Although many of us have returned to in-person worship, the COVID-19 pandemic still continues, and the safest place remains at home. Further, it is not yet safe for us to offer the full range of our parish activities. Many of our ministries, clubs, and worship opportunities have been put on hold.

We must ask: how can we worship while at home?

Watch digital Mass. It's easy to watch Mass anytime, anywhere, with an Internet-capable device! St. Jane Frances de Chantal currently offers live Mass every weekend: at 4:00pm on Saturday, and at 9:00am and 11:30am on Sunday. You can watch on **sjfparish.org**.

But we don't have to stop there—hundreds of parishes offer live Mass every weekend and during the week! The Archdiocese of Detroit offers live Mass from the Cathedral of the Most Blessed Sacrament at 9:00am every Sunday. You can watch at aod.org/livemasses.

Try exploring! Search for "live Mass" on YouTube or Facebook and see what comes up. This can be a great way to discover and appreciate other parishes.

Take advantage of online resources. Many Catholic resources, like usccb.org and unleashthegospel.org, offer plenty of sources for virtual formation and prayer. The USCCB offers audio recordings of and video reflections on the readings every single day! Unleash the Gospel features articles and videos of important Catholic happenings, inspirational news, and more!

St. Jane Frances de Chantal sends out a selection of these resources every Sunday via Parish News. If you'd like to sign up, visit **sjfparish.org**, navigate to Quick Links, and click "Sign up for Parish News." Enter your email address, and our emails will come directly to your inbox!

Explore Catholic social media. If you're interested in a relaxed, easy-to-access source of faith inspiration and formation, social media may be the source to look into. Websites like Facebook, Instagram, and Twitter can provide Scripture, resources, and inspiration.

BUILDING YOUR DOMESTIC CHURCH FROM BIRTH TO ADULTHOOD

In the Familiaris Consortio apostolic exhortation, St. Pope John Paul II notes that the role of the family is to "guard, reveal, and communicate love." Home is where we can experience this love and where we can live out this mission.

These points were explored in a virtual session at the *Called & Co-Responsible:* Summer Seminars for Church Life Renewal through the McGrath Institute at Notre Dame this summer. One of the speakers, Caroline Murphy, considered how families can reflect the rich soil we hear about in the parable of the sower. Since the home is a sanctuary where one is loved and understood, it becomes the rich soil. She noted, "the Divine takes place where the child already experiences love."

The home is the rich soil where the seed of God's love is planted, nourished, and grows. How can you make your home a place of rich soil? Each family is unique, but these are some things parents can do to help till the soil in their domestic Church.

PROTECT YOUR CHILDREN IN PRAYER, REGULARLY AND PUBLICALLY

Taking time to pray for your children, calling on their guardian angels, etc., is crucial, but it is also important that your children hear your prayers for them. This not only brings them comfort now but helps them build the habit of calling on God in times of need.

CONSIDER YOUR WORDS AND ACTIONS

What you say and what you do matters to your children, whether they show it or not. This matters in times of both encouragement and criticism of your children and others. Thoughtfully choosing your words and your actions can demonstrate your attentiveness, help open the lines of communication, and model for your children how to interact with others. It also paves the way for them to come to you with questions, concerns, and an openness to listen.

ACCOMPANY THEM

Walking with your children through their life experiences helps address the needs they have and provides the opportunity to point to God working in their lives. While adults often describe their spiritual experiences verbally, children are not always able to put those into words. This does not mean that they are not encountering God; it just means that we have to be attuned to the nonverbal expressions such as art, movement, music and play.

As of this weekend, we have livestreamed and made available digitally 50 Masses since the start of the pandemic! Although some may have returned to in-person Mass, to

many of us, digital worship is now the norm.

So—how does digital worship feel? In what ways is it different than attending Mass in-person?

The thing I hear most from parishioners is that digital Mass feels very isolated. When we watch live Mass, we aren't physically in Church. We can't look around and see our fellow parishioners. We can't smile at the ushers on the way inside, and we can't say hello to Fr. Tony on our way out. We're limited to what is shown to us through a screen. We can take some comfort in knowing that Mass is happening at the same time as we watch, however.

But when we watch video Mass, that feeling of isolation might grow even more. When we watch a prerecorded Mass, that Mass is said and done. It isn't happening at the same time we're watching. And, although we can watch that video Mass over and over, as many times as we like, it just isn't the same as watching live—and *that* just isn't the same as being there in person.

So what can we do to help ourselves feel closer to our fellow parishioners, Fr. Tony, and God when we watch live or video Mass?

Set the scene. If we watch live Mass on our phone, slumped on the couch or laying in bed, we hardly feel the same as we do sitting in Church. When we attend Mass in-person, we enjoy the holiness of the building, the presence of God, and the parishioners around us. So, when we watch at home, it helps to set the scene.

Find someplace quiet to set up your digital device. Sit in a chair. Set out a mat or cushion to kneel on, when the time comes. Place a crucifix someplace you can see it. Light candles. The more we can make our homes feel like Church, the closer we'll feel to normal. And, if you're quarantining or isolating with someone, invite them to enjoy Mass with you. They can help you feel that same companionship you feel with other parishioners at in-person Mass.

Avoid distractions. When we watch Mass at home, there's no one else around to notice if our mind drifts, if we go on our phone, if we stop giving the Mass our full attention. Try to avoid these distractions so we can keep our minds on the Mass. Set your phone in another room. Ask others for privacy.

Pray. Praying before Mass can help focus our minds. When we set ourselves in the presence of God, we invite Him to guide our thoughts and our actions. This can help us settle into the mindset of attending Mass. After watching Mass, pray again, thanking God for the chance to worship.

Recognize the presence of God. No matter where we are—at home, at Church, outside—God is all around us. He is with us at all times; we need only look to Him. When we watch digital Mass, we might not think to feel the presence of God. But even though we aren't in Church, we're still at Mass. Invite God to join you while you watch. Address your pre— and post-Mass prayer directly to Him. Recognize that He is with you and will help you feel closer to Him and to the Mass.

I hope these ideas can help you make at-home worship feel more like in-person worship. Being apart is a struggle; know that God is always with us.
