This time of year seems to be one for getting engaged and for planning upcoming marriages. Primarily, this article is for newly-engaged couples who are planning to be married here at St. Jane Frances de Chantal.

When contacting our parish about planning an upcoming wedding, please ask to speak to Fr. Tony. Our front desk staff does not help select available wedding dates. That is done by the couple and I. If you have a question pertaining to marriage, please ask me.

One of the first questions I ask a couple planning to be married at our parish is if either of the couple has been married before. This is an important question, because if either of the couple has been previously married, either in the Church or civilly, that marriage must first be annulled before they can enter into a new marriage. If either of the couple has been married before, a date for the new couple *cannot* be set until the prior marriage is annulled. The annulment process can take at least two years from start to completion.

The Church also asks for a recent baptismal certificate from the couple. The reason for this is twofold. Firstly, the baptismal certificate verifies that you have been baptized in the Catholic faith. Secondly, all your sacraments are recorded at the Church of Baptism and are noted on the back of the certificate. The notations on the back record the sacraments that the person has already received, namely Confirmation, Marriage, and Sacred Orders.

I prefer to meet couples who are planning to get married at our parish as soon as possible so that they know what is expected of them in the course of marriage preparation. I have found that the sooner the preparation begins, the easier the whole process of marriage becomes. I look forward to working with those who are planning their marriage.

“The matrimonial covenant, by which a man and a woman establish between themselves a partnership of the whole of life, is by its nature ordered toward the good of the spouses and the procreation and education of offspring: this covenant between baptized persons has been raised by Christ the Lord to the dignity of a sacrament.”

(CCC 1055)

I would like to thank those couples from St. Jane Frances de Chantal who are involved in the Covenant Couples Ministry. These couples are assigned a newly-engaged couple to assist and walk with as they prepare for their marriage and wedding day. You make my ministry a lot easier.

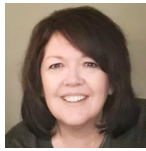

Advent begins with the Vigil Mass on Saturday, November 27th. Our parish offers several ways to prepare for and engage in this season:

Advent candle sets for home use are available in the Parish Office for a suggested donation of \$5/set.

“Little Blue Books” Advent edition are available in the Gathering Space to aid you in your Advent preparations. These little books offer a great way to prepare your heart for the Lord. Suggested donation is \$1/book.

Alternate Advent reflection book options are also available! Two new resources for daily Advent reflection can be found in the Gathering Space: *Waiting in Wondrous Expectation* by Sr. Janet Schaeffler, OP and *Awaken to New Light* by S. James Meyer. Both booklets provide a reflection for the day, a suggestion for an action or activity to practice your faith, and an Advent prayer for each day. There is a suggested donation of \$1 for each booklet.

Feast of the Immaculate Conception Vigil Mass is at **7:00pm on Tuesday, December 7th**. There is also Mass at **8:00am on Wednesday, December 8th**.

Advent Reconciliation service at our parish is at **6:00pm on Monday, December 13th** in the main worship space.

Eucharistic Adoration is from **1:00pm—6:30pm on Tuesday, December 14th** in the chapel. It will conclude with recitation of the Divine Praises at 6:30pm.

ST. JANE FRANCES de CHANTAL FAITH FORMATION MEET THE CATECHIST: PAM KLASSEN

Hi! I am Pam Klassen, or Mrs. Pam, as the students call me in class. I am a volunteer catechist here at St. Jane Frances de Chantal in the faith formation program. I have taught faith formation on and off since I was in high school.

My faith life started when I was baptized at St. Bartholomew Church shortly after my dad converted to Catholicism and was also baptized at St. Bart's. I was provided a Catholic education starting in elementary school at St. Mark in Warren for 1st through 8th grade, followed by high school at St. James in Ferndale.

My first experience as a catechist was in 11th and 12th grade at St. Mark, my home parish, where I taught and worked with special needs children in their homes and substituted for other catechists when needed. I joined St. Jerome's young adult group, where I met my husband, Jim, while on a bowling league.



