**Q. What changes do you anticipate as a result of Synod '16?**

A. It is difficult to say because we do not know where the Holy Spirit will lead us. But, much of the conversation is expected to center around how we can make our parishes, schools, hospitals, Charitable organizations, families, etc. more joyfully missionary-based.

## STEWARDSHIP

*Our children are our greatest gift from God. We all know how challenging it can be to teach the lessons of sharing with our children. As parents, we have the responsibility to teach the stewardship way of life to our children. By our example, we teach them.*

**Q. What is Evangelization?**

A. Evangelization is bringing the good news of Jesus Christ to those around us.

**Q. Why is evangelization so important?**

A. Jesus himself commanded us to evangelize. The Church exists to give witness to the Gospel. All around us are people who have never heard that God loves them and desires abundant life for them. They need to hear this good news. There are also people who received sacraments or grew up in faithful homes who have now stopped coming to Church or stopped participating in their faith. Evangelization is for them, too.

**Q. What is an encounter with Jesus?**

A. An encounter with Jesus can best be described as a moment in our lives that is so impactful it causes us to change how we live. Once we have encountered Christ, from that point forward, we are either all in or all out. We no longer live for ourselves but rather give our lives over to the one that saves us. When was the last time you had a life changing encounter with Jesus in your day to day life? How has your parish fostered the opportunities for this to happen? What type of opportunities do you think your parish or Archdiocese could offer that would open the hearts of others to encounter our Lord?

**Q. How do you grow daily as a disciple?**

A. A follower of Jesus is constantly seeking to treat others as He treated others, to pray as He prayed, to love as He loved, to be more like Him. Growth as a disciple only proceeds through daily surrender that mirrors Christ's surrender to the cross. He personally surrendered His life into our hands so that we, through our sin, might nail Him to the cross. He surrendered Himself so that we might know the intimate depth of His love for us. He invites our surrender of love in return.

**Q. How to be a faithful witness?**

A. Isn't it just important to be good and try to get to heaven? No! To go out and announce the Gospel of the Lord is the point of being a Christian. That is why the Church exists. Each of us must be a living witness to the power of His mercy and to tell people that He is alive; that He died in order to meet them; and that He has a marvelous life in store for them. When we encounter Christ anew and grow daily as His disciples we naturally witness to His everlasting mercy and thereby unleash the Gospel to everyone that we meet.

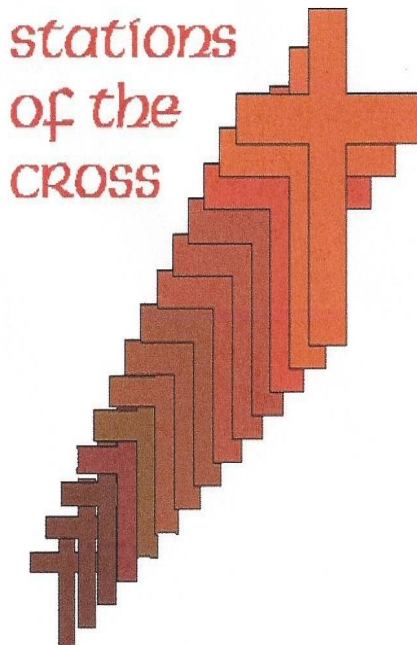
**SACRED HEART MAJOR SEMINARY/INSTITUTE FOR MINISTRY**
