Jerry-atrics Fr. Jerry Slowinski ext. 102 Pastor This is the weekend that the 2016 Catholic Services Appeal (CSA) kicks off in parishes throughout the Archdiocese of Detroit. As mentioned last week our target goal assigned to us by the Archdiocese is \$90,176.

There was a commercial which I recently saw on television regarding how many bees it takes to make a jar of honey which is applicable to how the CSA should work in a parish. The commercial starts out by asking the question "do you know how many bees it takes to make a jar of honey?" The answer is, "it takes 48 bees to make just

one ounce of honey. To make a 22 ounce jar of honey it takes 1,056 bees". The commercial then goes on to extol the praises of the hard work of not only the bees, but the manufacturer of the honey which results in people being able to enjoy the end result.

In many respects, the work of the CSA can be likened to the number of bees involved in order to churn out a jar of honey. We are those worker bees. It would be unrealistic to think that just one person will do the work of the CSA by writing out a check for 90,176. It also would be unlikely that 90 or 91 people will write out 1,000 checks in order to meet our target goal. The only way we can attain the designated objective which the Archdiocese has set for St. Jane Frances de Chantal Parish is through the work of parishioners who join together, as Christian stewards, to enable the mission of the Church – to unleash the Gospel, by supporting the multitude of ministries which benefit from your support of the CSA.

Thank you for all that you do to make the CSA an instrument of God's abiding presence in the Archdiocese of Detroit. Without your work, the Archdiocese could not meet the spiritual and temporal needs of so many in southeast Michigan.

This weekend, specifically Sunday, May 1st, from 1:00pm to 3:30pm, we are having our "**Parish Dialogue Gathering**".This will be your opportunity to provide input in preparation for Synod 16, which is to be held in November of this year. Synods are transformative experiences that lead to a renewal in the Church's life. Our Archdiocese is attempting a Continued on page 3

radical overhaul from an inward, maintenance-focused church to an outward, mission-focused church. Please join us with your thoughts as we call upon the Holy Spirit to lead our archdiocese in a direction which will help us to *Unleash the Gospel* - which is the theme for Synod 16.

To put a Synod in some type of perspective, the last time the Archdiocese held such a gathering was in 1969. This is approximately 10 years before St. Jane Frances de Chantal ever existed. Chances are that this will be the only opportunity in our lifetime to be part of such an important process. In a parish of almost 1,500 families, it is my hope that the Fr. Page Activity Center will draw many parishioners to come forward to take part in our **"Parish Dialogue Gathering"**.


VOCATIONS




