MOVED BY MERCY

We are called to show mercy because mercy has first been shown to us.

POPE EPANCIS



He lay helpless and alone on the roadside, half dead from the robbers' merciless beating. Two travelers came upon the injured man, but rather than offer assistance, they simply avoided him. Finally, a third passerby "was moved with compassion at the sight" of him (Luke 10:33) and went out of his way to help.

In the Parable of the Good Samaritan, we can see ourselves in each person. Like the robbers, we have hurt others. Like the priest and the Levite, we have failed to show compassion. Like the injured traveler, we have suffered in body and spirit, feeling rejected and alone. Yet God never stops offering each of us his mercy, "a concrete reality with which he reveals his love" (MV 6).

We have been treated with mercy ourselves, and Jesus tells us to "go and do likewise" (Luke 10:37), giving us the roadmap of the Spiritual and Corporal Works of Mercy.

Each person "has a place in God's heart from all eternity" (AL 168). Within this context, Pope Francis reminds us, "we are called to protect our humanity, and this means, in the first place, accepting it and respecting it as it was created" (AL 56).

Like the Good Samaritan, may we always treat each person with merciful love and respect that affirms the gift of his or her life.

### Archdiocese of Detroit

Mass for Pardon Friday, October 7<sup>th</sup>, 7:00pm

Archbishop Allen Vigneron will lead the Archdiocese of Detroit in a Mass for Pardon at 7:00pm on Friday, October 7, 2016, at the Cathedral of the Most Blessed Sacrament in Detroit. A significant event in the life of the Archdiocese, the Mass for Pardon is an occasion for the Archbishop to represent the entire Church of Detroit, coming before God and repenting of all the sins that have been committed, and in many cases were part of the culture of the Archdiocese, over many decades.

Several dioceses have held similar penitential acts. The Archdiocese of Detroit has modeled its Mass for Pardon after the "Day of Forgiveness" led by the now-Saint Pope John Paul II at the Vatican in the Jubilee Year 2000. Though the Archdiocese of Detroit's Mass for Pardon is an act of repentance before God, it also is a public event to which members of the Catholic faithful are invited. Importantly, this act occurs during the Jubilee Year of Mercy, instituted by Pope Francis. It also is a significant step in preparation for the historic occasion of Synod '16, which is a gathering of Catholics to take place Nov. 18<sup>th</sup>-20<sup>th</sup>, which will have a significant impact on how the Catholic Church in Detroit represents Jesus Christ in society.

Next weekend, October 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup>, we are doing a pulpit exchange with St. Ephrem. Fr. Craig Giera, the pastor of St. Ephem, will take the 5:00pm Saturday Mass and the 9:00am and 11:30am Sunday Masses. I, in turn, will be the celebrant for all the weekend Masses at St. Ephrem.

One of the major advantages of a pulpit exchange is that it serves to break any potential barriers between parishes. Switching priests once or twice a year allows

the assembly to connect with a neighboring parish. A pulpit exchange is also a way to foster an understanding of the Church's universal mission to proclaim the Gospel. There can sometimes be a failure on the part of some Catholics to understand that they are part of a much larger entity. A person is not just part of St. Jane Frances or St. Ephrem parish. We are also part of the Archdiocese of Detroit. Additionally, we are in communion with the Latin Rite-Roman Catholic Church. Regardless of who the priest is at a given Mass, the readings and the prayers remain the same. Yes the styles of priests may vary somewhat but this just serves to highlight our unity even if there is a difference in methodology. I am sure that you will welcome Fr. Craig next weekend, just as the parishioners will welcome me as we "trade places".

Now that summer is in the rear view mirror, it seems like a fitting time to turn our attention in earnest to where we are heading, both as a parish and an Archdiocese.

