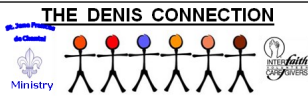

Intercessory Prayer

What is intercessory prayer?

Intercession is not so much a matter of saying the right words but of having the right heart. If we love the Lord with all our heart, we have the right heart.

A good model of intercessory prayer is found in the Book of Daniel's 9th chapter:

- Intercession is in response to reading Scripture (9:2)
- Intercession is characterized by frequency (9:3)
- Intercession is accompanied by self-denial, i.e. fasting (9:3)
- Intercession is on behalf of God's people (9:5)
- Intercession is strengthened by the confession of sin (9:5 - 15)
- Intercession is dependent on God's mercy (9:4, 9)
- Intercession's goal is the Glory of God (9:16 - 19)

"With all prayer and supplication, pray at every opportunity in the Spirit. To that end, be watchful with all perseverance and supplication for all the holy ones."

Invitation to an Online Retreat

Each year I try to go on at least one retreat, sometimes two. Unfortunately, this year I was unable to make a retreat. I have already planned my retreat for 2017, but in the meantime I have been trying to figure out an alternative to "going on retreat" for 2016. I stumbled across this Online Retreat hosted by Creighton

University. The university has a wonderful Online Ministries website. I invite you to look into participating in this retreat. You can do it on your own or you can gather together a group of friends to make the retreat as a group. The webpage to visit is:

The retreat is a 34 week retreat for Everyday Life. You will be welcomed to an experience of God's grace in the midst of your busy lives. Begin the retreat with Week One, at any time, and follow the guides and resources provided each week. Be open and trust in a God who is not outdone in generosity.

Each week, there will be some practical help to prepare for this week's retreat and for getting the most from it.

The first and most important point is to begin this journey with great hope and confidence. God is never outdone in generosity. So, if we make even a small change in our weekly pattern, that is a tremendous *opening* for God to work in us. One way to affirm this hope and confidence is to express it for just a brief instant, each morning, *at the same time each day* — as I'm finding my slippers, or as I'm brushing my teeth, or while I'm pouring that first cup of coffee — "I know you are with me today, Lord."

Each of us will have a different amount of time we will be able to give to this retreat each week. We recommend that if your time is limited, just read the guide. On another day that week, you may find you have time to return to reflect on another resource.

Youth Day is an international celebration that is held every two to three years. When people can't make it to the international destination (this year is Krakow, Poland) different dioceses have an at-home event. This year the Archdiocese of Chicago is hosting young adults from different dioceses, including the Archdiocese of Detroit. 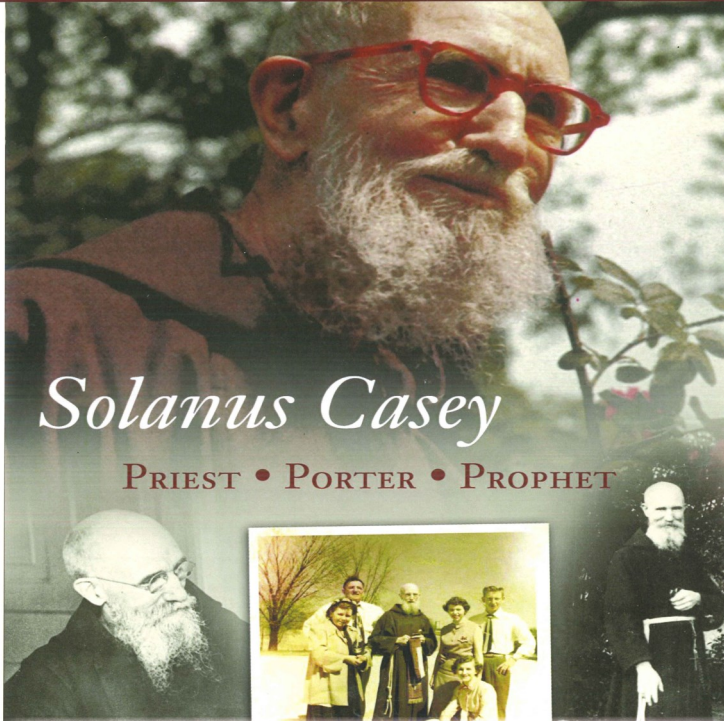

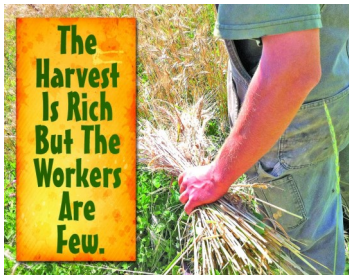
