We begin this third week of Advent in anticipation of Christmas. You may recall that in Luke’s Gospel during the first week of Advent, we hear Jesus telling His disciples to be watchful and to stay alert. Luke’s gospel presents us with four themes to keep in mind in our preparation for the feast of Christmas. Each of these themes enables us to reflect upon this season and points us to the birth of Christ. The themes that the Scriptures present to us are preparation, joy, hope, and love. Each one is a stepping stone for our celebration of Christ being born into the world. They are themes that allow us to focus on what is important in our lives.

In my office, I have many mementos that I have received from people throughout my years of being a priest. In the early days of my priesthood, I received a framed piece of needlepoint. At every subsequent assignment, I had that framed needlepoint. It became the last thing I packed when concluding an assignment, and the first thing I unpacked when I arrived at a new parish. It serves as a point of focus for me when events or situations became overwhelming.

Life can sometimes be overwhelming. When this happens, we might feel pulled in various directions and lose our focus. The words on the needlepoint help me to focus on what is important in my life and pull me back to the events and situations at hand. Those three simple yet powerful words in needlepoint are family, faith, and friends. As we draw closer in our journey toward Bethlehem, may we prepare ourselves to receive He who is our joy, our hope, and our love.

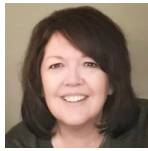

We have now entered the second half of the Advent season: Gaudete Sunday!

“The Third Sunday of Advent (Like the Fourth Sunday of Lent) is a day of joy in the midst of our spiritual preparations for Christmas. It is traditionally called Gaudete Sunday, from the Latin of the Entrance Antiphon for today. The antiphon captures the mood of the entire liturgy as we move into the second part of Advent: there is a sense of joyful expectation, an awareness that the fulfillment of God’s great plan for us is near” (*Sourcebook for Sundays, Seasons, and Weekdays*).

The first two readings speak to that theme: “Shout for joy... sing joyfully,” we hear in the Book of the Prophet Zephaniah—and the word “Rejoice” is found twice in St. Paul’s letter to the Philippians. Then, in the Gospel, John the Baptist baptizes the people with joy, and they rejoice in their new life. The newly baptized then ask, “What should we do?” They have repented of their sin, but they know they will need to do more to be pleasing in the Lord’s eyes. We see then a precursor to the public ministry of Jesus—with the same lessons Jesus will teach—being expressed by John the Baptist. He addresses the crowd, including tax collectors and soldiers, giving them a lesson in how to serve God by serving God’s people. We can see a model for our own ongoing catechesis, which is necessary to continually grow in understanding of the faith and learn the way of the Lord that leads to eternal salvation.

As John the Baptist and Jesus did, the Church continues to teach the faith and helps us grow in virtue in order to receive the salvation only God can provide. Throughout our lives, with its ages and stages, we too must ask, “What should we do?” During this Advent season, we can seek to be closer to God through prayer, reading Scripture, and seeking to understand our faith through resources like our *Sunday by Sunday* print resource and our episodes of *The Way of Faith* on the theological virtues (both available on sjfparish.org).

We focus this week on the virtue of hope in *The Way of Faith*, which is particularly appropriate, as we are sometimes challenged to look around us and see reasons for rejoicing. We can look to the readings today for inspiration and a renewal of hope—hope in the Lord, not the things of this world. As we seek to direct our hearts and minds to Christ present and Christ coming, let us rejoice. As we rejoice, we also must prepare. We prepare for the coming of the Son of God into the world, into our hearts, and at the end of time. Let us try to put aside all the business and craziness of the world and concentrate on preparing our hearts for the divine presence in us and among us.

Christmas Wafers: The Christmas wafer commemorates a custom that is many centuries old. Oplatek (from the Latin “Oblatum,” Holy Bread) is believed by some to emanate as far back as the “manna” of Exodus 16:31 and is sometimes referred to as the Bread of Angels.

Shared at the Christmas Vigil meal, the breaking of the Christmas wafer offers best wishes to family and friends. **Christmas wafers are now available in the Parish Office.** A donation of \$1 per package of four wafers is appreciated.

The Judelaires do not charge for tickets and can only continue their concert ministry through the support of the Free Will donations.
