As I sit at the computer writing this article, I find myself amazed that we are at the end of July. Life does seem to fly by, and that is why it is important to enjoy each day as it comes. As we all know and have experienced from time to time, life can change in a minute.

I hope all of you had a chance to get away for some rest and relaxation this month. Last week, I received a copy of Matthew Kelly's latest book, *I Heard God Laugh: A Practical Guide to Life's Essential Daily Habit*. The central focus of the book is the importance of prayer in our lives and our daily activities. He emphasizes that our life is centered on prayer, and that our relationship with God is strengthened through prayer.

In the later part of the book, Matthew Kelly presents what he calls the prayer process. This process invites people into a deeper understanding of how their prayer life impacts their relationship with God and those people we come in contact with in our daily lives. I hope you find this prayer process helpful and enlightening:

The Prayer Process

1. **Gratitude:** Begin by thanking God in a personal dialogue for whatever you are most grateful for.
2. **Awareness:** Revisit the times in the past 24 hours when you were or were not the best version of yourself. Talk to God about these situations and what you learned from them.
3. **Significant moments:** Identify something you experienced today and explore what God might be trying to say to you through that event (or person).
4. **Peace:** Ask God to forgive you for any wrong you have committed.
5. **Freedom:** Speak with God about how he is inviting you to change your life, so that you can experience the best version of yourself.
6. **Others:** Lift up to God anyone you feel called to pray for today, asking God to bless and guide them.
7. **Finish** by praying the Our Father.

I would like to thank all those who sent birthday greetings as I celebrated my 63rd birthday last weekend. It was a quiet day spent with family. Thank for your remembrances; they were greatly appreciated.

Today is the first World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly! This is a Church-wide celebration that will be held each year on the fourth Sunday of July, close to the feasts of

Saints Joachim and Anne, the grandparents of Jesus.

Pope Francis explained that he instituted the World Day of Grandparents and the Elderly because “grandparents are often forgotten, and we forget this wealth of preserving roots and passing on” what the elderly have received. He emphasized the importance of grandparents and grandchildren getting to know one another, because “as the prophet Joel says, grandparents seeing their grandchildren dream,” while “young people, drawing strength from their grandparents, will go forward and prophesy.”

In a press release following the announcement in January of this year, Cardinal Kevin Farrell, Prefect of the Dicastery for Laity, Family and Life, wrote that “The pastoral care of the elderly is a priority that can no longer be postponed by any Christian community. In the encyclical Fratelli tutti, the Holy Father reminds us that no one is saved alone. With this in mind, we must treasure the spiritual and human wealth that has been handed down from generation to generation.”

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has provided a home prayer service that can be used to honor and bless the grandparents and elderly in our lives. It is available on the next page. Please let me know if you use it and how it was received!

BLESSING OF GRANDPARENTS

Adapted from *catholiccurrent.org*.

This blessing may be used at special family visits (such as holidays) at the beginning or end of a visit, or at another appropriate time. If possible, the oldest grandchild might serve as the leader.

When the grandparents, parents, and children have gathered, all make the sign of the cross.

Leader: "Blessed be God, who is faithful through all generations."

All reply: "Blessed be God forever."

The leader introduces the blessing in these or similar words:

"Grandparents are cherished members of our family. They bring gifts of wisdom, experience, and love, and share with us their life of faith. We thank God for their example and ask that he bless them with happiness and good health."

Then the Scripture is read:

"Listen to the words of Psalm 128:

Happy are you who fear the Lord,
who walk in his ways!
For you shall eat the fruit of your handiwork;
happy shall you be, and favored.
Your wife shall be like a fruitful vine
in the recesses of your home;
your children like olive plants
around your table.
Behold, thus is the man blessed
who fears the Lord.
The Lord bless you from Zion:
may you see the prosperity of Jerusalem
all the days of your life.
May you see your children's children.
Peace be upon Israel!"

(The family Bible may be used for an alternate reading, such as Ezekiel 37:24b-27.)

Reader: "The Word of the Lord."

All reply: "Thanks be to God."

After a time of silence, all join in prayers of intercession and in the Lord's Prayer. Then the leader prays:

"Lord God almighty,
bless our grandparents with long life,
happiness, and health.
May they remain constant in your love
and be living signs of your presence
to their children and grandchildren.
We ask this through Christ our Lord."

All reply: "Amen."

All make the sign of the cross as the leader concludes:

"May God bless us and keep us
all the days of our lives."

All reply: "Amen."

Many years ago, Gesu Church grade school in Detroit put on the musical *Oliver*, an adaptation of the book *Oliver Twist* by Charles Dickens. I was asked to play the

piano accompaniment for the kids.

The story centers around Oliver, a young boy who runs away from an orphanage where the kids work hard but receive very little guidance, love, or food in return. Summoned each day by a bell, the boys are given a small bowl of gruel (thin oatmeal) but long for so much more. They sing this song (words and music courtesy of Lionel Bart):

Is it worth the waiting for?
If we live 'til eighty four,
all we ever get is gruel!
Every day we say our prayer...
Will they change the bill of fare?
Still we get the same old gruel!
There's not a crust,
not a crumb can we find,
can we beg,
can we borrow,
or cadge.
But there's nothing to stop us
from getting a thrill
When we all close our eyes and imagine...
Food, glorious food!
Hot sausage and mustard!
While we're in the mood,
cold jelly and custard!
Peas, pudding and saveloys...
What next is the question?

In today's world, food is life. Over the next few weeks, the Gospels emphasize food, specifically bread—"the true bread from Heaven"—and manna, as both the earthly and spiritual Bread of Life. That got me to thinking about this song, because I have never known hunger, not even for one day.

A couple weeks ago, Fr. Longbucco told us stories about missions everywhere that need our help, with hunger and a lack of fresh water being crucial issues. We sometimes do take the gifts of food and water for granted.

When people consider the parable of the five barley loaves and two fish feeding thousands, the logical question is often asked: "Well, how could a few loaves of bread and a meager amount of fish feed the multitudes?" I believe the answer lies not literally, but figuratively, and is hopefully something which influences us to help take care of our brothers and sisters in Christ.

There was a need to feed the hungry, and those who attended were compelled to recognize it. The miracle is not that Jesus created more bread and fish out of nothing. Instead, the miracle was the generous spirit filling the hearts of the people, and then the sharing of the food they'd brought to those who had none—which in turn leads us to the whole point of our faith: Jesus is the Bread of Life, and anyone who eats of this bread will live forever.
