Jørry Slowinski øxt. 102 Pastor In the final weeks leading up to ordination to the priesthood, the seminary, as kind of a last lecture series, brought in various priests of the Archdiocese to speak to those soon to be ordained about the joys, heartbreaks, challenges and triumphs in their priesthood. One of the priests who spoke to us in those final weeks before ordination to the priesthood was Fr. Cliff Ruskowski. One question Cliff was asked was "do you still find

yourself doing battle with the devil?" He replied: "No, I use to when I was younger, but now, as I find myself in the twilight of my priesthood and approaching retirement, I have grown old and tired and the devil has grown old and tired with me. I leave him alone and he leaves me alone." "So your life is easier?" one of my classmates asked. "Oh no, it's actually much worse, now I wrestle with God."

There is a lot contained in that remark – "I wrestle with God." Among other things, it suggests the struggles later in life can be very different than what we struggle with earlier on. In the normal pattern of human development, we spend the first half of our lives struggling with sensuality, greed and sexuality. The last half of our lives we struggle with anger and forgiveness – and that anger is often, however unconsciously, focused on God. In the end, our real struggle is with God.

Wrestling with God invites us to take part in a certain type of prayer. Prayer isn't meant to be a simple acquiescence to God's will. It's meant to be acquiescence, yes, but a mature acquiescence, which only comes to an end after a long and difficult struggle.

We see this in the prayer of great figures in scripture: Abraham, Moses, Jesus and the Apostles. Abraham wrestles and argues with God and, initially, talks God out of destroying Sodom. Moses, at first resists God's call. Moses is a criminal who is wanted by the Egyptians. He also suffers from a speech impediment. The Apostles excuse themselves for a long time before they are willing to put their lives on the line to proclaim the Gospel. Even Jesus himself, in the Garden of Gethsemane, begs His Father for a reprieve from death. None of the aforementioned Biblical Giants find it easy to say "Thy will be done", rather, they vigorously protest and pray instead "Thy will be changed!"

Struggling with God's will and offering resistance to what we are called to do can be a bad thing, but it can also be a mature form of prayer. The Book of Genesis describes an incident where Jacob wrestled with what he thought was an angel, for an entire night, and in the morning, it turned out that the angel was God. This is a perfect icon for prayer. A human being scuffling and wrestling with God in the dust of the earth! This is a perfect metaphor which personifies our human struggle.

We would do well to integrate this concept of wrestling with God into our prayer and faith life. To just simplify our struggles and say "Guess I just need to offer it up and make the best of it" is too simplistic. Humans don't bend easily. The heart has complexities which need to be respected, even as we try to rein in our possessive longings. God, who fashioned us in His spirit and likeness, understands this and is more than up to the task of wrestling with our resistance.

Many of the classical mystics of the early Church spoke and wrote about being "bold with God". This boldness, they suggest, comes not at the beginning of the spiritual journey, but more towards the end, when, after a long period of intimacy with God, we are "bold" enough to speak our minds, just as, after

### Celebrating the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord during the Jubilee Year of Mercy

This weekend we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord and I can't help but think of the connection between the Sacrament of Baptism and the spirit of the Jubilee Year of Mercy that we are currently observing.

I was doing a bit of research and stumbled upon the following article written by the Most Reverend Michael J. Sheridan, Bishop of the Diocese of Colorado Springs. Bishop Sheridan was reflecting on opening the Holy Doors of a Jubilee Church and how it opens on to three important furnishings found in every church: the baptismal font, the confessional, and the altar - each one of these having a particular significance in the Holy Year:

"The mercy of God touches us first at the time of our baptism. When water is poured over us we die and rise with Christ, setting aside sin and embracing the Gospel of Jesus. Clothed in a white garment, the newly baptized puts on Christ. The Jubilee Year is a time to recall our baptismal dignity. We are sons and daughters of God, brothers and sisters of Jesus. We have been reborn from above. Parents, recall the promises you made on behalf of your children when you presented them for baptism and renew your intention to form them in the faith of the Church.

Just beyond the baptismal font is the confessional. The Sacrament of Reconciliation, called by the Fathers of the Church 'the second baptism', is the ever-present gift of divine mercy. Scripture tells us that the mercy of God is boundless. Whatever the frequency or seriousness of our sins, God seeks out the sinner just as the Good Shepherd leaves everything to find the lost sheep. God loves us with all His being. Put aside whatever fear or dread that keeps

you from experiencing the forgiveness of confession, because, as Pope Frances has said, 'fear and dread do not befit a man or a woman who is loved'.

And then there is the altar of the Eucharistic, sacrifice, the centerpiece of every Church. And the Eucharist is the centerpiece of the Church's sacramental life, the culminating point of the mercy received in the Sacrament of Reconciliation by means of participation, in the Body and Blood of Christ. St. John Paul II reminded us of the close relationship between the sacraments of Penance and the Eucharist in his encyclical letter **Ecclesia de Eucharists (#37)**: "Because the Eucharist makes present the redeeming sacrifice of the Cross, perpetuating it sacramentally, it naturally gives rise to a continuous need for conversion for a personal response to the appeal made by St. Paul to the Christians of Corinth: 'We beseech you on behalf of Christ be reconciled to God' (2 Cor 5:20).

Turning again to the words of Pope Francis: 'We constantly need to contemplate the mystery of mercy. It is a wellspring of joy, serentity, and peace. Our salvation depends on it'.




