrations, maybe Tuesday or during the week. How do we (did we) spend that last 24 hour "week" of preparation? Extra time in prayer or rushing around to get that final gift? Thanking God for the life that He has given us or shouting at the person doing 20 MPH in a 45 MPH zone? Being attentive at Mass, in prayer and thanksgiving, or thinking about the work at home that is needed to get ready for the hordes that will soon be descending on the clean house?

I am no angel, and I do not know yet what I will have done during this 24 hour period of time, but all that I can Hope, in Peace and in Joyful Praise to God, is that I remember my Love for my fellow man (see how I worked all the week's of Advent themes in there?). I remember that Jesus is in everyone and everyone has Christ within them. Will I slip? I'm human, I know that I will goof up, but that is why Christ came to this world, some 2000 or so years ago, for me, and for all of us who make mistakes. Let us remember, as St. Paul wrote to the Romans in our second reading, "To him who can strengthen you...be glory forever and ever. Amen." (cf. Rom 16:25, 27). God who strengthens us has been merciful to us and has promised mercy to us, praise to The Merciful God!

As we finish this season, let us do our best to emulate that not-so-simple, "Yes" of Mary. May each of us remember God's will in our lives, and challenge ourselves to be more like Mary. Even in times of fear, God is with us; times of new experiences, God is with us; good times as well as the bad; when we remember to praise Him but even more so when we forget, God is with us. Have I said, "yes," to God's call in my life? How do I show that "yes" to those I come into contact with each day? How can I be the best example I can be to others, AND challenge myself to be better?

We may not see an angel, or "hear" a voice speaking to us, but we should find time (hopefully before the mad rush) to be guiet, to listen, to laugh at ourselves and the things that feel important now, in the moment. We should realize that God knows what is best for us, and will always put us on the right path, and prepare us for what is to come. Hope for the best, be at Peace knowing that God gives us what we need, Rejoice with Joy that we can one day join God in perfection, and Love your neighbor so that we may show our status as disciples of Christ to the world!



Because of this year's Christmas schedule, we understand that the 4th Sunday of Advent collection and Christmas collection are mere hours apart. 
