It is difficult for me to believe that Holy Week is upon us. Holy Week has great significance in my life. When I was a seminarian at St. John's Provincial Seminary in Plymouth, Michigan, we had the opportunity to study in Israel for 11 weeks. We lived in Ein Karem, the birthplace of St. John the Baptist, and we studied in Jerusalem. We stayed with the Sisters of Zion, who have their

motherhouse and convent in Ein Karem. While we were there, we made many day trips to various areas in and around Jerusalem, from travelling to the Sea of Galilee to climbing Mt. Sinai to see the little town of Bethlehem.

During the time we were in Israel, we travelled all over the country and walked in the footsteps of Jesus. The most memorable week of that trip was Holy Week. We celebrated Mass in the upper room on Holy Thursday, walked the Via Dolores on Good Friday, slept in the garden of Gethsemane, and visited the tomb of Jesus on Easter Sunday morning. It was a trip that I will never forget.

As a side note, I made a second trip to Israel ten years after I was ordained, and I celebrated Masses at many places important to the life and ministry of Jesus. I look forward to returning to Israel next year to see friends that I still keep in contact with and to visit the places that hold a special place in my heart. For those who have been to Israel, you will agree that the Scriptures take on a deeper meaning when you see and visit the spots we hear about within them. Once you have been to the places Jesus walked and taught, you will never read, hear, or proclaim the Word of God the same way again.

I invite you to take part in the Holy Week liturgies from Passion Sunday to Easter morning. The liturgies are rich in tradition. Each liturgy has its own distinction within Holy week, and they all point us toward the great feast of Easter. Again, I invite you to take part in some or all of the liturgies of Holy Week as we prepare for Easter.

Have a joyous and wonderful Holy Week.

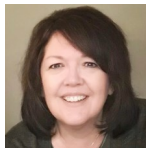

Leader: "We have come to the last days of Lent. Today, we hear the reading of the Passion. That story will remain with us as enter into the Three Days when we celebrate the mystery of Christ passing through suffering and death to life at God's right hand."

This weekend, we celebrate Palm Sunday. Let us put ourselves in the sandals of the occupants of the city of Jerusalem. We hear the news that someone special is coming to town,

and we know we need to see them coming into the city. A messiah—one who was to deliver the Hebrew people from oppression, reunite the tribes of Israel, and usher in a period of peace for the Jewish nation—was often looked for in military leaders. “Ordinary” people would walk into the city, but important people would ride into the city. “Powerful” men would ride in on decked-out horses, showing their strength and resourcefulness. These were people who could defeat the enemy and show leadership that the enemy would dare not oppose. Jesus came not on a powerful steed but on a donkey—a far cry from a show of force. But we have heard that this Jesus has stood up to many people in power, so we need to see Him! We cheer and welcome Him to our city.

Is there an excitement in the air? Can you feel it? Do you feel it in the liturgy today? We know the story and how this week will end. As a matter of fact, we begin and end this week with the story of Jesus’ Passion. We start our liturgy with the Triumphal entry, but our Gospel reading tells us why we are truly celebrating. We do not live two thousand years ago, but today. We know that Jesus did not come to vanquish the Roman Legions that were conquering nations, but that He came to free us from something even more sinister: sin. In the glossary of the Catechism of the Catholic Church, sin is “a deliberate thought, word, deed, or omission contrary to the eternal law of God.” When we commit a sin, we, not anyone else, separate ourselves from God. We cannot play the “blame game”; we make that choice; we excommunicate ourselves from God. We move away from joining with God. But God still loves us, and sent His Son, Jesus, to bridge that gap. Jesus’ sacrifice is for us; for me; for you.

Almost an entire year has passed since last year’s very different Easter. This year gives us a little bit of “normalcy” back in that we can once again gather in person, though not in the numbers that we might wish. We must remember as well that there are those in our family that cannot yet gather with us—people with underlying conditions, immune response deficiencies, and those dealing with anxiety issues who are unable to come to the Lord’s Feast. We need to remember our brothers and sisters in a special way this year!

We celebrate the Triumphal entry, because even though Jesus knew what was to transpire as the week progressed, He still entered the city. Is today a celebration? Have you shared this news with your friends and family? How can we still include those who are unable to join us? Celebrate, but remember what it is that we are celebrating—the “passover” of our earned judgement, because of the sacrifice of the one for us all.

Memory is a very unusual and selective gift, no matter what your age. We may forget something that happened only moments or days before, but recall happenings from decades ago. When Holy Week comes

around each year, it triggers my own memory of my family attending Church on Palm Sunday and Easter. I don't remember much about going to the Triduum Masses or the Easter Vigil, but I suppose with four young kids, plus the fact my dad was a Detroit firefighter and had a 24-hour schedule, it was a little bit difficult for my mom to corral us all for evening worship.

In fact, our normal Sunday Church schedule went like this: When home, Dad would take my three brothers to early Mass. Mom cooked breakfast, and we'd feast when they got home from Church. Then I'd watch the weekly Shirley Temple movie until 11:30am, when Mom and I had to leave to attend 12:00pm Mass. I hated having to miss the last half of the movie, but that was how it was. Mom insisted we sit in the very front row at St. Rita Church, which we did even when the whole family attended Mass together. I think everyone knew the Parrott family!

I especially remember that Palm Sunday always meant a long Gospel. As I mentioned, we normally did not attend Triduum services, but I clearly recall what I did on Good Friday. My parents had a very large, beautiful Bible. It had heavy, glossy paper, and there were a lot of pictures in it (kids recall those details!). I loved looking at that Bible. At noon, I'd take the Bible and think about Jesus, the betrayal, his scourging at the pillar, the mean soldiers, Pilate, the Crucifixion, and all the characters of Holy Week. I'd focus on the pictures more than the Scriptures, and it always brought me to tears to consider what those people did to my Jesus!



At about 3:00pm, I'd think of Jesus dying on the Cross and put the Bible down, pretty much spent, and wait for Easter Sunday. To me, when Easter came, it meant that Jesus was alive and had overcome all that had been done to him. I always looked forward to Church (even if I did miss Shirley Temple!), the glorious music, the lilies on the altar, the ladies in their very best hats, and foraging around for Easter eggs, baskets, and chocolate bunnies after getting home from Mass.

Of course, as an adult, the days from Holy Thursday through Easter have a much deeper meaning, but I cannot help but think of how I was molded during those days of my youth. I appreciate Holy Week even more because of it. You'll recall my article from last week about Joseph the carpenter and using our own hands for God's work. Well, my dad was a talented woodworker, and I have some very special gifts he crafted for me. After finding some old cedar wood planks in the alley, he made one large cedar chest and three smaller cedar boxes. They are gorgeous and still retain their aroma. In one of those smaller boxes is the very Bible from my childhood, a gift to me from my parents, dated June 1964. It sits near my grand piano. They knew how much I appreciated that Bible and figured I should have it. Even now, it is still so beautiful. Inside, there are handwritten notes from my mother. Certainly, I'll be in Church on Good Friday, but I think you know what I'll be doing prior. Happy Holy Week!
