This time of year seems to be one for getting engaged and for planning upcoming marriages. Primarily, this article is for newly-engaged couples who are planning to be married here at St. Jane Frances de Chantal.

When contacting our parish about planning an upcoming wedding, please ask to speak to Fr. Tony. Our front desk staff does not help select available wedding dates.

That is done between me and the couple. If you have a question pertaining to marriage, please ask me.

One of the first questions I ask a couple planning to be married at our parish is if either of the couple has been married before. This is an important question, because if either of the couple has been previously married, either in the Church or civilly, that marriage must first be annulled before they can enter into a new marriage. If either of the couple has been married before, a date for the new couple cannot be set until the prior marriage is annulled. The annulment process can take at least two years from start to completion.

The Church also asks for a recent baptismal certificate from the couple. The reason for this is twofold. Firstly, the baptismal certificate verifies that you have been baptized in the Catholic faith. Secondly, all your Sacraments are recorded at the Church of Baptism and are noted on the back of the certificate. The notations on the back record the Sacraments that the person has already received, namely Confirmation, Marriage, and Sacred Orders.

I prefer to meet couples who are planning to get married at our parish as soon as possible so that they know what is expected of them in the course of marriage preparation. I have found that the sooner the preparation begins, the easier the whole process of marriage becomes. I look forward to working with those who are planning their marriage.

“The matrimonial covenant, by which a man and a woman establish between themselves a partnership of the whole of life, is by its nature ordered toward the good of the spouses and the procreation and education of offspring: this covenant between baptized persons has been raised by Christ the Lord to the dignity of a sacrament.”

(CCC 1055)

I would like to thank those couples from St. Jane Frances de Chantal who are involved in the Covenant Couples Ministry. These couples are assigned a newly-engaged couple to assist and walk with them as they prepare for their marriage and wedding day. You make my ministry a lot easier.

We are now a month into Ordinary Time—and two a half weeks from entering the season of Lent. Perspective is really an amazing thing!

We hear of differing perspectives in this week's readings. In the first reading, Moses relates to the Israelites—who have been wandering the desert for forty years—rules for them to follow once they settle into the land God has provided for them. In following these rules, they will remember the past—their exodus from Egypt and their path through the desert—and, most importantly, the many blessings God has given them.

In the second reading, Paul tells the Corinthians about differing perspectives between married men and women and single men and women. He states,

“I am telling you this for your own benefit, not to impose a restraint upon you, but for the sake of propriety and adherence to the Lord without distraction.”

(1 Cor. 7:34-35)

I believe he says this to help the people of Corinth see and better understand teachings that are new to them, and that these teachings can affect each person differently. By better witnessing how each person might view these teachings, they can better help one another in their respective callings as followers of Christ.

Finally, our Gospel reading from Mark relates how Jesus, at the beginnings of His public ministry, shocked those in the synagogue by entering the space on the Sabbath and teaching them “as one having authority and not as the scribes” (Mk 1:22b).

Jesus, a relatively unknown man to the masses, does not simply recite laws and scripture. Rather, He speaks of it with knowledge and conviction. Jesus even commands an unclean spirit from a man who is in the Temple. How should we view Jesus, this new man, in our community?

Perspective can change how we see things. Perspective can help us understand where someone is coming from. Perspective can reinforce our beliefs and help us better define what it is we believe. From Moses offering the people God's promises by granting them someone from their own ranks as a prophet, to the story of Jesus in the Synagogue, to one of Jesus' disciples, Paul, teaching God's ways to His people and helping them see one another, we see that God is true to His word. God works not in just one season, and not only through special circumstances. When we ask, God works among each of us. Everything in the world began in goodness through God. It is through the machinations and reliance of humanity on its own “knowledge” that error and even evil are allowed to continue their pervasive holds on our lives.

When we can allow ourselves to see the things that go on around us through different lenses—through the eyes of someone else—we open ourselves to a much greater truth and understanding of the world and humanity around us. When this openness to perspective moves from something that we “do” to something that is a part of who we are, we begin to see each other in new ways. We begin to treat one another not as a means to an end, but as truly good people in and of themselves.

