INTRODUCING MICHAEL VINCENT NOVAK: DIRECTOR OF FAITH FORMATION & YOUTH MINISTRY COORDINATOR

Michael Vincent Novak (ML) is happily married, a father of five, a stepfather of two, and a grandfather of nine. He has been working as a director of faith formation, evangelization, and youth ministry in the Archdiocese of Detroit for 36 years.

He enjoys basketball and holds two college scoring records. He likes to write prose and poetry and has 11 published books with several more on the way. He has also published dozens of books for other aspiring authors. He is the owner of his own deejay/music/ministry/publishing company: mljamms enterprises.

He is also the creator of many innovative and internationally-known youth programs, including “Jammin’ With Jesus,” “Youthstock,” “believe,” and “Fight the Good Fight.” He once sang in a rock band and has written over 100 songs. He has taken thousands of teens all over the country and the world for service work, retreats, and evangelization missions, and he saw the pope at seven World Youth Days, where he served as an emcee and animator in five different countries.

His youth group has been noted nationally and internationally as being “the most powerful youth group on the planet.” His enthusiasm for Jesus and leading young Christian disciples has earned him the title, worldwide, of “Americano Loco.” He has run over 100 retreats, including several KAIROS retreats. He owns two cottages “up north” in Michigan, where he spends much of his free time.

Michael will continue to work at St. Rene Goupil Parish as he begins his ministry here at St. Jane Frances de Chantal.

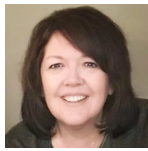

THE TRANSFIGURATION OF THE LORD

Adapted from *catholiccurrent.org*.

In Year B, the reading for the Transfiguration comes from Mark's gospel. (The Transfiguration also appears in the other two synoptic gospels, Matthew and Luke.) In Mark, Jesus takes Peter, James, and John up a high mountain, apart from the other apostles and disciples. There, Jesus is transfigured (changed in form and appearance) and appears in dazzling white clothes.

Elijah, the great prophet, and Moses, through whom the Israelites were given the law, appear with Jesus. A cloud appears, overshadowing them, and a voice states, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him." Jesus charges the three to not share with anyone what they had seen, "except when the Son of Man had risen from the dead." They keep their experience to themselves, pondering what Jesus meant by rising from the dead.

How are we to understand the Transfiguration? The story of the Transfiguration is also proclaimed on the second Sunday of Lent—a key part of Jesus' journey toward the Cross. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* draws parallels between Jesus' Baptism and the Transfiguration. Jesus is baptized at the start of his public ministry. His baptism proclaims the mystery of our first regeneration—we die and rise again with Christ.

The "Transfiguration 'is the sacrament of the second regeneration': our own Resurrection (St. Thomas Aquinas, *STh III*, 45, 4, ad 2). From now on, we share in the Lord's Resurrection through the Spirit, who acts in the sacraments of the Body of Christ. The Transfiguration gives us a foretaste of Christ's glorious coming, when he 'will change our lowly body to be like his glorious body (Phil 3:21)'" (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, no. 556).

During the Prayer after Communion, we pray that God might "transform us into the likeness of your [his] Son, / whose radiant splendor you willed to make manifest / in his glorious Transfiguration." The Collect, or opening prayer, tells us that the mystery of the Transfiguration "prefigures our full adoption to sonship." The Transfiguration, initially revealed to Peter, James, and John, reveals to all of us a taste of what is yet to come.

The Transfiguration is the fourth of the Luminous Mysteries of the Rosary.

Last Sunday, I was invited to a friend's cottage on Russell Island, which is near both Walpole and Harsens Islands. In order to get there, you have to take a private ferry, so

you're at the mercy of its schedule. My friend was adamant that the ferry leaves exactly on the hour and waits for no one. It is only a five minute ride across the channel, but it might as well be five miles, since there is no other way to go, unless you have your own boat.

