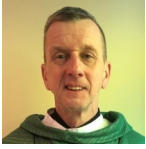

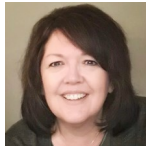

LABOR DAY

This Monday, September 6, is Labor Day! Our parish has released a new formational video about Labor Day, the Church’s role in its history, and our Catholic call to respect the rights of workers. Visit sjfparish.org/thewayoffaith to view.

According to the U.S. Department of Labor, Labor Day is an annual national tribute to the contributions workers have made to the strength, prosperity, and well-being of the United States. Labor Day originated with the labor movement of the late 19th Century—when workers, including children, endured 12-hour days and extremely unsafe working conditions for unlivable wages. Labor unions began organizing strikes and rallies to protest these poor conditions. Violence often erupted. The unrest of workers in factories, mills, and mines continued for over a decade.

In an open letter to all Catholics in 1891, Pope Leo XIII addressed the conditions of the working classes. He called on Catholics to advocate for the dignity and rights of workers. In the wake of this massive unrest, Congress passed an act making Labor Day a legal holiday in 1894. On Labor Day, we pay tribute to the contributions and achievements of all American workers.

So, what does our Catholic faith tell us about work and the dignity of workers? It tells us that there is no one definition of work.

The concept of work began with Adam and Eve. In Genesis, we read that the “LORD God then took the man and settled him in the garden of Eden to cultivate and care for it.” Work is our way of continuing to participate in God’s creation. It’s how we use the gifts that God gave us—and every one of us has work to do.

Work is anything we do for the good of our society, whether through paid employment, unpaid family responsibilities, or volunteer service. Just because work isn’t paid doesn’t mean it isn’t work! Our Catholic faith calls us to respect all workers—to value their contributions and recognize their human dignity, regardless of the type of work they do.

We must recognize that dignity by ensuring that all work is rewarded with just wages and benefits. Workers must have decent working conditions, as well as the right to organize and join unions or other associations to create better working conditions for themselves, as stated by the US Conference of Catholic Bishops.

Amid the sales and celebrations of this Labor Day, spend some time in reflection on the nature of work and the dignity of workers:

Where do you see the dignity of work and the rights of workers being violated? Where do you see it being protected?

How will your purchasing and voting choices impact whether the rights of workers are violated or protected?

BIKE CLUB

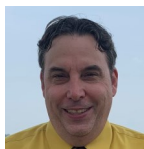
Want to join others for a non-competitive bike ride once a week? Come along on our summer rides!

FUEL THE MISSION

St. Paul wrote to the Colossians, "Whatever you do, do from the heart" (Colossians 3:23).

As we face so many challenges in 2021, we are reminded of our call as missionary disciples to act out of the heart that God has formed in us. The CSA raises funds that make possible the work of the AOD, including supporting more than 100 ministries, programs, and services. This includes helping the hungry and homeless, supporting AOD parishes, priests, and seminarians, promoting the work of the Catholic schools, and so much more.

What is the CSA?

The Catholic Services Appeal is an annual campaign that raises funds for the Archdiocese of Detroit ministries, programs, and services that benefit all the faithful in southeast Michigan. This archdiocesan-wide campaign communicates that the local Church extends beyond the parish. The CSA is an opportunity for the faithful to respond to Christ's command "to love one another as I have loved you" (Jn 15:12) by helping to fund services throughout the broader area of southeast Michigan.

The Catholic Services Appeal benefits parishes and people in the Archdiocese of Detroit by helping to fund more than 170 ministries, programs, and services, including support for men discerning God's call to the priesthood at Sacred Heart Major Seminary, grants to Catholic schools, and young adult programs.

Our parish goal is \$91,324.00. Once a parish reaches its individual annual goal, 100 percent of the overage is returned to the parish.

We have not yet reached our 2021 CSA goal. Thank you to all who have already made a pledge; if you have not, **please, prayerfully consider contributing to the 2021 Catholic Services Appeal.**

In today's world, there's so much with which to be concerned. Events in the Middle East have all of us uneasy as we ask, "What's next?" We're frightened. Will all of

this spill over closer to home? The escalation of the COVID-19 Delta variant in our own area presents issues, and no one truly knows where to turn. Tempers are short and we lose patience. So many are suffering not only from illness, but from being depressed emotionally. However, that doesn't mean we have to be barren spiritually. These are the times when we must seek God and pray for a change of heart to take over—not only in others, but in ourselves.

Last week I talked about never giving up, no matter what. Good things can be right around the corner, at the next bend, or tomorrow, if we have faith. Faith gives us hope and can work miracles. I promised you a song which is one of my favorites. When I'm down and in need of peace, I'll sing it. I've used this at liturgies of resurrection, including at my own father's second funeral. *His Eye Is on the Sparrow* is a staple in African-American worship services, though the song was originally written in 1905 by two Caucasian songwriters, lyricist Civilla D. Martin and composer Charles H. Gabriel. It has been recorded by artists from all walks of life. The theme is inspired by the words of Jesus in Matthew's Gospel: "Look at the birds of the air; they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they?" (Matthew 6:26) and "Are not two sparrows sold for a farthing? And one of them shall not fall on the ground without your Father. But the very hairs of your head are all numbered. Fear ye not therefore, ye are of more value than many sparrows" (Matthew 10:29-31). Keep the song handy, and more importantly, keep the faith.