See God in those around you this week. Purposefully shift perspective to see someone differently, and allow God to use your gifts for His Mission.

THE PRESENTATION OF THE LORD

“We too are called to welcome Jesus who comes to meet us, to encounter Him. The God of life is to be encountered every day of our lives—not now and then, but every day. To follow Jesus is not a decision taken once and for all; it is a daily choice.”

—Pope Francis, Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, 2019

The Presentation of Jesus in the temple shows him to be the firstborn Son who belongs to the Lord. With Simeon and Anna, all of Israel awaits its encounter with the Savior—the name given to this event in the Byzantine tradition.

Jesus is recognized as the long-expected Messiah, the “light of the nations” and the “glory of Israel,” but also “a sign that is spoken against.” The sword of sorrow predicted for Mary announces Christ’s perfect and unique oblation on the cross that will impart the salvation of God has “prepared in the presence of all peoples” (CCC, no. 529).

FEAST OF ST. BLASE

Saint Blase was the bishop of Sebaste in Armenia during the fourth century. Very little is known about his life. According to various accounts, he was a physician before becoming a bishop. His acclaim spread throughout the entire Church in the Middle Ages, because he was reputed to have miraculously cured a little boy who nearly died because of a fishbone in his throat. From the eighth century, he has been invoked on behalf of the sick, especially those afflicted with illnesses of the throat.

People sometimes inquire about a family member singing or otherwise participating in the music at a funeral or wedding at Church. We do welcome such requests, but certain protocols need to be in place first.

In other words, you must ask the pastor if it's okay. We want to be sure the person singing is familiar with the Catholic Mass and that the music is appropriate. If your request involves playing the organ, we must also be confident the person knows how to play and navigate such an expensive instrument. I've been to other churches where a visiting organist was never allowed to play, because in the past, someone caused damage to the organ, which led to expensive repairs.

Over the years, I've had interesting experiences with visiting musicians. Most are delightful, in that I've discovered some very talented people. Other experiences have been a little touchy, because the person was being asked to sing based on sentimental value, not musical quality. However, it's better to honor the wishes of the family, especially in times of grief.

Every so often, a young person is asked to sing or play, which is a totally different situation and has to be handled very carefully. One such instance involved my own niece, Lauren, who had been studying piano and was quite good for being only nine years old. 30 years ago, my 75-year old dad's friend Ebba had passed away suddenly, and we were all heartbroken. Ebba had come into Dad's life years after my mom died, and we were happy Dad had a wonderful companion. She volunteered at St. John Hospital (now Ascension) and had wanted her funeral at the chapel there. She had also wanted me to minister the music.

Lauren loved Ebba, and asked to play a prelude song at the funeral. I had no problem with that, but mere moments prior to her beginning, I whispered, "Lauren, what song are you playing? I'd like to introduce you and your song." She proudly answered, "*Camel Caravan*," and I nearly choked, wondering how that might fit into a Catholic funeral mass!

A done deal, I sort of mumbled the title into the microphone, and Lauren proceeded to pluck out this very bouncy, lively tune that mimicked camels streaking across the desert, marching in formation. She played it beautifully and was so proud to have been able to contribute musically to Ebba's funeral.

Afterward, I anticipated comments about this, but instead, people complimented all the music, *Camel Caravan* included. Later, at the luncheon, I asked Lauren about her selection. Her answer has always stuck with me, and is a frank reminder that children sometimes do indeed think in a higher realm than adults. Their grasp of death and what comes after may be more accurate than we know.

"Well, Aunt Tweet," (my long-time nickname), "I just loved Ebba. She was always so much fun. I was so sad when she died, but all I could picture was her riding off toward Heaven on this caravan of camels, with so many of them following. That's why I chose *Camel Caravan*. It was the perfect song for her."

Of course it was perfect. I don't doubt there are music directors who would have said "Oh, no, you cannot play *that*," or, "I don't know your ability," or "You're too young." But how else are you supposed to bring kids into the Church or guide them toward understanding that death is part of life? To this day, Lauren still fondly remembers her special role. Need I say more?
