

What's a relic? It's one of those weirdly Catholic things. Relics include the physical remains of a saint as well as other objects which have been "sanctified" by being touched to his/her body. It's a memorial of the Saint (or in this case, Blessed).



After the Beatification of Fr. Solanus, Archbishop Vigneron was given by the Capuchins a relic of Fr. Solanus' first metacarpal of his right hand. It was with this hand that Fr. Solanus opened the doors of the monastery to those coming to encounter Christ.





This week we are celebrating the Feast of the Holy Family. I think of family and my family experience and how we interact, the dynamics, the highs, the lows and how we are there for each other, but I realize that some families aren't like others. Some families aren't comprised of blood relatives, but of a community of people that share common interests. Sometimes your "family" can be full of people from school, work or even church. Family can "mean" different things to different people, and every family experiences its own ups and downs, but family sticks together.

Joseph, the adoptive father of Jesus, took Jesus and His mother Mary into his house, as his family. I am sure that he had many questions, and do you think that the questions were answered with the visitation of the angel (Mt 1:20)? I tend to feel that this probably raised even more questions in the mind of this simple man! However, Joseph took Mary in and adopted and raised Jesus as his own son. Even the Holy Family started out "different" than our understanding of a "normal" family.

On Tuesday mornings, since I was very young, a few family members from my mom's side of the family, began meeting for breakfast. For a time we would head over to the mall, or go to garage sales during the summer months, once we had finished eating. It was a tradition that our family has spent the last 40 odd years developing. People would get out of school and join, work hours would change and different people would join the group, and have to leave the group; people would retire and begin coming in, and family and friends would pass away, leaving a void, but "Tuesday breakfast" would continue on.

For me, this is the idea of family. No matter the kind of day, no matter if you want to talk, or just "be" in the company of others, more often than not, you'd be able to find at least one member of family at the restaurant. The places have changed over the years, but we've found "homes" in the restaurants that we have visited. We start to think of the owners, and the employees of the restaurants as members of the family. Stories are shared, jokes are told, and we share experiences even with the "strangers" from the restaurant.

In this Christmas season, is Jesus still present in your life? Are you still seeking ways of preparing your life for Him? Jesus IS a member of your family! How do you welcome Him into your gatherings? Do you welcome Him into your gatherings, or is Jesus left in the corner?

I am always fascinated with the immensity of God's Love! Abba Father, Daddy, is one who looks out for me (us), is there to comfort me (us) when I'm (we're) sad or down. He knows when I (we) need to find answers to questions on our own. He is there, with arms open wide, to welcome me (us) back, even when I (we) goof up things really bad.

As we enter into a new calendar year, and we make resolutions, maybe we should take to heart, the old saying "What Would Jesus Do?" If we really tried to live our lives as Jesus did, and we treated everyone that we come across as family (maybe without the hugging—unless everyone is comfortable with it), wouldn't we be in a much nicer place?

I pray everyone experiences Jesus' Love this year in a different profound way, and that your Christmas continues until the Season is over! MERRY CHRISTMAS!

# **HAPPY NEW YEAR from Fr. Page**

I'm sorry I missed the deadline for copy for the Christmas issue of the paper, so I also hope that your Christmas celebrations in your homes were blessed by the love and hope promised by the birth of our Savior.

It's been some time, now, since I wrote to those of you in the family of St. Jane who may remember me and wonder how I am doing.

I am still seeing a retinal specialist about every eight weeks to control the Macular Degeneration in my left eye. That's better than the every four weeks I started with! Each time I see him, he injects my eye with a chemical that stops the bleeding in the veins affecting the central vision in my left eye. I still retain peripheral vision in my right eye. So with the combination of 20/20 vision in my left eye and peripheral vision in my right eye, I have a full range of vision.

Thus far, these injections and all of your prayers have been effective. I still retain sufficient vision to say my daily prayers, drive to the store for necessary groceries, and maintain a relatively self-sufficient life for me and my sister. For this I am grateful to God and to you for your continued prayers.

Other than that, with God's continued oversight and support I'm in reasonably good health at this stage of my life.

I extend to all of you my two favorite blessings from scripture:

"Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ." (Eph. 1:2)

The Lord bless you and keep you!

The Lord let his face shine upon you, and be gracious to you! The Lord look upon you kindly & give you peace! (Num. 6:24-26)
