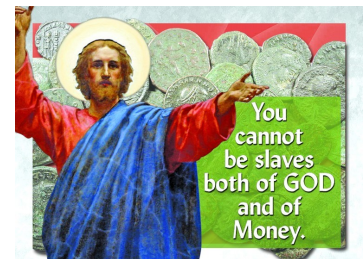
Parish Policy

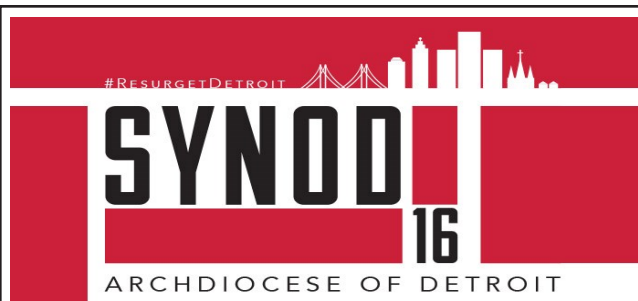

How does participating in the Mass help to strengthen our discipleship? How does it prepare us to go out into the world bringing ourselves and others into relationship with Jesus?

In *From Mass to Mission: Understanding the Mass and Its Significance for Our Christian Life* we read that ever since the Lord's Death and Resurrection, his followers have gathered on the Lord's Day "in small groups or large, in spaces that are soaring and grand or modest and humble, to share this holy meal together. For Catholics, this is the celebration of the Mass. We leave home. We gather with friends and strangers. We enact a predictable ritual, and we change in unpredictable ways. We place all the events of the past week inside that Mass to offer them for the glory of God. We prepare for the duties of the coming week and seek their sanctification. We discard from our lives what keeps us from Christ, and we retain what makes us good disciples."

For many people, going to Sunday Mass is simply something they "do" as good Catholics. Keeping the Lord's Day holy is something they were taught as children, and attending Mass is simply matter of fact. But even if you're very committed to participating, it's easy to get out of touch with the wonder and gift of it all, and the ways in which we are changed unpredictably. Come to a new or renewed understanding of how the Mass can empower you in your discipleship!!

This retreat day is part of the continuing education of our liturgical ministers. We ask all liturgical ministers (servers in 8th grade and up, lectors, EMHC's, sacristans, MoH/Ushers, music ministers, altar-linen caregivers to plan on attending this retreat. 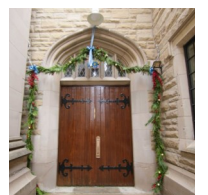

