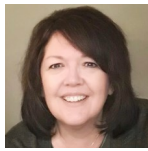

Happy Fourth of July!

Both today's first reading from the prophet Ezekiel as well as Mark's Gospel reading speak of people who are of little faith. This is in stark

contrast to the Gospel reading from last week, where a woman simply touches Jesus' cloak and is healed, and Jesus brings a young girl back from the dead.

In both the healings of last week and in the suspicion and rebukes of this week, faith is the key. We know that Jesus, as one person in the Holy Trinity, can heal without our participation. We read in the Scriptures today that "he was not able to perform any mighty deed" in his "native place." But he was able to lay hands on some and cure them of their sickness. The people of his hometown knew Jesus and his family and were unable to see him as anything other than an average man, a simple carpenter. They did not understand where he got his power to do "mighty deeds," and their lack of understanding led them to resort to taking offense. They did not have faith in his power to heal and certainly did not consider him to be the Messiah.

Of course, Jesus' ability to heal or perform other miracles isn't because he lacks the power; it is because the people lacked faith in him. Jesus doesn't force himself on the people; he does what he can and moves on. Jesus is not seeking to heal people so they will believe in him; he heals those whose faith in him brings them the confidence to approach him, believing that he has the power to heal and to change their lives.

Jesus wishes to be in relationship with us, to love us and to accompany us on our journey on earth. A relationship with Jesus begins with faith, and even a little faith can change a life. Today might be a good day to pray and reflect on your faith. Does your faith lead you to embrace relationship with Jesus, confident in your approach, believing that he will change your life? Is Jesus amazed at your faith?

Isn't it wonderful to be singing again? Sometimes, you truly don't know what you've lost until it's gone. I believe that applies to praising God with our voices. For so long, COVID-19 prevented us from

praying to God in song—at least out loud—but now the path to sing to the Lord has been cleared. And, from the organ bench, it sounds awesome! We have always been a singing parish, and it is good to see that the pandemic has done nothing to change that.

However, in resuming our singing, did you notice that perhaps your pipes were a bit rusty—that you didn't have the breath support or range you might normally have? When you don't use your voice, these things can happen. The good news is that the condition isn't permanent, and you can usually restore your voice to what it once was. Rest is always good for the voice, but too much is not, and that is what we have experienced. I believe God intended for us to use our voices, but we must also take proper care of them as well.

As you begin to sing at Mass and our worship services again, don't overdo it. Try not to sing too much, or too loudly. Ease into it slowly. It is almost like exercising: if you haven't gone walking or running in months, you cannot expect to do five or ten miles right out of the gate.

In the winter months, we're plagued by cold air, wind, low humidity, and a lack of activity. All of these things can impact your voice. In the summer, there are different issues: excessive heat, perspiration, high humidity, and a big culprit: air conditioning and going from hot to cold to hot environments.

What to do? It is always a good idea to stay hydrated—and surprisingly, ice water is not always the best way to cool down. It takes your vocal apparatus some time to process the cold water and then heat it up so your body can use it without shocking the system. In the same vein, drinking hot or warm liquids or something room temperature is a great way to keep things on an even keel, because remember, a normal body temperature is still 98.6°. In the summer, we spend more time outside with family and friends, and we may go to concerts, baseball or soccer games, or other sporting events. Resist the urge to yell or cheer too loudly; that can be harmful to your vocal cords. Whispering isn't good either, since the mechanism required to do that is harsh on your voice as well. Try to use your normal tone of voice, and if you feel the need to speak louder because someone cannot hear you or the environment is too noisy, wait until later, or—and I never thought anyone would hear me say this—text them.

Your voice is a gift from God. Treasure it. Use it. There is nothing better than the sound of a human voice when it used to nurture, to express love, to praise, or to raise up in song to the Lord. Take care of it, because it's the only one you have.

ARCHBISHOP VIGNERON'S SUMMER 2021 MESSAGE TO JOYFUL MISSIONARY DISCIPLES

"The Christian family constitutes a specific revelation and realization of ecclesial communion [...] It can and should be called a domestic church. It is a community of faith, hope, and charity." (CCC 2204)

Our archdiocese is committed to the work of becoming a band of joyful missionary disciples, willing to go out into our communities to share the Gospel of Christ with all. But as we envision how our local church is called to minister in and to the world around us, let us not lose sight of one of the foremost settings in which evangelization takes place: the family.

Under the protection and loving care of the Blessed Virgin Mary and St. Joseph, Christ was nurtured and raised within the family that has set the standard for all families striving to be "domestic churches" in our world today. As St. Joseph obeyed God and took Mary into his home following the Annunciation, husbands and wives give of themselves in self-sacrificial ways.

As Mary and Joseph dutifully taught the child Jesus, mothers and fathers are the principal and first educators of their children. And as 12-year-old Jesus responded to his parents' anxiety by assuring them he had been "in [his] father's house" all along, even young children evangelize their parents through the beautiful simplicity of their faith.

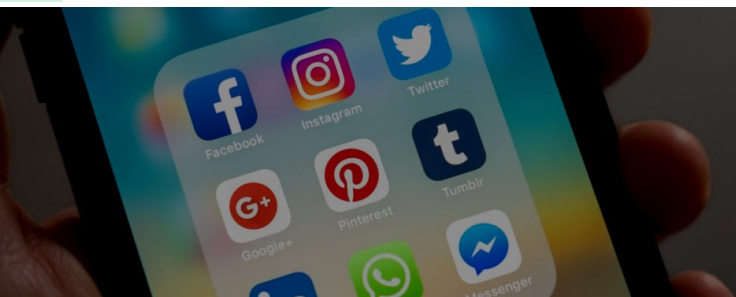
