This time of year seems to be one for getting engaged and for planning upcoming marriages. Primarily, this article is for newly-engaged couples who are planning to be married here at St. Jane Frances de Chantal.

When contacting our parish about planning an upcoming wedding, please ask to speak to Fr. Tony. Our front desk staff does not help select available wedding dates. That is done by the couple and I. If you have a question pertaining to marriage, please ask me.

One of the first questions I ask a couple planning to be married at our parish is if either of the couple has been married before. This is an important question, because if either of the couple has been previously married, either in the Church or civilly, that marriage must first be annulled before they can enter into a new marriage. If either of the couple has been married before, a date for the new couple *cannot* be set until the prior marriage is annulled. The annulment process can take at least two years from start to completion.

The Church also asks for a recent baptismal certificate from the couple. The reason for this is twofold. Firstly, the baptismal certificate verifies that you have been baptized in the Catholic faith. Secondly, all your sacraments are recorded at the Church of Baptism and are noted on the back of the certificate. The notations on the back record the sacraments that the person has already received, namely Confirmation, Marriage, and Sacred Orders.

I prefer to meet couples who are planning to get married at our parish as soon as possible so that they know what is expected of them in the course of marriage preparation. I have found that the sooner the preparation begins, the easier the whole process of marriage becomes. I look forward to working with those who are planning their marriage.

“The matrimonial covenant, by which a man and a woman establish between themselves a partnership of the whole of life, is by its nature ordered toward the good of the spouses and the procreation and education of offspring: this covenant between baptized persons has been raised by Christ the Lord to the dignity of a sacrament.”

(CCC 1055)

I would like to thank those couples from St. Jane Frances de Chantal who are involved in the Covenant Couples Ministry. These couples are assigned a newly-engaged couple to assist and walk with as they prepare for their marriage and wedding day. You make my ministry a lot easier.

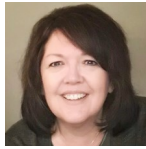

“Come away by yourselves to a deserted place and rest a while.”

In today’s Gospel reading, Jesus and the apostles experienced a need for rest and went

off to a deserted place to be alone and regroup. But it turns out that their deserted place was filled with a vast crowd, all seeking to be taught by the Master.

St. Mark does not tell us the “many things” that Jesus taught the vast crowd (6:34), but we do know the lesson he taught the Twelve. He taught them what their priorities should be. Tired and hungry, the apostles hoped to get some rest away from the people of the towns. But their plans were changed in an instant, for Jesus’ heart was moved to pity. Compassion caused them to turn their attention away from themselves and their need for food and rest so they could attend to strangers in need of healing and guidance. The need for a shepherd was great, and Jesus led them.

At some point in our lives, we have all experienced the need to “get away” and recharge. Many of us have also experienced a time when that just wasn’t possible, no matter how much it was needed. I remember many times as a mom and as a caregiver when I felt I just needed to get away from the needs of others, but could not. We are called to be like Jesus, moved to pity by the needs of those we love, or by the needs of those who are simply our neighbor in need, who we are called by faith to love.

Spend some time today reflecting on when your compassion for someone brought you to set aside your own needs. Knowing that such a sacrifice can be challenging, how did you manage it? Did you rely on prayer and the power of the Holy Spirit to power through?

The last time I wrote about this Scripture passage, I mentioned how important prayer was to my ability to persevere through the tough times. That remains the same for me now. Throughout the pandemic, whenever fear or anxiety threatened to overtake me, I prayed. When there was so much death and chaos, I prayed. When things began to improve, I prayed. Why? Because Jesus is always here for us, no matter how often we ask, no matter how big or small the request, no matter how little we give in return. So pray and allow yourself to be guided. Pray when you are strong and when you are tired, when you are filled with joy and when you are lonely, when you have abundant resources and when you have nothing left to give.

Pray. Jesus will hear you and lead you.

ASK UTG: HOW HAS YOUR FAMILY INSPIRED OR SUPPORTED YOUR FAITH?

The daily presence and relationships I have with my parents, my siblings, and my grandparents are some of the most powerful ways in which I have been supported and inspired throughout my faith journey. Half the time, they probably don't even know that one particular instance in their own life impacted me so strongly, as it often is the little things that move mountains. But seeing my family go through times where they are closer and further away from God and seeing their attitude toward life change vividly shows the impact his hand has in people's lives. He is not an old man living above us, but a spirit that works wonders in every life he is invited into.

I have noticed that whenever I am unhappy or struggling with motivation, it is because I am not close to God. And just as your family is always there for you in any circumstance, so is God. In addition, my grandfather recently went through RCIA, and this Easter Vigil, he received his first Communion and was confirmed. Watching a man I have known my whole life go through such a life change has inspired me to keep growing and developing my relationship with God. And so it truly is through my family that I have not only learned of Jesus, but also experienced his grace and his goodness!

These small acts of devotion taught me to never be minimalistic with God, but to love him, as Deuteronomy 6:5 says, "With all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your strength."

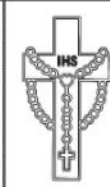
