"Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and that of the gospel will save it." (Mark 8:34-35)

Hearing God can be a double-edged sword. The deaf man that Jesus healed in our Gospel reading last week immediately got to hear the praise and wonder of his neighbors. Today we hear the opposite from Isaiah, who attests that "the Lord GOD opens my ear that I may hear" (Isaiah 50:4) and is beaten and spat at by those who do not want to hear his criticism.

In today's Gospel, Peter hears Jesus say he would suffer greatly and be killed, and then immediately gets rebuked when he rejects Jesus' shocking prediction. We are blessed when we hear the word of God and are able to recognize what God is calling us to do, but there is no guarantee that what we hear will be welcome or easy. After all, Jesus follows his strong response to Peter with a warning to everyone: "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me" (Mark 8:34).

Openness to God's voice requires an openness to God's will. To truly live out our faith, we must learn to accept Jesus' command, as addressed by James in our second reading. We must demonstrate our faith, sharing it in prayer and doing works of love for others. If we truly believe that all people are made in the image of God and that God's Son came to save us, then that faith should drive us to love God and care for our neighbor as we share our faith and resources.

Spend some time this week thinking about "carrying your cross" with Jesus. How do you put your faith into action? Where or when do you resist putting your faith into action?

Today's focus on the cross is followed by the feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross on Tuesday. This feast is celebrated on September 14<sup>th</sup> each year.

The following is a reflection on this feast adapted from **loyolapress.com**:

This feast traces its beginning to Jerusalem and the dedication of the church built on the site of Mount Calvary in 335. But the meaning of the cross is deeper than any city, any celebration, any building. The cross is a sign of suffering—a sign of human cruelty at its worst. But by Christ's love shown in the Paschal Mystery, it has become the sign of triumph and victory—the sign of God, who is love itself.

Believers have always looked to the cross in times of suffering. People in concentration camps, in prisons, in hospitals, and in any place of suffering and loneliness have been known to draw, trace, or form crosses and focus their eyes and hearts on them. The cross does not explain pain and misery. It does not give us any easy answers. But it does help us to see our lives united with Christ's.

We often make the Sign of the Cross over ourselves. We make it before prayer to help fix our minds and hearts on God. We make it after prayer, hoping to stay close to God. In trials and temptations, the cross is a sign of strength and protection. The cross is the sign of the fullness of life that is ours. At Baptism, too, the Sign of the Cross is used; the priest, parents, and godparents make the sign on the forehead of the child. A sign made on the forehead is a sign of belonging. By the Sign of the Cross in Baptism, Jesus takes us as his own in a unique way.

Today, let us look to the cross often. Let us make the Sign of the Cross and realize we bring our whole selves to God, our minds, souls, bodies, wills, thoughts, and hearts—everything we are and will become. We pray now the Prayer of Christians:

O cross, you are the glorious sign of our victory.

Through your power,

may we share in the triumph of Christ Jesus.

Amen.

## THE 2021 CATHOLIC SERVICES APPEAL: FUEL THE MISSION

St. Paul wrote to the Colossians, "Whatever you do, do from the heart" (Colossians 3:23).

As we face so many challenges in 2021, we are reminded of our call as missionary disciples to act out of the heart that God has formed in us. The CSA raises funds that make possible the work of the AOD, including supporting more than 100 ministries, programs, and services. This includes helping the hungry and homeless, supporting AOD parishes, priests, and seminarians, promoting the work of the Catholic schools, and so much more.

#### What is the CSA?

The Catholic Services Appeal is an annual campaign that raises funds for the Archdiocese of Detroit ministries, programs, and services that benefit all the faithful in southeast Michigan. This archdiocesan-wide campaign communicates that the local Church extends beyond the parish. The CSA is an opportunity for the faithful to respond to Christ's command "to love one another as I have loved you" (John 15:12) by helping to fund services throughout the broader area of southeast Michigan.