I left Church and hoped to make the 1:00pm ferry, but with a 53-minute ride to get there, chances of that were slim. Of course, I hit every red light and ended up behind tow vehicles, trailers, and Sunday drivers who were out for a relaxing sojourn. I arrived at 1:01pm—the ferry had just left the dock, so I had a whole hour ahead of me before the 2:00pm ferry departure.

At first, I was bummed, because I'd miss 60 minutes of time with my friends—but it was then that it hit me: how many times had I asked for a break? A simple respite? How often had I prayed for some time to find a quiet place to sit and relax? Here it was. At that moment, I realized I was on God's time, and He had granted my prayer. If I had to be "stuck" someplace, this was ideal. The dock is in Algonac, on M-29, the glorious east side road that offers lovely homes, views of the channel, and people enjoying themselves on a soft summer's day. There was none of the doom and gloom news that we've had way too much of, no talk of COVID-19, no crime—nothing but sunshine, blue skies, and happy people riding up and down the water on every sort of watercraft imaginable.

And so, I just sat, admired the view, and observed the waves as they crashed against the shore, creating a cacophony of noises among loose seawall sections. I watched the birds fly around and saw the most beautiful bright orange-hued specimen flitting by. I was at peace—a rare sensation these days. About ten minutes prior to the 2:00pm departure, people started to arrive. There were dogs too: Nola, Chi-Chi, and Logan, who could have been my dog Marcus' cousin. The boat captain was a young man who split his time between this summer job and a waitstaff job in Key West. He admitted he wasn't a very good server, but it paid well. His true ambition was to crew with charter services there.

All of these things reminded me of Jesus as he walked along the seashore in search of his twelve apostles. Why? Because it is there, by a river, lake, seaside, or ocean that you will find someone from every walk of life, every occupation, and discover that you all have something in common. Being by the water has a way of doing that. The day was wonderful: Russel Island is small and pretty much everyone has a place on the water. We sat, watched the boats, and saw a couple 1000-foot freighters go by in the deep water channel on the opposite side of the island, only half a mile away. My friends remarked that in years' past, the kids would wait for the behemoth ships to come, the vast wake sucking water from the breakwall and beach, thus creating temporary tsunamis that the kids would bodysurf as the water came rushing back in. What memories all of these things created for so many families! At the end of the evening on the ferry ride back, I said a prayer of thanks to God for allowing me the vision to see this for what it was: a reminder that all of us are on His time, and that we can choose to see that. I decided to take the long way home via the St. Clair River, through Marine City and into St. Clair. Why not extend God's gift of a perfect day just a little bit longer?

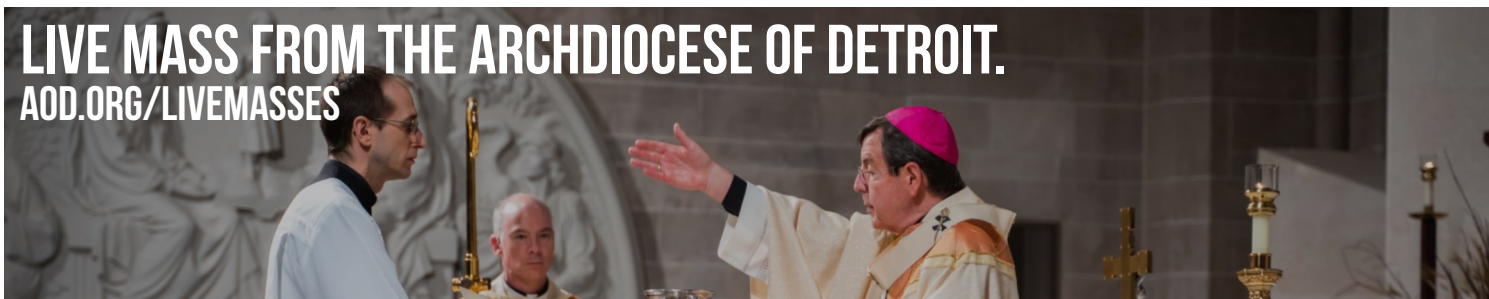

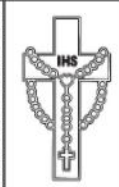
