Recently, new trailers for the next Star Trek movie hit the movie screens in anticipation of the release of this film in July of this year. The movie, titled, *Star Trek Beyond* is scheduled to be released to coincide with the 50th anniversary of the debut of Star Trek which premiered on NBC in 1966. This weekend, however, the Catholic Church celebrates an original Star Trek that took place over 2000 years ago, well before the Star Trek TV and movie franchise ever came into existence. This is because this weekend we

celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany, that event where three wise men go searching for the new-born-Christchild relying only on the guidance of a star.

There is really very little we know about these three men. We hear that the Magi came from the east bearing gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. Tradition, not the Bible, tells us that their names were Gaspar, Balthazar and Melchior. Folklore holds that they came from Persia (present day Iran) and were members of a priestly class of people with some degree of wealth.

So what is so important about this mysterious encounter between the Magi and the Christ-child? Why did the author of the Gospel of Matthew feel it was so important to go into such detail about the Magi?

To begin with, the visit of the Magi is described as an "epiphany". The use of this particular word is significant. An "epiphany" is defined as "a moment of sudden revelation or insight". That revelation or insight is grounded in the realization that Christ, the Messiah, who God's Chosen People had been anticipating for centuries, had come into the world as savior for *all peoples*. The Christ-child, through the grace of the Holy Spirit, discloses that God's intent is not just to save His Chosen People, but to save both Jew and Gentile alike. The broadening of salvation to the gentiles was a divine twist to the messianic expectations of Israel and this is certainly good news for all of us who are not of Jewish descent.

It is remarkable that the Magi would have spent weeks, perhaps even months, in their own personal star trek that led them to a foreign land. The faith of the Magi, to follow the gentle light of a mysterious star to humble surroundings in Bethlehem, to endure the hardship of ancient travel, to trust on a cloudy night when the light of the star was obscured, testifies to their total reliance on God these men must have had in their respective hearts and souls.

Contrast this to the reaction of King Herod who was deeply troubled, afraid and paranoid. Herod viewed the Christ-child as a threat to his own power, security and personal gratification. While the Magi were seeking the Christ-child to pay Him homage, Herod began plotting to find the Christ-child to murder Him. Herod's sin serves to remind us that those in darkness do not seek out Christ. They do not rejoice in His coming.

There is a combination of both the Magi and Herod in each of us. We seek to follow Christ; to be the light of Christ to others. We also have tendencies to sin.

On this Feast of the Epiphany, we are reminded to actively seek out Christ and not to fall into the darkness of sin. The Magi offered to the Christ-child: 1) Gold – a gift fit for a king. 2) Frankincense (incense) – a reminder that our prayers rise to God like incense. And 3) Myrrh – this was used, in place of a crown, to anoint each new king of Israel and was also used to preserve the remains of a body touched by death. We each have been gifted by God and, on this Feast of the Epiphany, are reminded to use those gifts in a manner which will give *Glory to God in the Highest!*

Epiphany House Blessing

The blessing of the home is a popular Epiphany custom. Using chalk, many households mark their entrance door with the current year and with the inscription CMB, the initials of Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar, the traditional names of the three wise men. The inscription also stands for the Latin phrase *Christus Mansionem Benedicat*, which means "Christ, bless this home."

Read the story of Zacchaeus (Luke 19:1-9) from your Bible.

Using chalk (have the chalk blessed if possible), write above the door way: 20 + C + M + B + 16

Prayer: Peace be to this house and all who live here. During these days of the Christmas season, we keep this feast of Epiphany. Through the guidance of a star, the coming of Jesus was made known to the Gentiles. We celebrate Christ made known to the Gentiles. We celebrate Christ made known to the Magi, to John in the River Jordan, and to the disciples at the wedding at Cana.

Today, Christ is made known to us! Today this home is a holy place! The Magi came from the east to Bethlehem to adore the Lord. "They went into the house, and when they saw the child with His mother, Mary, they knelt down and worshipped Him. They brought out their gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh, and presented them to Him." (Matt 2:11)

We bow our heads and pray for God's blessing...

Lord our God, bless our home and all who live here. May we be filled with health, goodness of heart, gentleness, obedience to Your law, and thanksgiving to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit. Help us love and respect one another and make your presence known by the way we care for others. May this blessing remain upon this house and upon all who live here. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

The story of the Magi appears only in the Gospel of Matthew. Scripture scholars say that the visit of the Magi does not describe a historical event, but a poetic kind of story that reveals the remarkable truth. That truth is this: Jesus, born a Jew in Israel, came to save all people of the earth. The Magi, who saw God's star and followed it, symbolizes all the Gentiles, or non Jewish people of the world.

The Magi are a model for us. They were good men who went in search of God, and when they found God, the course of their whole lives changed.

We too follow God's star, the inner stirrings in our hearts in search of Jesus. We travel through the epiphanies of all our days, Wherein He reveals Himself to us in the sacraments, in prayer, in good people, and in our minds and hearts. Like the Magi we are profoundly changed by these experiences of God.

We, the Body of Christ on earth, are called to celebrate the Epiphany everyday by showing forth God's love and presence.

On this feast, celebrate with your family God's love for all people everywhere by sharing a special dessert together.







Reflection: Do you take your dreams seriously? Some of us try to figure out the strange things that we see in our dreams, and others just dismiss them. Imagine if the three Magi in today's Gospel chose to ignore their dream after presenting their necessary gifts to honor a king's birth. We are all given signs in our lives, but the signs aren't always as obvious as the neon signs in Las Vegas. Instead, your sign could come from a friend's advice, a situation you walk into, or something learned through prayer. God spoke to the Magi, and God speaks to us today. What made the Magi wise was that they chose to listen and trust in something deeper than common sense. You, too, have the ability to be wise for your age. The hardest part is to pay attention to both the little stuff going on around you and everything happening within. If you ask God for an answer and search diligently, then joy can come. The signs God sends your way are unique gifts created just for you!