The Catholic Services Appeal benefits parishes and people in the Archdiocese of Detroit by helping to fund more than 170 ministries, programs, and services, including support for men discerning God's call to the priesthood at Sacred Heart Major Seminary, grants to Catholic schools, and young adult programs.

Our parish goal is \$91,324.00. Once a parish reaches its individual annual goal, 100 percent of the overage is returned to the parish.

## **HEALTH MINISTRY: HAY FEVER**

Adapted from Mayo Clinic by our Parish Nurses.

Hay fever, also called allergic rhinitis, causes cold-like signs and symptoms like a runny nose, itchy eyes, congestion, sneezing, and sinus pressure. But unlike a cold, hay fever isn't caused by a virus. It's caused by an allergic response to outdoor or indoor allergens, such as pollen, dust mites, or tiny flecks of skin and saliva shed by cats, dogs, and other animals with fur or feathers (pet dander).

Hay fever signs and symptoms can include a runny nose and nasal congestion; watery, itchy, red eyes; sneezing; cough; itchy nose, roof of mouth, or throat; swollen, blue-colored skin under the eyes; postnasal drip; and fatigue.

See your doctor if you can't find relief from your hay fever symptoms, if allergy medications don't provide relief or cause annoying side effects, or if you have another condition that can worsen hay fever symptoms.

Today, I'm happy to share with you the details of this year's faith formation program here at St. Jane Frances de Chantal.

Our faith formation program will take on a new, innovative presentation for the upcoming catechetical year and the foreseeable future. I have met with the catechists of our parish, and they are all excited about the format we are about to embark on together in faith formation.

As you might be aware, I currently work at St. Rene Goupil Parish down the street, and I have also accepted the position of Director of Faith Formation and Youth Ministry Coordinator here at St. Jane Frances de Chantal. I am honored to take on this ministry at your parish. I know what you are thinking, and no, the two parishes will not be merging their faith formation programs. However, they will be sharing some aspects of faith formation, education, sacramental preparation, retreats, etc. In addition, the high school youth ministry program will be a joint effort between our two parishes moving forward.

Given COVID-19 and its possible ramifications, we must continue to be concerned and cautious about in-person learning. We will begin the year—and hopefully continue to meet—in person, meeting one Sunday per month from 1:00pm—4:00pm. These classes will take place on the first Sunday of each month, October 2021 through May 2022. Our first class will be on Sunday, October 3, 2021 from 1:00pm—4:00pm.

In addition to our regular time spent in class, we will eventually be attending Mass on the Sundays we have faith formation. More details on this will follow, along with information about other additions we plan to implement in the future. Exciting, innovative changes and additions are forthcoming!

For now, know that we will be meeting in person on the first Sunday of each month from October 2021 through May 2022 from 1:00pm—4:00pm to fulfill your child's faith formation obligation for the upcoming catechetical year. Sacraments will remain as always: 2<sup>nd</sup> grade Reconciliation will be in February, 2<sup>nd</sup> grade First Holy Eucharist will be in the spring, and 8<sup>th</sup> grade Confirmation will be in the spring. We will have meetings, workshops, and retreats in correlation with those sacraments. That information will follow as we finalize dates and plans.

You should have received a letter from me containing the registration form for our program—which we ask that you please return by Friday, September 24, 2021—as well as a sheet pertaining to our first innovative project of the year. Since I am a writer, I am asking that each child in the program take the time before our first class to write a prayer or two. They can write on any of the different topics associated with COVID-19 listed on the included sheet. They can bring this sheet with them on the first day of class, or you can return it with your registration form. We will be using these prayers to publish a book titled *Kids Pray the Darndest Things about COVID*. If you did not receive a letter from me, but you wish to register your child for faith formation, please contact the Parish Office at 586-977-8080.

I know you must have questions and concerns. Please, don't hesitate to call or ask. Remember that we are in the beginning stages of what will eventually be an incredibly innovative faith formation experience for the youth of St. Jane Frances de Chantal—or as I like to refer to them, the disciples of the new millennium. I can't wait to start the new catechetical year and meet all of you!


