May we take time each and every day to see the beauty of God's creation and His handiwork. However, let us also make it our goal to take care of God's creation. In making us in His image, God also gave us dominion over His creation and made us stewards of it.

I will be on retreat from October 10<sup>th</sup> through the 14<sup>th</sup>. I ask that you remember me in your prayers as I remember you in mine. God's blessings to each one of you.

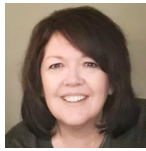

October is Domestic Violence Awareness Month. I share with you this helpful resource from [catholiccurrent.org](http://catholiccurrent.org) about identifying domestic violence:

### What's the difference between normal conflict and domestic violence?

Conflict is part of every intimate relationship—that's why conflict resolution skills are important. Domestic violence, however, has no place in a healthy relationship, whether the couple is dating, cohabiting, engaged, or married.

### What is domestic violence?

Domestic violence is any kind of behavior that a person uses, or threatens to use, to control an intimate partner. The two key elements are threat and control. Domestic violence can take various forms:

*Physical*—Violent actions such as hitting, beating, pushing, and kicking. In many cases, physical abuse becomes more frequent and severe over time.

*Sexual*—Includes any sexual acts that are forced on one partner by the other.

*Psychological*—Includes a wide range of behaviors such as intimidation, isolating the victim from friends and family, controlling where the victim goes, making the victim feel guilty or crazy, and making unreasonable demands.

*Emotional*—Undermining an individual's self-esteem, especially with constant criticism, insults, put-downs, and name-calling.

*Economic*—Examples include limiting the victim's access to family income, preventing the victim from working or forcing the victim to work, destroying the victim's property, and making all the financial decisions.

Both women and men can be victims of domestic abuse. According to statistics from the National Domestic Violence Hotline, approximately one in four women and one in seven men over the age of 18 have been the victim of physical domestic violence, and almost 50% of both sexes have experienced some form of domestic psychological aggression.

### What does the Catholic Church teach about domestic violence?

The U.S. Catholic Bishops have made clear that "violence against women, inside or outside the home, is never justified. Violence in any form—physical, sexual, psychological, or verbal—is sinful; often it is a crime as well." (*When I Call for Help: A Pastoral Response to Domestic Violence Against Women*)

### Domestic violence and the permanence of marriage

Some abused women believe that the Catholic Church's teaching on the permanence of marriage requires them to stay in an abusive relationship. They may hesitate to seek a separation or divorce. They may fear that they cannot re-marry in the Catholic Church.

In *When I Call for Help: A Pastoral Response to Domestic Violence Against Women*, the U.S. Catholic Bishops emphasize that "no person is expected to stay in an abusive marriage." Violence and abuse, not divorce, break up a marriage. The abuser has already broken the marriage covenant through their abusive behavior. Abused persons who have divorced may want to investigate the possibility of seeking an annulment.

## What the Bible says

Abusive men may take a text from the Bible and distort it to support their right to batter. They often use Ephesians 5:22 (“Wives should be subordinate to their husbands as to the Lord”) to justify their behavior. This passage (v. 21-33), however, refers to the mutual submission of husband and wife out of love for Christ. It means that husbands should love their wives as they love their own body, as Christ loves the Church.

The U.S. Catholic Bishops condemn the use of the Bible to support abusive behavior in any form. Men and women are created in God’s image. They are to treat each other with dignity and respect.

## Forgiveness

Men who batter also cite the Bible to insist that their victims forgive them (see, for example, Matthew 6:9-15). A victim then feels guilty if she cannot do so. Forgiveness, however, does not mean forgetting the abuse or pretending that it didn’t happen. Neither is possible.

Forgiveness is not permission to repeat the abuse. Rather, forgiveness means that the victim decides to let go of the experience, to move on with life and not to tolerate abuse of any kind again.

The choir is back! I hope you enjoyed hearing the choir this past weekend as much as they enjoyed being up front and singing again. It has been a long time, and

we're working on getting those voices back in shape. We've lost a few people over these last 18 months, and a few are dealing with illnesses or family issues, so please do keep those good people in your prayers. We hope for their return soon. Still, we had a nice group at 9:00am Mass last Sunday.

We'd love to add more people to the choir, if you are interested! Contrary to what you may think, you don't have to be a great singer to join. You simply need to be willing to praise God in song to the best of your ability. Blended together, all voices sound wonderful. If you are interested, come on over to the Church **on Wednesdays from 7:00pm—8:30pm** for rehearsals. During the first few sessions, we'll be doing some vocal strengthening techniques to help you sing better. For now, here are some tips for your own use in the pew:

**Sit up straight.** This keeps the diaphragm working properly for optimal breath support.

**Hold your book out in front of you** at chest or shoulder level instead of looking down at it. This helps your head stay level so that your throat is open and your voice comes out stronger.

**Sing at a volume that is comfortable for you.** Don't feel as if you have to sing too loudly.

Considering you are fasting already to receive the Holy Eucharist, also **try to refrain from consuming any dairy** prior to your fast. Dairy can cause drainage, which can clog up your throat.

**For the youth of our parish:** Attention parents and grandparents! Please consider inviting your youngster to join us as a new Instruments In Praise (IIP) musician or singer. It's easy: come to rehearsal in Church at 2:45pm on the first and/or third Saturdays of the month to minister at the 4:00pm Mass—and bring an instrument, if they play. If they don't play, we have percussion instruments available, which are very easy to learn. We also have bells, chimes, a xylophone, and more, with music ministry member Fawn to teach them. Surely something will catch their interest. Be not afraid!

If you haven't done so already, please do mark your calendar for the return of our Angels and Inspiration Music Series. The date is **Thursday, December 16, 2021 at 7:00pm** in the Church, where we'll once again present The Judelaires in their annual holiday concert. A free will donation will be taken up. The only change is that we will not have an afterglow reception in the Social Hall following the concert. Due to COVID-19, any food service at our parish has been postponed until after January 1, 2022.

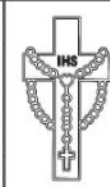
