Lastly, work hard and love what you do; be passionate about what you do.



FEAST DAY OF OUR LADY OF FATIMA: MAY 13, 2021

Mary appeared to three peasant children near Fatima, Portugal, six times between May 13 and October 13, 1917, and asked for prayers for world peace and an end to World War I, for sinners, and for the conversion of Russia.

She entrusted the children with three secrets, regarding devotion to her Immaculate Heart, a vision of hell, and a "bishop in white" shot by soldiers firing bullets and arrows. Many connect the third secret to the attempted assassination of Blessed Pope John Paul II on May 13, 1981, and the pope thanked Mary for guiding the bullet and saving him.

At the Vatican last October 13th, Pope Francis stood before the statue of Our Lady from the Fatima shrine and formally entrusted the world to Mary.



We praise you, Lord, and bless you, for in a time of horrific war and pandemic plague, you sent us your mother,
Our Lady of Fatima.


We sing praises to you, for even in times of sorrow and fear, the Earth is still touched by one such as she.

Like many Catholics, when May rolls around, I think of Mary, the May crowning, and Mother's Day. When my mom, Janina (or Jean, as she preferred to be known) was alive, she was devoted to Mary and kept a

statue on the counter by the clock. That may not sound significant, but it was a revered place at my house, and anything important went by that old-fashioned black clock—notes, report cards, money for bills, requests for money, my dad's paycheck, everything. On May 1st, we kids would adorn the Blessed Mother statue with dandelions, lilacs, and for some reason, oranges.

In Mom's fondness of Mary, she channeled her inner musician and would sing Mary songs like *Bring Flowers to the Rarest, On This Day O Beautiful Mother, Immaculate Mary,* and *Ave Maria*. So, as a good daughter of a Polish mom, I sang these too, though I don't remember exactly when I learned them. I began studying piano and was singing at age seven, so I would guess that I was still very young. At age 16, when I began to celebrate the music for Mass at St. Rita Church in Detroit, my training included sacred songs from the *People's Mass Book*. That was about



the time contemporary music came into vogue, but still, Mary songs, especially *Ave Maria* and its many versions, were always popular.

One day, someone requested *Serdeczna Matko* for a funeral. Every Polish mama knows and loves that song, which is dedicated to the Blessed Mother; even today, it is often requested for funerals. Mom never taught us Polish (though I wish she had!) but she provided me with a tutorial on how to pronounce the words. If you have ever tried to read Polish, you know that very little is pronounced as it looks. I learned it phonetically from Mom and have never forgotten the words. Years later, I discovered a translation so that non-Polish people can know the meaning: "Beautiful Mother, guardian of our nation, hearken O hearken to our supplication! Your loyal children, kneeling, we beseech you to grant us the graces to be loyal to you."

Whenever I sing *Serdeczna Matko*, I think of Mom. She died 37 years ago on May 6th, a beautiful, sunny afternoon. It's difficult to believe she's been gone over half my life. I inherited a lot from Mom, in addition to her name: her looks, the silver hair, cooking, and a love of gardening, flowers, nature, and animals—and I can't forget bingo, music, and theater. All of this paled against her great love of Mary, God, and the Church. She'd share her visions of Mary with us, often seeing a crown with brilliant flashes of golden light around her own eyes. She'd note those days on the calendar—"Saw Mary's crown today!" We kids wondered about it, but Mom was adamant and happy when those episodes came.

It wasn't until after she died when we figured out what was happening: Mom was going blind. The "crowns" she saw were actually signs of her retina deteriorating. However, by then, other health issues had become more urgent. She didn't like doctors anyway, so to try and get her to an eye specialist wasn't happening. In essence, Mary's "crowns" were part of her strong Catholic beliefs, and she was content to let it be—to let God take care of her. She went home to the Lord, her saints, and her beloved Mary, convinced that her visions were precious and special—and actually, they were.

I'm content to leave it that way, myself. Happy Mother's Day!

To me, the overarching theme of this week's readings is a simple one: love. In both my go-to Internet dictionary, merriam-webster.com, and my hard copy 1966 World Book

Dictionary, there are nine primary definitions of love as a noun and five of love as a verb. Love is a "simple" word that does not appear to be so simple, right?

Last week, in the Acts of the Apostles, we heard about Saul trying to fit in with Jesus' disciples in Jerusalem. This week, we head over to see Peter, the rock on whom Jesus built His church. Peter is invited to visit a Roman Centurion named Cornelius. In charge of about 80 highly-skilled soldiers, Cornelius' position afforded him a great amount of respect. He was God-fearing and gave alms generously to the Jewish people where he was stationed, but he was still a Roman, and he sent some men to invite Peter to come to visit him in Caesarea, just over a day's journey from where Peter was ministering. Imagine what was going through Peter's mind after being invited to a Roman commander's base of operation. Upon entering, the commander fell to the ground in front of Peter and paid him homage! Each of these men had just recently experienced visions from God. Each vision seemed to leave questions when taken individually, but by Cornelius inviting Peter to visit, each man's vision became clearer. Peter began to see what God was inviting him to do: to open the love of God to everyone and allow all to be baptized, Jewish and non-Jewish alike.

In our second reading from the First Letter of John, we find ourselves still in the section of the letter dedicated to love for one another. Here, a simply profound statement is made: "Everyone who loves is begotten by God and knows God" (1 Jn 4:7b). It does not state "some" or "most," but that *everyone* who loves is begotten by God and knows God. Of those 14 different "definitions" of love, each of us must be aware of at least one. Even in the more secular or paganistic definitions, an idea blossoms, and God is there, reaching, extending the notion of Himself into our rational minds. We, on our own, cannot necessarily come up with that idea of God as love, but once He came to the world in the form of His Son, Jesus, and allowed Himself to walk the earth and sacrifice Himself for us, this idea of love being the essence of God is clearer.

Finally, in our Gospel, Jesus lays it out for us (re-read Jn 15:9-17). Jesus tells us, "I have told you everything I have heard from my Father" (Jn 15). By sharing all to all, Jesus counts each of us as friends. He tells us what we must do: "Love one another as I love you" (Jn 12). Each one of our paths in love is different. As such, we must be willing to reach out and share with one another truth and love. We must share the message of Jesus and listen to each other's witness to better understand love. As we approach Pentecost, let us look at our inventory of love, and see where, and to whom, we can give that love, so that we can grow closer to God, who will replenish that which we give.


