Each year, in January, Catholics offer eight days of prayers for Christian Unity. Until 1958, the general idea was that those who were not Catholic would return to the Catholic Church. The Catholic Church no longer holds that idea. It was St. Pope John XXIII who, at the conclusion of the Church's Week of Prayer for

Christian Unity, made a historic announcement that changed the Catholic Church.

On January 25, 1959, St. Pope John XXIII announced an Ecumenical Council, Vatican II. His intention was that this Ecumenical Council be not only for the Catholic Church but for all of Christianity. He desired that all churches, Catholic, Protestant, and Orthodox alike, come together and overcome the divisions that have separated them for centuries.

One of the most famous quotes from St. Pope John XXIII is the statement with which he began the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. He said, "Let us begin with what unites us and not the things that divide us." In this simple yet powerful statement, the Pope challenged all those gathered to reflect upon their own baptismal call. It is our common baptism that unities us as children of Christ.

Since 1959, we have seen many ways in which Christian churches throughout the country—as well as the world—have come together to work as one in proclaiming the Gospel of Jesus Christ and promoting unity among each other.

As we celebrate the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity this January, may we reflect upon our own baptismal call and strive to be of service to the Church. God has gifted each one of us; our challenge is to be aware of our gifts and unafraid to share them with the greater community. Ut Unum Sint: "That all may be one."

We have two celebrations coming up this week:

The Presentation of the Lord: February 2nd

"We too are called to welcome Jesus who comes to meet us. To encounter him: the God of life is to be encountered every day of our lives—not now and then, but every day. To follow Jesus is not a decision taken once and for all; it is a daily choice."

-Pope Francis, Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, 2019

The Presentation of Jesus in the temple shows him to be the firstborn Son who belongs to the Lord. With Simeon and Anna, all Israel awaits its encounter with the Savior—the name given to this event in the Byzantine tradition.

Jesus is recognized as the long-expected Messiah, the "light of the nations" and the "glory of Israel," but also "a sign that is spoken against." The sword of sorrow predicted for Mary announces Christ's perfect and unique oblation on the cross that will impart the salvation of God has "prepared in the presence of all peoples" (CCC, no. 529).

Feast of Saint Blase - February 3rd

From the Book of Blessings:

Saint Blase was the bishop of Sebaste in Armenia during the fourth century. Very little is known about his life. According to various accounts he was a physician before becoming a bishop. His acclaim spread throughout the entire Church in the Middle Ages because he was reputed to have miraculously cured a little boy who nearly died because of a fishbone in his throat. From the eighth century, he has been invoked on behalf of the sick, especially those afflicted with illnesses of the throat.

Fr. Tony will extend a General Blessing of Throats at all Masses this weekend.

Sometimes it's not the best idea to watch television news or read the newspapers if you want to see uplifting information. Most of what you see or hear is about major

crimes or people being mean to one another. Selfishness, greed, cruelty, inhumanity—all these things seem to scream at us from the headlines. I wish I knew why media executives insist on putting such negative stories front and center. It helps no one. However, it is a telltale sign that God is missing from so many lives.

We'd all fall over if the newscasters' lead story was something like this: "Breaking news! Today there was not one crime committed in our broadcast area! Neighbors and enemies alike sat down together, breaking bread in peace!" If only. We can dream and hope, can't we?

But what can we actually do about this? Well, we need to be spreaders of the Good News.

Today's Gospel about the power of love is so comforting. 1 Corinthians 12:31—13:13 is one of my favorites, not only because it is so frequently used for such happy occasions as weddings, but because the message all boils down to one vital word: love. With love, you can do anything. Without it, you are lost. Whether or not you have an abundance of human love in your life, you know you can count on God's love. He is always there.

This weekend I'll be singing at a friend's wedding in Fort Myers, FL. Whenever I attend a wedding, I take great care in writing out the couple's greeting card; it will be no different with my friend's wedding.

Many years ago, I began to reflect on marriage and what it means—no, not the starry-eyed version of new love, when your partner can do no wrong, but the real version of what happens after the "I do's" are long past: where dirty socks don't find the hamper, or crusted dishes are left in the sink, or the car's gas tank reads empty, no matter how often one spouse asks the other not to leave it that way.

What advice can be given to couples that will last forever? The answer is in Corinthians. Ironically, there are so many words and phrases used to explain love. There are only three simple words that say what love is: patience and kindness.

If you are tempted to criticize or admonish someone you love or care for—and we all are—then before you do, be patient. Be kind. Ask yourself if harsh words are necessary. Will they hurt someone? Take a few moments to ponder what you are about to do—and once you do, honestly, there is no choice to make, is there?