As a surprise to me on Easter Sunday 1970, just before our May 1st Wedding, Jim was baptized by Fr. Bob Blondell during Mass at St. Mark. I was positively shocked and thrilled at the same time! Our marriage gave us two beautiful children: Benjamin, born in 1974, and Andrea, born in 1977. We moved to Sterling Heights in 1977 and joined St. Rene Goupil Parish, where I was a 4th grade catechist before I became the coordinator for the Pre/K faith formation program for 22 years. In 1984, due to a lack of Catholic Bible school programs, I was asked to spearhead a summer VBS program that we ran for 17 years with many wonderful volunteers.

My daughter Andrea and her terrific husband Scott have blessed us with triplets who are now almost 14 years old and will be confirmed at St. Therese of Lisieux in January 2022. I was asked by one of my grandsons to be his sponsor.

After losing my dear husband in 2019, I am consistently trying to focus on "who Jesus is" in my life, and I feel so blessed to touch the spiritual lives of so many of God's children. I really want to convey the blessings of making and taking time "to talk with God" as my students and I continue to learn and grow in our faith lives together. After so many years, I realize that this is my vocation!

This Thursday marks my favorite holiday: Thanksgiving, Turkey Day, the start of the Holiday Trifecta, with Christmas and New Year’s Day completing the trio.

I’m not sure why it is so beloved—unless it’s because it’s the one holiday where no one expects anything from anyone: no gifts and no dressing up (because you have to leave room for “comfort” after the meal). You can be who you are, and the day celebrates exactly that: giving thanks for family, abundance, and joy in all we’ve been given through God’s great bounty and graces. We are the luckiest and most fortunate people on earth to know a God who is so good.

Thanksgiving is a day we can take a breath and retreat from all the hassles of work, from worrying about COVID-19 and its repercussions, and from the outside world. Instead, we can focus on who says grace before we dig into Mom’s great dressing recipe or Aunt Sis’ fried apple pies—or even the ever-present egg nog Dad loves but no one else does!

It is a comfortable holiday. We know what is going to happen within our own traditions. Usually, Mom or Grandma sets the table with that once-a-year “good” china and stemware. The color-coordinated tablecloth and napkins are unfolded in all their glory—and maybe even outdoor vegetation makes its way inside to create a festive table and atmosphere.

We even eat the same foods every year, no? Woe be to the one who tries to introduce mashed cauliflower instead of real butter-drenched potatoes, or fig and quinoa casserole in place of the calorie-laden green bean version—or, dear no, bring low-cal anything to the dessert table.

Normally I fuss over hosting a dinner for a very few people—so few that an extra leaf isn’t needed for the dinner table. But still, I fuss just the same. Maybe it’s the reassurance of being able to prepare a great dinner for loved ones as I always have. As we get older, we worry that we’ll lose the knack for cooking or that our recipes won’t turn out the way they should. I can remember one Thanksgiving Day as a teenager when my then-boyfriend insisted I go to his mom’s for dinner. My own Polish mom was a fabulous cook, and I hated to miss her feast, but reluctantly, I did. It was awful: the turkey was raw, the few side dishes had no flavor, and dessert was a boxed pumpkin pie. I felt as if I’d been cheated that year—but then I also thought about the unfortunate people who would have jumped at the chance to enjoy even that meal: those who have no home, or family, or friends. This is also a day when we need to pray for them.

Now that I think back to that episode, I realize something else. Each week we get to celebrate a sumptuous meal with the Lord. It is comfortable. It is traditional. It is filling—and fulfilling. We celebrate with friends and family. Or perhaps we invite people to join us who we don’t know very well. Maybe we attend alone. If we sometimes stray away from God, we get a taste of something false—a meal we can’t enjoy. When we do return to God, only then can we understand what we’ve missed and yearned for. If you know of anyone who has left the Church, please consider inviting them back home to the table of the Lord.

This year is going to be a little different for me. I’m heading south to enjoy Thanksgiving on the same day as my dear friend’s son’s 40th birthday. It’s definitely time for a breather: I’ve only taken off one weekend since June 2020. I’ll be back the first part of December refreshed and replenished!

May your own Thanksgiving be blessed and joyful!
