A special thank-you goes out to Tom Bratke for the years of service he volunteered leading the funeral ministry team here at St. Jane Frances. Tom concluded that it was time to pass the torch on to another parishioner to serve as his successor. We wish Tom well and are grateful for his years of service.

In the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, we find Jesus praying when he is joyfilled, when he is in agony, when others are around him and when he is alone at night, withdrawn from all human contact.

His disciples sense that Jesus' real depth and power are drawn from prayer. They know that what makes him so special, so unlike any other religious figure is that he is linked to some power outside of this world. And they want this power for themselves. That is why they approach Jesus and ask him: "Lord teach us to pray!"

It can be easy to misunderstand what constituted their attraction to prayer and what they were asking for when they ask Jesus to teach them to pray. They sensed that what Jesus drew from the depth of his prayer was not, first of all, his power to do miracles or silence his enemies with some kind of superior intelligence. What impressed them and what they wanted too for their own lives was the depth and graciousness of his soul.

The power they admired and wanted was Jesus' ability to love and forgive his enemies rather than embarrass and crush them. What they wanted was Jesus' power to transform a room, not by some miraculous deed, but by a disarming innocence and vulnerability that, like a baby's presence, has everyone caringly guarding his or her own language and behavior. What they wanted was his power to renounce life in self-sacrifice, even while retaining the enviable capacity to enjoy the simple pleasures of life without guilt. What they wanted was Jesus' power to be big-hearted, to love beyond just his own inner circle of friends and family, to care for both poor and rich alike, to live a life of joy, charity, peace and patience despite everything in life that works against these virtues. What they wanted was Jesus' depth and graciousness of soul.

Jesus' disciples recognized that this power did not come from within himself, but from a source outside of him. They saw that he connected to a deep source through prayer, through constantly lifting to God what was on his mind and in his heart. They saw it and they wanted that depth-connection too, for themselves. So they asked Jesus to teach them how to pray.

Ultimately we too want Jesus' depth and graciousness in our own lives. Like Jesus' disciples, we also know that we can only attain this through prayer, through accessing a power that lies both inside the depth of our soul as well as in a place beyond our soul. We too know that the route to that depth lies in journeying inward, in silence, through the pain and the quiet, the chaos and the peace. This, however, can only happen when we still ourselves to pray.

In our more reflective moments, and in our more desperate moments, we feel the need to go to that deep place to pray. But, given our lack of patience, we struggle to get there. We don't know how to pray or how to sustain ourselves in prayer. In this respect, we are in good company with Jesus' disciples. And so a good beginning is to recognize what we need and where it is found. We need to begin with a plea: Lord, teach us to pray!

Ministry of the Assembly

A few years ago as we were preparing for a Ministry Fair here at the parish, I came across a booklet entitled "Ministry of the Assembly" and it intrigued me. How often, if ever, do those who gather in the pews, without a specific liturgical ministry think that their attendance and participation at Mass is considered ministry? I wondered if we gathered with the thought that each person's presence at Mass is critical to the celebration, would we be more fully present to each other and to our corporate prayer?

The readings from this weekend's liturgies brought these thoughts back to me. In the first reading we have an assembly who has opened their hearts to hear the word of God and its teaching - they are so moved by the truths they hear that they are moved to tears. They were compelled to go out and rejoice in the Lord. How often do we find ourselves moved deeply by the actions, tears of others? We can affect those we worship with through our own actions. In the second reading we are presented with St. Paul's image of the community of believers as a "body" made up of "many parts," all of which are necessary. The ministry of the assembly makes visible the Church, the Body of Christ, by the very fact that we gather together as one body. *"The celebration of Mass is a corporate act, an act of the whole assembly gathered for worship. All the particular ministries serve this corporate function (GIRM 27). The liturgy is designed to bring about in all those who make up the worshiping assembly a participation of the faithful both in body and mind, a participation burning with faith, hope, and charity (18). Through their actions, the entire assembly of the faithful joins itself to Christ in acknowledging the great things that God has done and in offering the sacrifice (78)." With this view in mind, we can sense that indeed, we do have a ministry in our very presence at the liturgy!!

The Sacrament of Reconciliation: Revisited

February 15th, 22nd, 29th; 7:00pm - 8:30pm

If you have not participated in the sacrament of Reconciliation for a long time or do so with great reluctance, please know that you are not alone! In 2008, the Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate (CARA) at Georgetown University conducted a study entitled, *Sacraments Today: Belief and Practice among U.S. Catholics.* Regarding Reconciliation, the basic finding was that 75% of Catholics "report that they never participate in the sacrament of Reconciliation or that they do so less than once a year."(57)

In this great **Jubilee Year of Mercy**, I invite you to take part in this series during which we can explore and address reasons and concerns that keep you from celebrating this sacrament which is filled with grace, even as it might instill fear or discomfort in you. This is an opportunity to learn more about Reconciliation; there will be no judging you nor pressuring you.

1) You Are Not Alone:

I Don't Go to Confession Because...

This evening (February 15th) explores the reasons people give for not participating in the sacrament. Are these feelings valid? What is our understanding of the sacrament? What is truth about the sacrament: the theology, the affects of sin, forgiveness, mercy, grace?

2) So What Now?

This evening (February 22nd) explores what might still hold you back from the sacrament, review of the healing grace of the sacrament, examination of conscience, and practical matters of celebrating the sacrament.

3) What I See:

From My Side of the Confessional...

This evening (February 29th) explores the priest's experience in hearing people's confession. This does not mean a discussion of the sins that are confessed, but rather the humility, healing, joy, consolation, hope, grace and re-encounter with Christ that the priest witnesses as the confessor. After a brief power point presentation, Fr. Jerry Slowinski, pastor of St. Jane Frances de Chantal Parish, will share his personal reflections of his role as confessor.

It is the hope that you will leave this series open to the Spirit moving you towards the celebration of the Sacrament of Penance/Reconciliation and to experience the powerful love and compassion of Jesus. Register by contacting the parish office.