As many of us have hopefully heard by now, there is going to be a Synod in the Archdiocese of Detroit near the end of November on the "new evangelization". That's an expression that may or may not be familiar to us – the "new evangelization". Evangelization simply means the proclamation of the good news, that is, the making known the Gospel of Jesus Christ, the proclamation that God is the loving Creator of all that is; that the Holy Spirit serves to lead and guide the Church in many and varied ways. Despite our sins, flaws and shortcomings, God chose to love and rescue creation and restore it to a higher place of honor than we could ever have hoped. Why, because in the eyes of God we are far, far, far more important than we could have ever imagined. To put it more simply *in the eyes of God, we matter*. This is the good news, the Gospel, the message of evangelization.

So then, what is "new" in this "new evangelization"? This term is a relatively recent one, dating back less than 25 years, and comes from St. (Pope) John Paul II. The newness of the "new evangelization" isn't some new message or new Gospel. It is, rather, a new *ardor*, a new *method*, a new *expression*. The new evangelization means that we are on fire; we are passionate; we are fervent in our commitment to proclaim and witness to the Gospel. "Ours is not an era of change" remarked Pope Francis, "but the change of an era. New times call for new ways of doing things, of breaking old models and getting out of the maintenance mode." The Synod, which is just a few weeks away, flows directly from an awareness of this.

As a parish, we are very intentional in "empowering discipleship". You have undoubtedly heard this many times in homilies over the past four months. The Synod's and our parish's goal is to mobilize us, to bring the Gospel, the only ultimate message of hope that the human race longs to hear, or perhaps has never heard properly, that the Gospel of Jesus Christ is what people need to help make sense of their lives.

In the weeks leading up to the Synod please fervently pray the prayer we will be reciting together at the conclusion of our General Intercessions/Prayers of the Faithful. Pray that we will not be lethargic or apathetic when it comes to living out our faith. If we can credibly witness to our faith, every person we meet, ever, anywhere, will have the opportunity to understand that we are made to be in relationship with God, both in this life and in the next.

#### Have faith


When people believe in the power of Jesus, extraordinary things can happen because nothing is impossible.

#### **GIVING CRIB**

## KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS ULTRASOUND MACHINE PROGRAM

In July 2008, the Knights of Columbus Supreme Council instituted the Ultrasound Machine Program. The purpose of the program is to purchase a brand new ultrasound machine for a Pro-Life Women's Clinic. For each new machine purchased by a Knights of Columbus Council, District, or State Council, the Supreme Council will pay half of the cost of the machine.



The ultrasound machine is used to show the image of a child to the mother. If a woman is shown the image of her unborn child, there is an 80% plus chance that she will decide to keep the baby rather than terminate if she is considered 'abortion minded'.

This is why the St. Jane Frances de Chantal Knights of Columbus Council 13340 is having a drive to raise money to purchase an ultrasound machine. 

Do you have unused medications or wound care dressings in your home?

The Health Ministry at St. Jane Frances will be collecting prescriptions and over the counter medications (OTC) as well as wound care products (dressings, tape, ace bandages, etc.) again. They will be taken to the Soup Kitchen to the pharmacist there who assists with the needs of the less fortunate.

Please bring your unused medications and wound care products to the church office any time during the above dates.

#### Rules for medication drop off:

- 1. Original prescription bottles with labels intact. We must be able to read the drug name, dosage, date, and pharmacy that dispensed the prescription. Please block out your name before bringing the bottles to church.
- 2. Expired dates on labels are accepted. The pharmacist will determine if it is still usable.
- 3. Unused over the counter (OTC) medicines are also accepted.
- 4. NO LIQUIDS.
- NO NARCOTICS OR CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES controlled substances are those with the potential for psychological or physical dependence. Examples include: narcotic painkillers such as Morphine, Vicodin, Oxycontin, Demerol, Tylenol III with codeine, anti-depressants, and ADHD drugs such as Ritalin.

#### Rules for wound care products drop off:

- 1. Original packages, unopened if packaged as sterile.
- 2. No liquids or ointments.