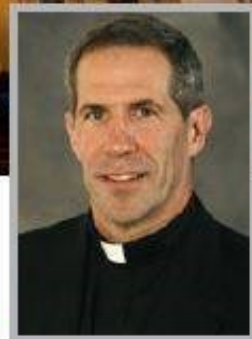
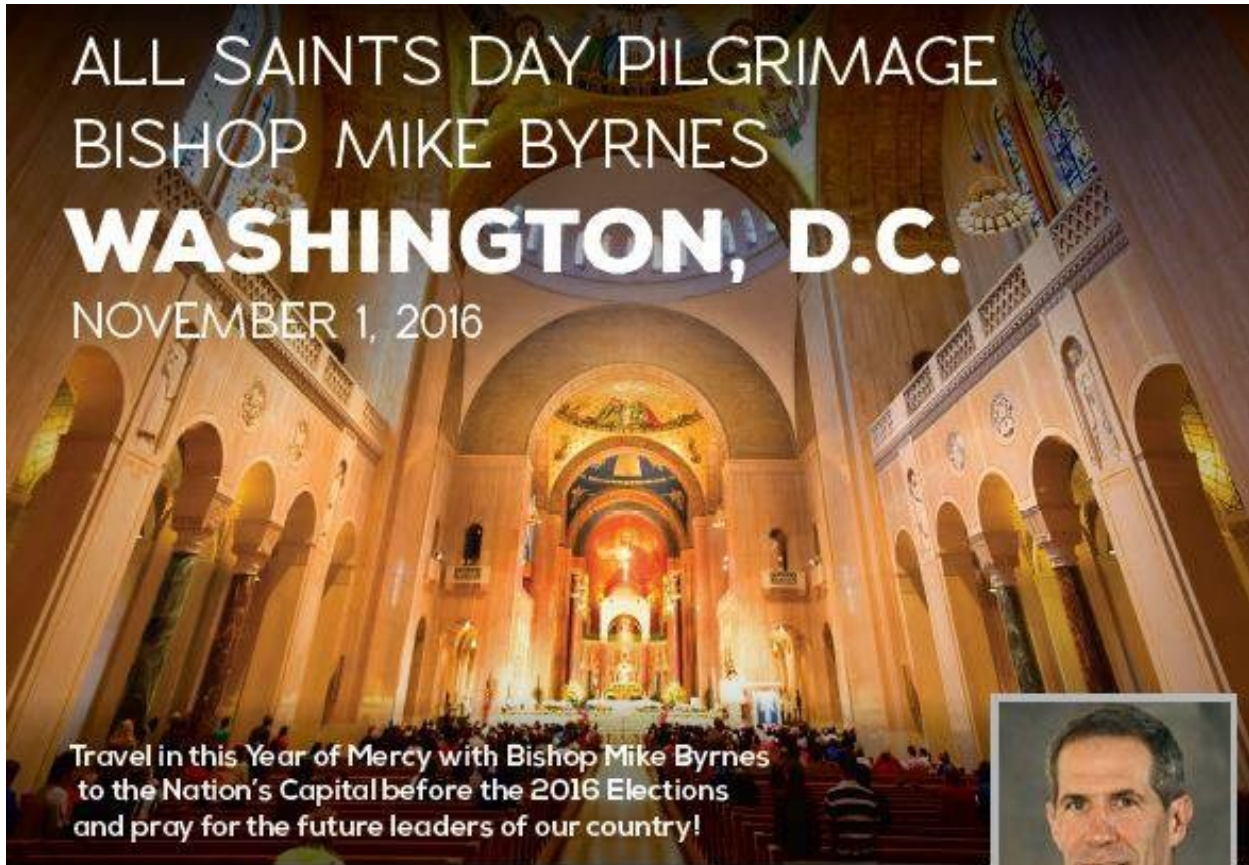

**HEALTH MINISTRY
BLOOD PRESSURE SCREENING IS BACK!
KNOW YOUR NUMBERS FOR BLOOD PRESSURE CONTROL**

Your parish nurses will be available monthly September through May to check your blood pressure and answer any health related questions you may have. You are welcome to come as often as you wish. You are encouraged to monitor your blood pressure, regardless of your age. Hypertension can happen to anyone, at any age. Uncontrolled blood pressure, as you know, can result in a stroke.

Starting at age 20, the American Heart Association recommends a blood pressure screening at your regular healthcare visit or once every 2 years, if your blood pressure is less than 120/80 mm Hg. Your healthcare providers will and should want to get an accurate picture of your blood pressure and chart what happens over time. While BP can change from minute to minute with changes in posture, exercise, stress or sleep, it should normally be less than 120/80 mm Hg (less than 120 systolic AND less than 80 diastolic) for an adult age 20 or over. About one in three U.S. adults has high blood pressure.

If your blood pressure reading is higher than normal, your doctor may take several readings over time and/or have you monitor your blood pressure at home before diagnosing you with high blood pressure.

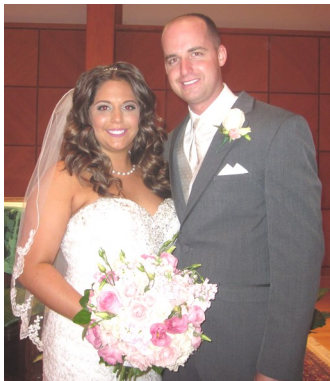
A single high reading does not necessarily mean that you have high blood pressure. However, if readings stay at 140/90 mm Hg or above (systolic 150 or above OR diastolic 90 or above) over time, your doctor will likely want you to begin a treatment program. Such a program almost always includes lifestyle changes and often prescription medication for those with readings of 150/90 or higher.

Blood pressure screening is offered before and after the Saturday evening Mass and from 8:30am – 11:30am on Sunday, starting September 17th and 18th. Please make a point to take advantage of this opportunity!
