Funeral Protocol

From time to time I put this reprinted article in the bulletin for those parishioners who are new to St. Jane Frances de Chantal and to remind all of us of the protocol that works

best at St. Jane Frances de Chantal in regards to funerals.

Since my arrival at St. Jane Frances de Chantal we have had our share of funerals. I would like to share with you funeral protocol in the event that you find yourself planning a funeral for a loved one. This is the time for the church to minister to you. The death of a loved one is difficult and the Funeral Ministry Team at St. Jane Frances de Chantal is here to assist you in any way that we can.

Once a death occurs please call the funeral home of your choice. Once you have made contact with the funeral home have the funeral home call St. Jane Frances de Chantal and ask for me. I, together with the funeral home, will set the date. We will always try to honor the wishes of the family. Funerals are scheduled at 10:00am, with the body lying in state in the chapel at 9:30am.

After you have met with the funeral home, please call the parish and set a time to meet with me to pick out the readings and music for the funeral liturgy. I will also ask for some background information about the deceased. Of note, eulogies or sharing of memories are not permitted at church and should be done at the funeral home the night before the funeral. From my experience the funeral home is a more relaxed atmosphere to share memories of a loved one.

The day of the funeral, members of the Funeral Ministry Team will be there to answer any questions you may have. They will also instruct those who are reading at the Mass and others who were asked to participate in some way at the Mass. They will guide you through the whole of the liturgy.

I would like to thank the Funeral Ministry Team for all that they do. It is a great ministry to the families who are grieving the loss of a loved one. Lastly, a person does not have to be a member of St. Jane Frances de Chantal to be buried from St. Jane Frances. One of the corporal works of mercy is to bury the dead and everyone has the right to a Christian burial. Let us pray for those who have died because someday someone will be praying for us.

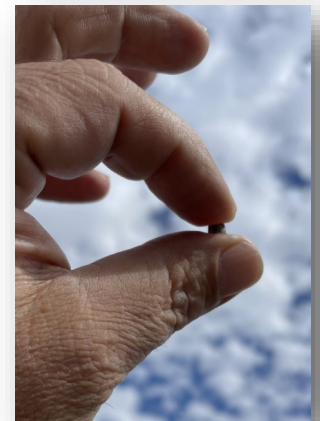

Respect Life Sunday

Today, on Respect Life Sunday, we hear Jesus use the image of the mustard seed. The mustard seed is tiny—not much larger than a grain of sand—but when it is planted and nurtured, it grows into a large, strong tree. It takes time, though. All of us were once the size of a mustard seed, but now, loved and nurtured, we have grown in body, soul, and spirit.

Our faith is just like that. Faith, even just the size of a mustard seed, can go a long way. It allows Habakkuk to withstand destruction and violence. It allows Paul to bear imprisonment and encourages Timothy to face his share of hardships. It allows the disciples to serve the Lord, often without understanding his ways. Seeds are a great image for our faith. A gardener plants seeds in the spring, nurtures the shoots by watering and weeding and fertilizing, tends them throughout the summer, allowing them to flower, then harvests their fruit in the fall. Within each one of us are seeds that were planted before we were born: seeds of kindness and courage, generosity and patience, faith, hope, and love. Do we nurture and care for these seeds? How do we nurture the seeds within us? Nurturing requires attention and action. We nurture the seeds of virtue by exercising those virtues. We exercise kindness and generosity through acts of care and charity. We exercise courage when we stand up for what we believe in when it's easier not to. We exercise faith by placing our trust in God.



Listening to the readings today, let us reflect on how our own faith has allowed us to overcome difficulties and pray for the grace to realize its strength. Throughout this week, consider this: Which seeds have I nurtured? Which seeds will I make the effort to nurture now?



Alzheimer's Awareness

Dementia is a term used to describe brain disorders that affect memory, thinking, behavior and emotion. Alzheimer's disease is the most common, but not the only, cause of dementia. Early symptoms can include memory loss, difficulty performing familiar task, problems with language and changes in personality. Dementia is NOT a normal part of aging. Normal aging includes occasionally making a bad decision, missing a monthly bill payment, forgetting what day it is, but remembering it later, sometimes forgetting which word to use, and losing things from time to time. Signs of dementia include making poor judgments and decisions a lot of the time, difficulty managing the monthly budget, losing track of the date or time of year, trouble having a conversation and misplacing things and being unable to find them. If you are concerned, about yourself or a family member, talk with your doctor. There are treatable causes for these symptoms, infections, medication side effects, depression, thyroid problems and nutritional deficiencies among others. And if the diagnosis IS dementia, there are early interventions that can slow the progress and improve the quality of life. You can control your risk of dementia by making healthy life style choices: eating healthy, keeping physically active, getting plenty of sleep, controlling high blood pressure and staying connected with family and friends.

