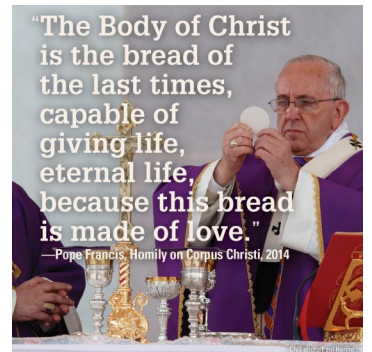

WAYS OF PARTICIPATING IN THE PASCHAL MYSTERY

Reflecting on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

Through participation in the Eucharist, we also participate in the Paschal Mystery of Christ, that is, in His dying and rising, which is made present for us in the Eucharistic sacrifice. This participation in the Paschal Mystery of Christ reaches its consummation when we receive His Body and Blood in Holy Communion. Christ's victory and triumph over death is then made present in the lives of those who participate in the Eucharist. Holy Communion increases our union with Christ. "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him" (John 6:56). Communion with the Body of Christ preserves, increases, and renews the life of grace received at Baptism. Holy Communion separates us from sin. We receive the Body of Christ "given up for us" to save us from sin. We receive the Blood of Christ "shed for many for the forgiveness of sins." Our love of God is intensified and therefore our disordered attachments are weakened and even broken. Divine love wipes away venial sins. Holy Communion offers us strength, called grace, to preserve us from mortal sin. By deepening our friendship with Christ, this Sacrament makes it more difficult for us to break our union with Him by mortal sin. Holy Communion expands the life of the Church. The Church as a communion is bound ever more closely together through the celebration of the Eucharist. As an ancient axiom states, the Church makes the Eucharist, and the Eucharist makes the Church. In receiving Communion, we are more fully united to the Church. Holy Communion commits us to care for the poor. St. Paul reminded the Corinthians that in sharing the Body of Christ in the Eucharist, they were also called to care for the poorer members of the community (cf. 1 Cor 11:17-34). Participation in the celebration of the Eucharistic sacrifice is a source and means of grace even apart from the actual reception of Holy Communion. It has also been long understood that when circumstances prevent one from receiving Holy Communion during Mass, it is possible to make a spiritual communion that is also a source of grace. Spiritual communion means uniting one's self in prayer with Christ's sacrifice and worshipping Him present in His Body and Blood.

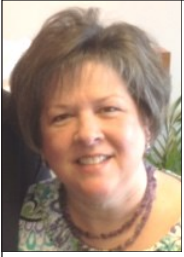

Welcome, Fr. Michael Sheehy, ccm!

Fr. Michael Sheehy, the mission procurator for the Marianhill Missionaries speaks to us at all the Masses this weekend. In support of the mission work of the Mariannhill Missionaries, envelopes from the Missionary Co-Operation Plan are included with this bulletin for you to use in support of their works. We ask for you continued generosity and to return them in next

week's collection.

About the Mariannhill Missionaries:

In 1882, Father Francis Pfanner arrived in South Africa with 30 Trappist monks to establish a monastery among the Zulu people. He dedicated the monastery to Mary and her mother, St. Ann, and called it the Mariannhill Monastery. Fr. Francis soon recognized the need to educate and evangelize the Zulu people. Local chiefs actually requested from the monks that they educate their boys. Soon mission schools and churches were established. With the help of the Missionary Sisters of the Precious Blood, whom Fr. Francis founded in 1885, he also opened hospitals and aid posts.

It soon became apparent that the Trappist way of life conflicted with missionary work. So in 1909 Rome asked the Trappists at Mariannhill to become a new mission congregation. The Mariannhill Missionaries work mostly in Africa, with establishments in South Africa, Zimbabwe, Zambia, Kenya, and Mozambique. They are also working in the South Pacific, in Papua New Guinea since 1960.

Forty percent of the Mariannhill Missionaries are now native Africans. They depend a great deal on America and Europe for financial assistance to educate them and support their missionary work.

Since 1924 the Mariannhill Missionaries were established in the United States. They are located in Dearborn Heights, Michigan, with about ten members in residence. They help out in parishes around Detroit and run a retreat center for high school students preparing for Confirmation. They also publish *Leaves Magazine*.

SAINT OF THE MONTH



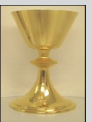

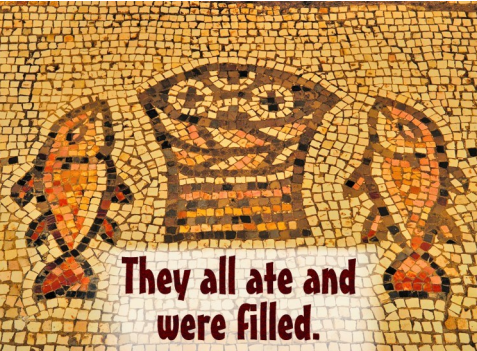
