Ordinary Time

We are in the midst of Ordinary time. What is Ordinary Time? The definition of Ordinary Time is

taken from the *Documents on the Liturgy.* "Apart from those seasons having their own distinctive character, (eg. Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter), thirty-three or thirty-four weeks remain in the yearly cycle that do not celebrate a specific aspect of the mystery of Christ. Rather, especially on the Sundays, they are devoted to the mystery of Christ in all its aspects. This period is known as Ordinary Time.

In our day to day life, we should celebrate that God has blessed us as we bless the people we share our gifts and talents with. It is in our everyday life that we see and experience God. However, we must see with eyes of faith, the experiences of our life as God given. We are created in the image and likeness of God, and we are called to project those experiences to others so that they too can see God's hand in their life.

One example I use often, is the food baskets that we prepare for the needy at Christmas and Easter. It is very easy for us to give at those times of year. The need is always in the forefront of our mind at Thanksgiving, Christmas, and Easter. However, that need is year round during the ordinary times of the year.

Ordinary Time is not all that ordinary. It can be a challenging season. Unlike Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter, these seasons already draw us and point us in the direction to celebrate a specific aspect of the life of Christ. In the season of Ordinary Time, the onus or responsibility is placed on us. We are challenged to see God in our daily life, to celebrate the Word made flesh. To be disciples of the Lord is to see the Lord's presence in all aspects of our life and in those we come in contact with.

As I mentioned in my homily on the Feast of the Epiphany, we like the Magi, must look up so we can see the stars. In this New Year may we see what the Magi saw, namely the Word made flesh and it has come to dwell among us. In this day of social media with all that that means, it is easy for us to communicate with anyone without ever making eye contact or speaking a single word. We need to look up and see our brothers and sisters and to become an active player in society, our church, and our community.

Bon mot: What you have to do and the way you have to do it is incredibly simple. Whether you are willing to do it is another matter.

Today we return to Ordinary Time, a short stretch before the season of Lent that begins on Ash Wednesday, February 22nd this year. In these few weeks before Lent, the liturgical color of green returns to the

worship space and the readings reflect the living life of Christ.

The month of January includes the International Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, held the third week of the month, beginning on January 18th this year and concluding on January 25th. The Biblical theme for 2023 is "Do good; seek justice" (Isaiah 1:17). According to the USCCB website, the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity has a history of over 100 years, in which Christians around the world have taken part in an octave of prayer for visible Christian unity. By annually observing the WPCU, Christians move toward the fulfillment of Jesus' prayer at the Last Supper "that they all may be one." (cf. John 17:21)

The Pontifical Council for Promoting Christian Unity has resources for this week of prayer, including daily reflections on Scripture and suggested prayers: EN 2023 WPCU.pdf (christianunity.va). The following prayer is found in the Catholic Household Blessings & Prayer and can be prayed daily, especially during this week of Prayer for Christian Unity:

Let us pray

for all our brothers and sisters who share our faith in Jesus Christ,

that God may gather and keep together in one Church all those who seek the truth with sincerity.

Almighty and eternal God,

you keep together those you have united.

Look kindly on all who follow Jesus, your Son.

We are all consecrated to you by our common Baptism.

Make us one in the fullness of faith,

and keep us one in the fellowship of love.

We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

I remember the day it all began. I was in Minnesota on a youth group trip. We were visiting the St. Paul Cathedral of the twin cities. We wandered the aisles, walked the hallways, all in awe of the structure and its massive saint statues. We marveled at the altar and prayed in the pews. As we gathered to leave, bells began to ring at a very odd time. They didn't stop.


We walked outside to view the city in greater grandeur as the sound continued to toll. It was difficult to talk or hear, but I knew something was up. Of course, it was. We stepped back inside to learn from one of the church employees that Pope John Paul II had died. He had been pope for many, many years and pretty much the only pope I remembered in my lifetime. We went back to the pews and prayed some more.

When I learned we had a new pope, it was surreal. I would be taking the very same youth group to World Youth Day that summer and it would be a firsthand encounter with whoever the new pope would be. I had seen Pope John Paul II at World Youth Day's of the past and now it was time for a new encounter with a new pope. The surreal nature of it came in the form of the newly elected pope being from Germany and the upcoming World Youth Day being in Cologne, Germany. We would be spending time with the pope in his home country.

We arrived in Germany in 2005 and immediately became the focal point of the small town of Oberhausen, where we were staying. Our teens were interviewed by newspapers and TV news reporters nearly every day. We were famous. One of our students even got to help lead the infamous World Youth Day Stations of the Cross by reading the English portions. It was a true honor. The church we stayed at was marked to be closed after World Youth Day, but on the very last day, the bishop of Cologne made a surprise visit to the small town parish to announce that because of the good work that was done during World Youth Day, he was going to allow the parish to remain open. He then proceeded to go to the altar of the church for pictures and beckoned my group by saying "I want pictures with the Crazy Americans". My group, in its time in Germany, somehow became known as the Crazy Americanos. We were loud, we were proud, our faith was on fire and the world was well aware of it.

I remember the beautiful tribute Pope Benedict XVI had for Pope John Paul II. It was a meditative walk with stops along the way to hear and reflect on the message of the prior pope. Our group took the walk and did the reflections along with millions of other teens. We remembered, I remembered. It had been a long journey for me, and the popes had shaped my personal as well as my professional life. I would return, again, to spend time with Pope Benedict XVI at World Youth Days in Australia and Spain. My group would be as active and crazy as ever in those countries and our reputation would be upheld.

In 2023, I will be returning to World Youth Day, this time in Portugal. It will be led by Pope Francis, hopefully, and our status of "crazy Americanos" will be in full force once again, with a new group of teens and several new chaperones. Only two people in our group will have attended past world youth days. We will visit Fatima and our faith will once again be on display for the world to see. I will be grateful for the times I was able to spend with the past popes and honored to be there to spend time with the current one. So much has changed since I first attended World Youth Day in 1993 in Denver, where 200,000 teens were led by Pope John Paul II. The numbers have now reached into the millions for this event, with Portugal expected to have in excess of 3 million teens in attendance. It may just be my last World Youth Day, but we will see. It will be a time of reflection for me but also a time of renewal. Life is everchanging through pandemics, new inspiration and challenges. Through it all, one thing will never change, my faith will always be on fire. How that manifests in the new year of 2023, we will see!!




