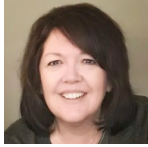

THE ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

This Sunday, August 15, 2021 is the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. **Our parish has released a new formational video for those interested in learning about the Assumption!** Visit sjfparish.org/thewayoffaith to view—and if you enjoy it, please share the video with your community of faith, so that more can learn of the beautiful theology behind this solemnity.

Today, we celebrate the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, declared by Pope Pius XII on November 1, 1950. This feast celebrates, simply, the dogma of the Assumption that states that, at the end of Mary's life, she was taken, body and soul, into heaven. To understand the fullness of this beautiful theology, we look to the Church's teachings about the role of Mary, beginning with the doctrine of the Immaculate Conception of Mary. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* (CCC) provides several helpful points:

First, in discussing the assumption, the *Catechism* affirms that Mary did not suffer from original sin, but was conceived full of grace. According to this doctrine, known as the Immaculate Conception, God's supernatural life dwelt in Mary from the very beginning of her existence. Mary was always set apart by God, even before her birth.

This tells us that, from our Catholic perspective, the Immaculate Conception is not simply about Mary. This doctrine, which has its roots in early Christianity, is ultimately about the mystery of Jesus Christ. God became man in Mary's womb. Since Jesus truly is the all-holy God, the Second Person of the Trinity, we believe he is worthy to dwell in a pure vessel—a holy temple. Thus, it is fitting that God would prepare Mary as an immaculate dwelling place, full of grace and without sin, for Jesus.

Second, the *Catechism* teaches that Mary was taken to heaven when her earthly life was finished. The Church does not declare whether Mary died and then was assumed into heaven, or whether she was assumed before she died. It leaves open both possibilities. However, the majority of theologians and saints throughout the centuries have agreed that Mary did experience death—not as a penalty for sin, but in conformity to her son, who willingly experienced death on our behalf. In support of this latter view, Saint John Paul II said, "The Mother is not superior to the Son who underwent death, giving it a new meaning and changing it into a means of salvation."

Third, the *Catechism* affirms that Mary was taken body and soul into heavenly glory right at the end of her earthly life. One of the consequences of original sin is the corruption of the body (see CCC, 400; Genesis 3:19). If Mary was full of grace and did not suffer from original sin, it is fitting that she, like her son, would not experience such bodily corruption.

Mary's assumption is not described in Scripture, but there are some biblical themes that may shed light on this doctrine. For example, the notion of being taken up into heaven has some precedent in Scripture. Enoch was taken into heaven without seeing death (see Hebrews 11:5), and Elijah was whisked into heaven by the chariots of fire at the end of his life (see 2 Kings 2:11). If God could assume these righteous men of the Old Testament, it is certainly possible that Jesus could assume his own mother as well.

Further, since the Bible presents Mary as the first Christian disciple, it is fitting that she would be the first to receive the blessings of following Christ. We know Mary as the first Christian disciple, as she is the first to hear God's word and accept it at the annunciation (see Luke 1:38, 45).

Mary also responds to God’s word promptly by going in haste to help Elizabeth, and describes herself as a servant of the Lord (see Luke 1:38, 48). Mary remains faithful to her son, following him even to the cross (see John 19:25-27) and she perseveres in faith throughout her life. She gathers with the apostles for prayer even after her son’s ascension (see Acts 1:14). Thus, the New Testament presents a clear portrait of Mary as the first and preeminent disciple of Christ, who hears the word of God and keeps it in her heart.

Since one of the blessings promised to all faithful disciples is victory over death, it is fitting that Mary would be the first to receive this blessing. Catholics thus believe that the privilege of resurrection promised to all faithful Christians was given first to Mary and in a totally unique way.

While the rest of us hope to have our bodies raised to glory at the end of time, Mary experienced the resurrection and glorification of her body at the moment her earthly life ended. Thus, her assumption anticipates to some degree our own share in the fullness of that victory if we persevere as followers of Christ.

