

Understanding the Mass and Its Significance for Our Christian Life

Liturgy Day Retreat for Liturgical Ministers And Interested Parishioners

Saturday, October 8, 2016, 9:00am - 1:00pm

How does participating in the Mass help to strengthen our discipleship? How does it prepare us to go out into the world bringing ourselves and others into relationship with Jesus?

In From Mass to Mission: Understanding the Mass and Its Significance for Our Christian Life we read that ever since the Lord's Death and Resurrection, His followers have gathered on the Lord's Day "in small groups or large, in spaces that are soaring and grand or modest and humble, to share this holy meal together. For Catholics, this is the celebration of the Mass. We leave home. We gather with friends and strangers. We enact a predictable ritual, and we change in unpredictable ways. We place all the events of the past week inside that Mass to offer them for the glory of God. We prepare for the duties of the coming week and seek their sanctification. We discard from our lives what keeps us from Christ, and we retain what makes us good disciples."

For many people, going to Sunday Mass is simply something they "do" as good Catholics. Keeping the Lord's Day holy is something they were taught as children, and attending Mass is simply matter of fact. But even if you're very committed to participating, it's easy to get out of touch with the wonder and gift of it all, and the ways in which we are changed unpredictably. Come to a new or renewed understanding of how the Mass can empower you in your discipleship!!

This retreat day is part of the continuing education of our liturgical ministers. We ask all liturgical ministers (servers in 8th grade and up, lectors, EMHC's, sacristans, MoH/Ushers, music ministers, altar-linen caregivers) to plan on attending this retreat and invite our fellow parishioners to join us. Canonization of Saint Mother Teresa of Calcutta

September 4, 2016

Her life: August 26, 1910 - September 5, 1997 **Feast Day:** September 5th

Patron: Known informally as the "Saint of the Slums"

Birth Name: Anjezë Gonxhe Bojaxhiu Home Town: Skopje, Macedonia **Religious Order:** The Missionaries of Charity Prayer to Mother Teresa for Her Intercession

Mother Teresa of Calcutta, on the train to Darjeeling you heard what so many human hearts long to hear: The voice of God. Through the seed of His Word, you built a movement the world has rarely seen and so longs for, a movement of mercy, a movement of compassion, a movement of hope shining in the darkest places. And in each of your sisters' chapels around the world, there hangs a crucifix: The suffering, dying Christ and the words, "I thirst." These words are a call to action. We gaze upon your example walking off the safe path to risk all in doing the will of the Lord for the poorest of the poor. And we hear the agonizing cry of the one who called upon you: "I thirst." Have we too not hear the voice of God? Mother Teresa, you know our hearts, crying for the one who cries for us. And as we respond to the cry in our prayers and in our works, we ask your intercession: Mother Teresa of Calcutta, pray for us.


FIVE FINGER ACTIVITY FOR CHILDREN

Mother Teresa loved to quote the Bible, especially the Gospel of Saint Matthew, where Jesus said, "Whatever you do to the least of my brothers and sisters, that you do to me."

That means that when we are kind to anyone, we are kind to Jesus; and when we are unkind to anyone, we are unkind to Jesus.

Mother Teresa liked to count on her fingers like this to remind herself and others of Jesus' words (hold up your hand, fingers splayed, pointing to each finger as you say each of the five words):

"YOU-DID-IT-TO-ME"



Have the children "count" the words on their own fingers, saying them aloud, after each prompting.

Marking the Fifteenth Anniversary Of September 11th

September 11, 2016

The world is a different place than it was fifteen years ago. It is hard to believe that fifteen years have gone by since the tragic events of September 11, 2001. My oldest daughter was about to enter her senior year in high school and was preparing to write her college application essays. After she had written one of them she asked me to proofread it for her. I can't remember what the topic of the essay was but I remember that there was no mention of the horror we had recently witnessed. In challenging her on this her reply was, "I'm not going to let this define who we are!" It was too late, its effect on us all began immediately. Good, bad, ugly - it doesn't matter, it affected us all in some way.

Here we stand today, seemingly more divided than I can remember in my lifetime, while others are reminded of a time not too, too long ago when other evils in the world were rearing their ugly heads. So, on this anniversary, we focus on God's mercy. A mercy desperately needed to bring about a kinder, gentler, more benevolent world. "Our petition is for our service to God, which brings the benefit of God's mercy." Pope Francis, in fact, refers to the day's Gospel in *Misericordiae Vultus* (*The Face of Mercy*), Bull of Indiction of the Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy:

In the parables devoted to mercy, Jesus reveals the nature of God as that of a Father who never gives up until He has forgiven the wrong and overcome rejection with compassion and mercy. We know these parables well, three in particular: the lost sheep, the lost coin, and the father with two sons (cf. Luke 15:1-32). In these parables, God is always presented as full of joy, especially when He pardons. In them we find the core of the Gospel and of our faith, because mercy is presented as a force that overcomes everything, filling the heart with love and bringing consolation through pardon.

You will notice a different focus on mercy, peace, and justice in the celebration of the liturgies on this weekend. It will be a somber, but hopeful, reminder of our need for prayer asking God to strengthen us with the conviction of knowing that in the Paschal Mystery we are united with Christ to conquer hate and death. So we pray that God not only bless America, but God bless His earthly family, the world over.
