Laudate Deum

On October 4, 2023, on the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi, Pope Francis promulgated the apostolic exhortation entitled *Laudate Deum*. It is a companion document to his encyclical

Laudate Si, which he wrote in 2015.

I had the opportunity to read *Laudate Deum* and I would encourage all of you to read it. The apostolic exhortation is addressed to all people of goodwill on the climate crisis. You can google it by entering the title of the document. It is very reader friendly.

The first thing the reader will notice is the title of the document, which translated from the Latin means, "praise God for all his creatures". Pope Francis goes to great length to remind us that we are created in the image and likeness of God. He refers to the creation account where we read, "God made them male and female, He saw what He had created and pronounced it very good. Giving women and man dominion over all of creation and telling them to be fruitful and multiple".

Laudate Deum goes on to say that, "as God has entrusted to us and has given that beauty of creation, we are called to realize that it is God who has blessed us with all that we have and attained. It is God who has mandate to care for our common home, to care for all that He has created."

We are a global community, the events that happen in other parts of the world, whether they be good or evil influences on us. We do not live in isolation from these events because we are a global community. Thus, we are called and invited to care for what St. Francis of Assisi calls, "mother earth."

In paragraph 34, Pope Francis writes, "although our own days seem to be showing signs of a certain regression... each new generation must take up the struggles and attainments of the past generations, while setting its sights even higher. This is the path. Goodness, together with love, justice and solidarity, are not achieved once and for all; they have to be realized each day".

One must only must travel either throughout the United States or the world to see the beauty which God has created and placed before our eyes to behold. Many years ago, I received a postcard from a friend of mine. He had visited the Grand Canyon, and on the postcard, he wrote, "Only God could create this beautiful and glorious sight for me to enjoy. The wonderment of God."

We all have a responsibility to care for our common home, to refresh it, to nurture it and to pass it on to future generations. May we see with the eyes of wonderment all that God has blessed us with and has created for us. We are called to be a people of hope and goodness. Mark Twain once said, God has put something noble and good into every heart which His hands created.

Bon mot: I can see, and that is why I can be so happy, in what you call the dark, but which to me is golden. I can see a God-made world not a man-made world.

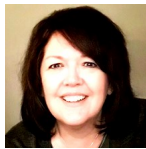

Pre-Diabetes

Eighty-eight million Americans, more than 1 in 3, have prediabetes and most aren't even aware of their risk or the impact it can have on their lives. With pre-diabetes, blood sugar levels are higher than normal but have not reached levels high enough to be diagnosed with type 2 diabetes. Pre-diabetes can lead to type 2 diabetes, heart disease, stroke, blindness, kidney failure, and loss of toes, feet, and/legs.

Since 2017, Ascension Michigan Community Health has provided the CDC certified Diabetic Prevention Program (DPP). Participants attend 16 weekly sessions with follow up year long support consisting of support through monthly classes and ongoing contact with their life support coach. Classes are offered both in person and virtually. For additional information and to register for a class, contact Sally Sterr at 248-849-5752/ Sally.Sterr@ascension.org.

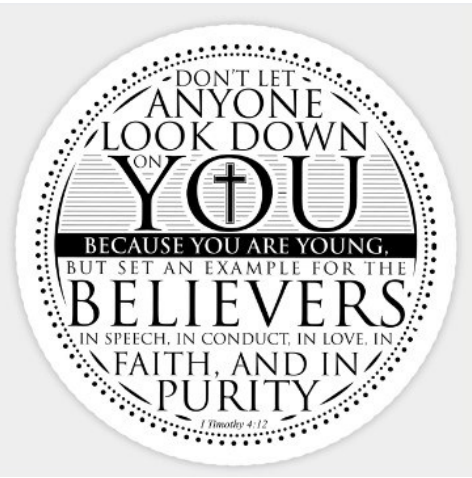

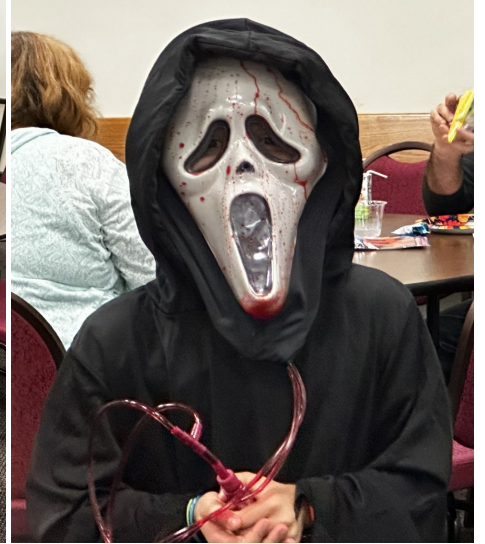


TRUNKS OF TREATS
