

As we see the close of October, we begin the month of November—a month in which the Universal Church remembers those who have died.

At St. Jane Frances de Chantal, as well as in every parish, we will remember those from our parish who were buried this past year. We will recall the many ways in which those who have died have influenced and touched our lives.

On one of my trips to Argentina, we arrived in time to celebrate the Day of the Dead, commonly known to us as All Souls' Day. The Day of the Dead is a holiday in South America and in most of Europe. It is a day to celebrate the lives of those who have gone before us. The celebration takes place at the graves of loved ones who have passed on. There is usually a picnic lunch with music, dancing, and food for all to enjoy. It is a joyful celebration of life and of memories. It is a celebration of faith.

It is important to remember and to pray for those who have died. An older priest once told me years ago that it's important to pray for those who have been called home by the Lord, because someday, others will be praying for you. Death is indeed a part of life, and I believe what surprises us about death is that we don't know when it will come. Pope Francis said that "We pray that God prepares us for the encounter. We know not the date, but the encounter will happen."

As we celebrate the Feast of All Souls, let us reflect upon the many people in our lives who have walked this journey with us—those who have left their imprint on our life and on our life's vocation. We are where we are and do what we are doing because of someone's influence on our life. We do not journey through life alone. Many people join us in our joys and challenges. Some are with us for a lifetime, while others may be with us for a short part of the journey—yet everyone we come into contact with leaves their mark on us.

The Church reminds us of the importance of prayer. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states that we are encouraged to pray, as "in the prayer of petition, every event and need can become an offering of thanksgiving. The letter of St. Paul often begins and ends with thanksgiving, and the Lord Jesus is always present in it: 'Give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Jesus Christ'; 'Continue steadfastly in prayer, being watchful in it with thanksgiving'" (CCC 2638).

O Lord, eternal rest grant unto our brothers and sisters. May the Light of your face be upon them.

SIX WEEKS WITH THE BIBLE

Until recently, Catholic schools were always closed on holy days

of obligation. At Halloween time, this was a great advantage the Catholic school kids had over the public school kids. Because November 1st, the Feast of All Saints, was a day off of school, Catholic school students always got to stay out late trick-or-treating on Halloween.

Halloween, All Saints' Day, and All Souls' Day (on November 2nd) are often linked together, though their connections are not as strong as you might imagine.

The name Halloween means "All Hallows (Holy) Eve." Really, the name is a misnomer. Years before Christianity, the Druids marked the start of winter with the burning of the stalks around November 1st. It was believed that demons and devils roamed the earth on this night, and the way to ward them off included offering them sweets or disguising oneself in a costume and roaming with these evil spirits. Parts of these traditions have lasted until today.

All Saints' Day, on the other hand, is a feast established by the church to honor all of the saints in heaven who do not have a special day on one of the other 364 days of the year. These include the many saints who have not been recognized with canonization. Some of your deceased relatives and friends are likely included in those remembered on All Saints' Day.

You might think that the church established this holiday on November $\mathbf{1}^{st}$ as a way to counteract the pagan practices on Halloween. Actually, All Saints' Day was originally held in May. In 844 it was transferred to November $\mathbf{1}^{st}$ so that the many pilgrims who came to Rome to celebrate the day could be fed more easily with the food from the harvest.

All Souls' Day on November 2nd was established in the 11th century. The church has always believed that it should pray for "the souls of the faithfully departed." The tradition around All Souls' Day includes the Catholic belief in purgatory, a condition in which those who have died are "purged" or made clean from their sins in preparation for meeting God in the full joy of heaven. People on earth can aid the souls in purgatory by praying for them, doing works of charity, and offering Masses for the dead. Around the 1500s, priests were permitted to offer three Masses on All Souls' Day for the dead. Today, in your church bulletin, you will see people named, both living and dead, who will have Masses offered for them on a particular day and time.

A tradition in many countries is for family members to visit and decorate the graves of their deceased family members on All Souls' Day. Also, names of the dead are collected and given to the priest who offers special prayers for them during the month of November.

Today, if you go to a Catholic school, All Saints' Day is probably not a day off. Nevertheless, you may have the chance to celebrate Mass that day with all of your classmates.

- 2. Who is someone who has died with whom you feel a special connection? Explain the connection.
- 3. If there were a blueprint on becoming a saint, what would it include?
