We are in the midst of Ordinary Time. What is Ordinary Time?

The definition of Ordinary Time is taken from the Documents on the Liturgy:

"Apart from those seasons having their own distinctive character, (eg. Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter), thirty-three or thirty-four weeks remain in the yearly

cycle that do not celebrate a specific aspect of the mystery of Christ. Rather, especially on the Sundays, they are devoted to the mystery of Christ in all its aspects. This period is known as Ordinary Time."

In our day-to-day lives, we should celebrate that God blesses us and the people with whom we share our gifts and talents. It is in our everyday lives that we see and experience God. However, with the eyes of faith, we must see the experiences of our life as God-given. We are created in the image and likeness of God, and we are called to project those experiences onto others so that they too can see God's hand in their lives.

One example I use often is the food baskets that we prepare for the needy at Christmas and Easter. It is very easy for us to give at those times of the year. The need is always in the forefront of our mind at Thanksgiving, Christmas, and Easter. However, that need is year-round, and exists even during the ordinary times of the year.

Ordinary Time is not all that ordinary. It can be a challenging season. Seasons like Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter already draw us in and point us toward a direction to celebrate a specific aspect of the life of Christ. In the season of Ordinary Time, the onus, or responsibility, is placed on us. We are challenged to see God in our daily lives and to celebrate the Word made flesh. To be disciples of the Lord is to see the Lord's presence in all aspects of our life and in those we come in contact with.

As I mentioned in my homily on the Feast of the Epiphany, we, like the Magi, must look up so we can see the stars. In this New Year, may we see what the Magi saw: namely, the Word made flesh, and how it has come to dwell among us. In this day of social media and all that it means, it is easy for us to communicate without ever making eye contact or speaking a single word. We need to look up, see our brothers and sisters, and become an active player in our society, our Church, and our community.

WORD OF GOD SUNDAY

Today we celebrate the Sunday of the Word of God, instituted in 2019 by Pope Francis.

In his letter establishing this celebration,

Pope Francis shares that "It is fitting, then, that the life of our people be constantly marked by this decisive relationship with the living word that the Lord never tires of speaking to his Bride, that she may grow in love and faithful witness" (Aperuit illis, 2).

As stated by Fr. Brian Meldrum, every story told in the Scriptures, even the most challenging, reminds us that God loves his people and will always be faithful to the covenant he has made with us. God sent us his Son, the Word Incarnate, not only to speak these words of faithful love, but also to show us the depths of faithful love by dying on the cross and rising from the dead. Every word of Scripture points to this message of love enacted in the person of Jesus Christ, who is the Word himself.

In honor of today's celebration, we thank the lectors who proclaim the Word of God and the priests and deacons who preach it. To read more about this celebration, visit usccb.org/committees/divine-worship/sunday-word-god.

THE POPE'S MONTHLY INTENTIONS

Each year, the Holy Father asks for our prayers for a specific intention each month. You are invited to answer the Holy Father's request and to join with many people worldwide in praying for this intention each month. From time to time, the Holy Father may add a second prayer intention related to current events or urgent needs, like disaster relief. The second prayer request will help mobilize prayer and action related to the urgent situation. The Holy Father has entrusted these intentions in a particular way to the Pope's Worldwide Prayer Network, an organization that works to encourage Christians to respond to the Pope's appeal and to deepen their daily prayer.

You can find more information about the Pope's Worldwide Prayer Network on their website: **popesprayerusa.net**. (The Pope's Worldwide Prayer Network will also publish any urgent prayer intentions of the Holy Father as soon as they are received from the Holy See.)

The Pope's intention for January is for True Human Fraternity. We pray for all those suffering from religious discrimination and persecution; may their own rights and dignity be recognized, which originate from being brothers and sisters in the human family.

Along with that prayer intention, I will add one that I published around this time last year:

Prayer to Overcome Indifference

All too often, Lord, we turn away from the world's many problems, which seem too big, too complex, or too far away. Forgive us our indifference.

It is easier, Lord, to see only what is around us: our lives, our homes, our challenges. Forgive us our isolation.