Putting this all together, we can consider how Mary experienced this grace. In describing this scene, some Church Fathers spoke of Jesus himself coming back to earth to take his mother and bring her to her heavenly home. More recently, Saint John Paul II said that the Assumption truly was an event of love in which Mary’s ardent longing to be with her son was finally fulfilled. In fact, many paintings of the Assumption portray Mary rising in splendor on a cloud to heaven, received by the angels with trumpets and celebration, and reunited joyfully with her beloved son.

There are many artistic depictions of Mary’s life. We can use these images to reflect on our own hope of resurrection at the end of our lives. We can imagine Mary letting go of the things of this earth, leaving behind her sorrows, and giving herself over completely to the next world. As she lets go, she is gathered into the arms of the angels.

The Solemnity of the Assumption reminds us of the unique role that Mary served in the history of our salvation. Although Mary was without sin, we still have the possibility of receiving God’s forgiveness for our sins through Christ. Mary’s entry into Heaven gives us our hope of experiencing the same eternal life.

As we travel through our earthly life, we too experience joys, trials, and sorrows. Through it all, we can count on God’s loving care, as we read in Scripture and as Jesus taught by example. God’s love for Mary extended throughout all of her life and into death. Whatever we are facing in our lives, we can experience, like Mary, God’s support, raising us up to himself, both now and at the time of our death.

Take a moment right now and ask yourself: what burdens, troubles, and worries are weighing you down? How can you entrust yourself more to God’s loving care?

THE 2021 CATHOLIC SERVICES APPEAL: FUEL THE MISSION

As we face so many challenges in 2021, we are reminded of our call as missionary disciples to act out of the heart that God has formed in us. The CSA raises funds that make possible the work of the AOD, including supporting more than 100 ministries, programs, and services. This includes helping the hungry and homeless, supporting AOD parishes, priests, and seminarians, promoting the work of the Catholic schools, and so much more.

What is the CSA?

The Catholic Services Appeal is an annual campaign that raises funds for the Archdiocese of Detroit ministries, programs, and services that benefit all the faithful in southeast Michigan. This archdiocesan-wide campaign communicates that the local Church extends beyond the parish. The CSA is an opportunity for the faithful to respond to Christ's command "to love one another as I have loved you" (Jn 15:12) by helping to fund services throughout the broader area of southeast Michigan.

What does the CSA fund?

The Catholic Services Appeal benefits parishes and people in the Archdiocese of Detroit by helping to fund more than 170 ministries, programs, and services, including support for men discerning God's call to the priesthood at Sacred Heart Major Seminary, grants to Catholic schools, and young adult programs.

Our parish goal is \$91,324.00. Once a parish reaches its individual annual goal, 100 percent of the overage is returned to the parish.

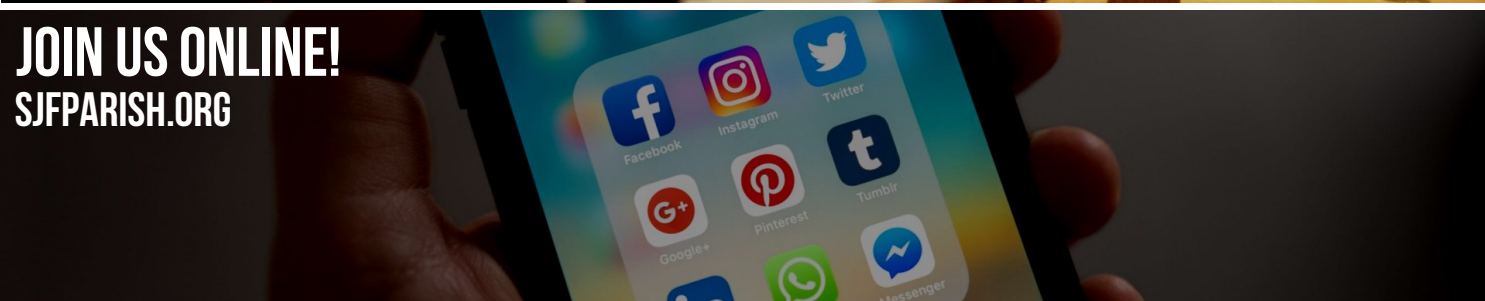