Today's Gospel tells us of the mighty power of the mustard seed. We should all have faith so strong as to believe such a tiny seed can grow into something so large. I believe that is true with any type of seed we sow, to trust it will grow and prosper, even long after we leave this earth.

One parishioner sent me a lovely note of congratulations on my retirement. Within it was a quote from Cicero: "If you have a garden and a library, you have everything you need." As I pondered that thought, a few memories came to mind about both gardening and reading, and guess what? Cicero was correct.

When I was a little girl, Mom used to sit and read the paper each night. I was too young to read and sat by her side, constantly bugging her "What's THAT word and THIS word?" Patiently, she'd tell me and explain what it meant. Obviously she believed it was important for me to know and for her to teach. From those days, I learned to read quickly, to devour books, and to seek knowledge in so many arenas. I got my first library card then and still have one in my home city. Mom helped plant that 'mustard seed' of solving my curiosity through reading. It has given me a lifelong quest for all that I didn't know, that I don't know! That journey will never end.

Dad was from a family farm in Tennessee and he and my mom planted a garden every year in the back of our yard near the alley (does anyone have those anymore?). Tomatoes, cucumbers and carrots, mostly. We also had a peach and a pear tree. I would watch the garden vegetables and the trees fruit grow from seed to harvest, always mystified at how God made that happen, with a little help from Mom and Dad's tending. Lessons were learned in that garden. At about age 8 or 9, I came home from school one day and found Mom watering the plants, seated in her lawn chair and smoking a cigarette as she often did. Feeling brave, somewhat silly and full of myself, I said "Hey Ma, how about a drag on your cigarette?" never for a moment thinking she would have offered it. But she did. I was shocked and had to take that drag to save face. It was awful. That was the one and only time I've ever taken a puff of anything. I asked her why she did that and her reply has stuck with me for all these years. "One leads by example. If you want to smoke, don't hide it. Bring it out in the open and tell me. I can't ask you kids not to do something I do myself." That 'mustard seed' of leadership taught me to never ask others to do what you don't or won't do yourself.

I've always been interested in health, fitness, and medical issues, probably from an early age and also from my first two years in the Pre-Med curriculum in college. That was one reason I chose to become Health Minister through Ascension Health at St. Basil and I continued assisting the Health Ministry program here at St. Jane Frances. I am disappointed to say that Ascension recently chose to discontinue the program, but have no doubt our fine group of parish nurses will continue to serve in other ways, including hosting the St. Jane Frances Health Day on Sunday, October 23rd. God gave us one of His greatest gifts ever, a human body that should be used to do good. It is up to us to keep it healthy, as best we can. I thank Mom all the time for offering me that 'drag' so long ago, so as to avoid even thinking about smoking!

Since this will be my final column for the St. Jane Frances de Chantal bulletin, I want to thank you all again for your support, your prayers and for your good wishes while I've served here and for my future endeavors. I'll continue to watch for more 'mustard seeds' as signs from God to bloom and grow wherever they may be planted. God be with you and may He bless you always.

The St. Jane Frances Nurses and Health Ministry will be holding a day dedicated to physical health and safety of our parishioners. On Sunday October 23rd you can receive immunizations, get your blood pressure taken or get some helpful information.

The great staff from Ryan Health Pharmacy will be prepared to administer flu shots, pneumonia vaccinations and both Moderna and Pfizer Covid vaccinations. If you plan on receiving any vaccinations, the pharmacy asks that you bring your ID, your insurance card and your CDC card if you are getting a Covid shot.



Other features of the Health Day will include:

Ask a Pharmacist—Do you have any questions regarding the medications that you are taking? The Pharmacy Manager from Ryan Health Pharmacy can answer your questions.

Ask a Nurse—a Nurse Practitioner will be at a table to answer any health concerns that you may have.

Prescription Medication Disposal—You can bring in any medications that have expired or that you no longer need. They will be disposed of with the Sterling Heights Police Department.

Eyeglass Recycle Donations—Bring your useable eyeglasses for recycling by the Lions Club International. Please do not include any eyeglass cases.

Refreshments—Enjoy coffee, juice and some healthy snacks.