Help us to see with your eyes: eyes which notice one another and help us understand. Help us to dream your dream: of communities that reach out and dialogue and where diverse people creatively cooperate. Help us to be people of solidarity and action, so moved by prayer, encounter, and understanding that peace can become a reality.

Who knew that a bird could provide a lesson in spiritual nourishment?

Last week when visiting the Florida Keys, I had a few days to stay with friends at their

home on Big Pine Key. Each morning, a beautiful great white egret arrived and either perched on the back porch railing or rooftop, waited by the back door, or stood on the dock after flying in from the mangroves. Apparently, he's been

coming by for years. Sometimes he stays for most of the day, checking things out, prancing in the yard, or warding off other birds—with fascinating aerial combat—who might try to horn in on his regular "gig" and bounty. My friends knew it was the same egret because of an abnormality on the bird's foot: a bent toe. Thus came his given name: BentToe.

My friends maintain a supply of pinfish caught especially for BentToe. Every morning and evening, they invited me to hold out his feast of small fish, and he'd come only so close, never taking the food from my fingers. But I could drop it very near to my foot, and he'd warily approach, quickly pecking at it with his long beak, and then picking it up and swallowing it.

On Sunday, I went back to St. Peter the Fisherman Church, where a visiting priest offered Mass. It was

not the Pastor, Fr. "Jets," but ironically, Fr. Darren, who retired from St. Thomas the Apostle in Ann Arbor, where I've played Masses before. In his homily, he said that the reason people return to Mass week after week is because they are getting the spiritual nourishment they need by receiving the bread of life. In that moment, I thought about BentToe and realized that yes, when people (and birds!) return to where they feel comfortable, they get all they need.

In these tough times, we all crave that nourishment, both spiritually and physically. If it takes a BentToe to put that into perspective, so be it. During my time in the Florida Keys, I actually looked forward to seeing that egret and feeling his comforting presence. I couldn't help but smile at what God's creatures teach us about faith to assure us that He will provide what we require.

From our Parish Nurses: The New Year is a time for resolutions. Often, these resolutions have something to do with being healthier, eating better, and exercising more. But exercise is hard to do in the cold winter and with COVID-19 still raging. Exercising at home is always an option, but it can be pretty boring and difficult to keep up with when you are by yourself. But what if you could exercise with other people in the comfort (and warmth) of your own home?

Ascension Community Health (our Health Ministry sponsor) offers virtual exercise classes on Mondays, Tuesdays and Thursdays. These are short workouts for all levels of fitness. These classes are free and require a computer or tablet with Internet access. Registration is required, and you only need to register once for all the classes.

I'll never forget when my daughter, who is now 37, announced her wedding date several years ago. To some it was a shock, but to


me, it was exactly as expected. Her entire life, she had dreamed and spoke of a beautiful January wedding themed around snowflakes, just like in the movies, just like in a dream. So when she announced that her wedding day would be during the last week of January, it was no surprise to me at all.

The priest, however, was a little startled and felt skeptical of it all. He had known my daughter since she was an infant and had watched her grow to become strong in faith, very close to Jesus, and very loyal to God. Still, he questioned her on several occasions: "Are you sure you want to have a *January* wedding? Do you want to reconsider this winter date? It is *Michigan*, after all." She remained firm in her convictions and went along with her plans as scheduled.

The night before her big day, the snow began to fall in a very spectacular way as we filed into and out of the church for rehearsal. My daughter extended her arms out to her sides and spun in the cool air, snowflakes landing on and all around her. The next morning we awoke to beautiful sunshine as the temperatures climbed into the mid-30s: picture-perfect.

I walked proudly down the aisle with my only daughter on my arm that winter day. I can recall vividly the priest's comment to her as she arrived at the altar: "I should never have doubted you, Teresa. You knew this day would be exactly like this, and you were right."

This time of year can be cold and frigid. But even amidst the snow and ice, blessings abound: beautiful moments can be found and special memories can be shared. We just have to believe, open our eyes and hearts to them, and remain close to the creator of it all.
